# Cheriton Bishop Parish Council Report Meeting on 9<sup>TH</sup> May 2016

May is the month for the house keeping. The Chairperson and Vice Chair had to be re-elected. Gill Westcott was re-elected as the Chairperson and Tim Vooght as the Vice Chair.

Two Councillors were re-elected to the Parish Newsletter working group. They are Phil Dicker and Paul Mitchell.

Peter Endacott was appointed as the internal finance checker.

Gill Westcott, Tim Vooght, Chris Carter and Kim Bastyan were appointed as the rota councillors for submitting the monthly Newsletter reports.

The Bank Account Signatories were also confirmed.

### **Community Defibrillator**

Councillor Vooght reported in the matters arising, that he has made contact with the British Heart Foundation and the Community Heart Beat Trust. These contacts were given to him by Bovey Tracey Town Council Clerk. This contact has been made as he had witnessed the redundant telephone box in Bovey being used to house a defibrillator. Councillor Vooght continues to gather information on this subject and hopes to report further at the next meeting.

### **District Councillors Report**

Councillor Coren reported that the Mid Devon planning enforcement officer, Reg Willing, had now retired from his position within the District Council, unfortunately leaving much un-finished business within the Yeo ward. It is hoped that the vacancy will be filled very soon and that some head-way can be made with all of the outstanding issues.

### Clerk's Report

Three possible sites have been identified and offered as Devon Air Ambulance night time landing sites. These are the Primary School Field, land adjacent to Four Cross Ways at Pindyhayes and subject to permission from Fulford Estate, land adjacent to the BT Telephone Exchange.

## **Planning Applications**

**Tellams Yard** – B G Pearce – Changes to the capacity of an effluent storage pit and variation to conditions of hours of usage. The clerk had received a letter at the start of the meeting relating to this planning application which he read out. The letter detailed some of the local residents' concerns relating to this application. The letter also noted that there were some concerns relating to Councillors possibly needing to declare interests relating to this item. As a result, two councillors said that, whilst they were employed by companies who do business with B G Pearce, they felt that they didn't consider this as "an interest". They both decided that, as a suggestion of interest had been raised, they would refrain from commenting on this item and would leave the meeting whilst this item was discussed. The clerk then stated that if the two councillors left the meeting, the meeting would not be "Quorum". Thus, this item could not be discussed. A report to this end would be sent to Mid Devon District Council.

Moor Park – Further planning applications have been made with changes to the positioning of the dwellings. It was noted that the building had started on these units. There was also a suggestion of a possible Bio-mass Boiler being built, to supply all of these houses in this development. An open invitation had been received from the Site Manager to look at any of these changes and the progress made so far at the site. It was left that Councillors would make their own arrangements if they wanted to take him up on his offer. The Council asked Teignbridge District Council to keep them updated on all further applications received for this site.

# Village Tidy up

The Parish Council are very grateful for everyone that turned up to help at the Village Tidy up in April. It was great to see so many people taking part, especially with a few new faces.

# From the Rector

## Two of your own birthdays in one year

There are few of us that celebrate two of our own birthdays in one calendar year. I am aware sometimes people with birthdays around Christmas move them to a less congested time of year, but I am not sure that they celebrate two birthdays.

At the time of writing this article, we have just celebrated the Queen's 90<sup>th</sup> Birthday on 21<sup>st</sup> April and I now looked forward to her official birthday weekend. Her official birthday celebrations are 10<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> June. On Friday 10th June there will be a National Service of Thanksgiving at St. Paul's Cathedral. On Saturday 11th June, the Royal Family will attend The Queen's Birthday Parade on Horse Guards Parade. On Sunday 12th June the Queen will attend the Patron's Lunch, a celebration of Her Majesty's patronage of over 600 organisations, in the UK and around the Commonwealth since 1952. The Mall will be lined with picnic tables for the street party, during which guests will enjoy a hamper-style lunch. It is billed as the biggest street party with 10,000 people invited!

As I watched the Queen's birthday celebration in April, I was struck by two things. Firstly, how much affection there was for Her Majesty. Secondly, how remarkable she was with the activity and hard work she was able to put in, despite her age. She appears to be doing rather more than people her own age. She is still riding her horses! People who have met the Queen commented on how well she puts people at ease and speaks easily with them. She is always very well informed and listens very carefully. It is quite a change from the culture of celebrity that demands that we listen to them. That simple courtesy of putting others first is quite unusual and invites a conversation about the speaker rather than demanding the listener just pays attention. Several people commented on the Queen's strong faith. It reminds me that God invites us, we just need to accept the invitation to start or restart a relationship.

As for the Queen's stamina and work ethic, I am reminded of a simple saying that we have to use it or lose it. If we keep doing the same things we retain the capacity to do those same things. As we stop doing our regular activities then we often lose the capacity to do these or struggle to get them back. There is the real danger that we if we take life too easily we may never regain the same capacity that we once had. The Queen has just kept going, it is always tempting to stop and to come back to something later. But often, if we stop, we never get back to where we were. It is clear that often we have to choose the harder way, however appealing the easier path may appear to be. What is quite remarkable is that the Queen chose this path when she was just 21 years old and she is still going strong 69 years later. So many more happy returns.

# NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

# DID YOU ATTEND THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING ON THE 25<sup>TH</sup> APRIL?

The APM is an opportunity for all the various organisations in Cheriton Bishop to present to the Council and public a report on the previous year's activity and future plans. In case you missed it, here is the Neighbourhood Watch Report:

"We are in the Crediton Rural Police area, covering from No Man's Land near Witheridge in the North, southwards to Cheriton Bishop and including Copplestone, Cheriton Fitzpaine, Shoebrook, Newton St Cyres and many other isolated villages – a vast area policed by two Police Community Support Officers, one Police Constable and a Sargeant, 24/7!

"In the year-ending 31st.March 2016, there were 107 crimes in this area - a drop of 10% on the previous year. These crimes range from violent and sexual offences, theft, criminal damage and anti-social behaviour - to name a few!

"So how has our Neighbourhood Watch fitted into this? Well frankly, it hasn't! Because we have been virtually crime free, until a crime is committed we have little or no contact with the Police. Nowadays the Police are mainly reactive not proactive as in the past.

"Is the existence of our NHW therefore justified? Cheriton & Crockernwell's NHW was set up 13 years ago as a community enterprise, not a policing operation. Then, as now, we were pretty crime free – but we have had our bad moments in between! Sharing and Caring – not snooping- giving Villagers a 'feel good factor (safe)' – not keeping up with the Jones's but looking out for them – these have been some of our missions.

"Today, this is as relevant as it was in 2003. A suspicious vehicle is spotted by a member, the reg.no. recorded and often reported to Jean or I for onwards transmission. An elderly villager disappears from the radar or is seen to act irrationally, it is reported to us and we follow it up as best we can. Villagers go on holiday and are worried about leaving their home unattended. There is a good chain of "back-ups" in the Village – watching for signs! We personally look out for four houses in the village, which we visit in the occupier's absence. A dog goes "walkabout". Have you ever met a fraught dog-lover, in these circumstances? We have instant e-mail contact with 50/60 homes scattered throughout the villages that we can ask to look out for it and report back. Just doing something can be very reassuring to the owner. And so on .....!

"Is NHW justified? Government statistics show that 12% less crime is committed in areas with a strong NHW and that is why many house-insurance companies give a discount to members. The signs at the entrance to the Village and the stickers on members' doors are the "giveaway" to criminals, not your house contents!

"However, now there is a new crime wave – you are twice as likely to be a victim of Cyber (and 'phone) crime as you are of traditional crime. So this is where we are repeatedly making members aware of how to avoid becoming a victim of these intrusive and often expensive crimes. By education....through bulletins and letters. No amount of bobbies on the beat are going to help with this one!

"So is Neighbourhood Watch relevant? As a social conscience; in a world of ever changing crime patterns and with a village ever increasing in population, we think it is. If you aren't a member, join soon. Every little helps." *BWBE* 

## **STOP PRESS** ..... Our Parish Meeting Script has been overtaken by events!

On Monday night/Tuesday morning (16<sup>th</sup>/17thMay) at least four properties in Cheriton Bishop had out-buildings broken into and expensive tools stolen. After reporting the break-ins to the Police, the good news is that "forensics" were on the scene within hours. No arrests yet notified. It is probable that more than one person was involved in these crimes, which took place off Church Lane and Vennbridge Hill.
