Parish Council Meeting – 11th July 2016

Bus Shelters

The Parish Council is continuing to look at replacing the bus shelters, investigating options, costs and funding streams. A number of designs have been drawn up and a preferred design has been selected by the Parish Council.

The Parish Council is attempting to replace both bus shelters (Eastbound and Westbound), however this will be subject to cost and funding availability. The design of both bus shelters is to be the same, however the intention is to increase the size of the eastbound bus shelter (towards Exeter). This requires the shelter to be moved slightly which may have planning implications.

New Parish Councillor Required

There is now an open vacancy for a new member of the Parish Council and the Council wish to co-opt a member of the community to fill this position. Please see the notice below.

Road Warden Scheme

There are a number of outstanding questions that need to be answered before the Parish Council can go about recruiting for the road warden scheme. The Parish Council is chasing answers to these.

Village Green

Councillors have organised the recent mowing of the Village Green. It was agreed that the Parish needs a long term plan with regards to the Village Green to make best use of the facility. It was agreed to make this an agenda item for the next meeting scheduled for September.

Moor Park S106 Money

There should be some money available to the Parish Council to come from the Moor Park development. This money will need to be spent on capital assets within public open spaces within the Parish. The Parish Council needs to decide how this will best be spent and are happy to take suggestions from members of the public.

Recycling

Following the introduction of the updated recycling scheme and state of the art facilities to support it, Mid Devon District Council is now reporting that over 50% of waste is being recycled for the first time ever.

Young Farmers Office

Work on the Young Farmers Office is coming towards a close and they anticipate that they will be moving into the building in September/October.

Defibrillators

The Parish Council is still considering the best locations for defibrillators within the village. A suggestion was raised that the porch of the Young Farmers Offices would be an ideal location as it is near the bus stops. The Parish Council is going to approach the YFC to ask if they would be willing to support this option.

From the Rector

The Olympics Rio 2016

The first of the two summer Olympic months has finally come around and the countdown clock to the games stands at just 5 days, and then 38 days until the Paralympics on 7^{th} September.

Rio has been counting down for over 7 years. I guess there is a particular sport and event that you are looking forward to seeing. It appears the 100 meters final is one of the really big ones but it will be decided in under 10 seconds! There are new Olympic sports for Rio 2016, golf, rugby sevens and Kite-surfing. I am looking forward to the rugby sevens but I am not very optimistic that Great Britain will win the Olympic gold, however there is always a chance. Perhaps it is not just about winning, it is about the enjoyment of the sport. What is it about taking part that is so important? We have to look at the Olympic creed. The Olympic Creed says:

The most important thing in the Olympic Games is not to win but to take part, just as the most important thing in life is not the triumph but the struggle. The essential thing is not to have conquered but to have fought well.'

We can see by participating in an Olympic event you have already struggled and worked hard just to be there. That in itself is a great achievement that anyone can be proud of for the rest of their lives. There is something about the participation being so important that we can learn from. Sometimes we are half hearted or even absent because it is too hard, not exciting enough or we just do not want to participate. There is sense when we agree to do something or commit to an event. We should give it our best effort and do our best. By not giving our best or trying our hardest we are visibly saying that we do not care. My mother used to say "Do with good grace or don't do it all", that seems like sound advice.

The bible uses images of participating in a race. Paul reminds the Corinthian church that the race of life (1 Corinthians 9 vs. 24-26) is about an imperishable prize, eternal life. Eternal life is a free gift given to those who believe in Jesus, and so this makes us want to do our very best. The sense is that we should all enter, compete and be fully prepared for engaging in life. We are to be encouraged that God and the great cloud of witnesses who have already run the race now surround us and cheer us on in the race that is life (Hebrews 12 vs.1-2).

As we watch the Olympics and cheer on our favourites, let us also remember how hard the other competitors have worked in training. It is the same for God who sees all of our best efforts and encourages us to keep going and keep trying. It is taking part that really counts.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

DON'T READ THIS IF YOU ARE SMUG ENOUGH TO THINK YOU COULDN'T BE TAKEN IN BY A SCAM!!

(no apologies for repeating March's headline' cause it's happened again!)

One of our respected families in the community, received a 'phone call very recently from a Detective Sergeant Elliott Reed of the Cyber Fraud Prevention Unit in the Metropolitan Police.

He told them that a Polish person had been arrested in London for being drunk and disorderly and when they took him back to his apartment, they discovered a mass of high value electrical goods PLUS the names and details of 30 customers of Lloyds Bank in Exeter, including theirs!

The Police advised that they had cancelled their account. The Met. had been in touch with Devon & Cornwall Police but they said they had neither the staff nor expertise to deal with it so the case was being handled from Holborn Police Station. They were given the contact number and to ensure they weren't being scammed, 'phoned back the number on a different 'phone. They got through to Holborn Police Station.

They were told not to contact Lloyds Bank as it was possible it was an "inside job", and they hoped to make an arrest by the end of the week!

Over the next 72 hours, contact continued including by e-mail, which contained the Met. insignia and other details.

A rapport was created and confidence built even to the extent that the Police told them that the Financial Services Authority would pay them £2000.00 in compensation and fine Lloyds Bank appropriately.

The writer spent well over an hour listening to the events of that period, which culminated in the Police saying they needed their credit cards and passports for "finger print" purposes, and new ones would be returned to them, the next day. They would send a courier round to collect them.

The courier arrived in a white Mercedes car just twenty minutes after the call and away went their cards and passports.

Within hours they discovered that their cards were being used to make multiple purchases on-line and by 'phone all under £300.00.

A neighbour contacted Scotland Yard to find that a Det .Sgt. Elliott was not employed by them! And the 'phone number for Holborn Police Station suddenly went dead as did the e-mail address!

The writer listened to their story and clearly they were dealing with very professional scammers (not a foreign accent to be heard). Everything about the events of those three days seemed very authentic – BUT IT WASN'T!!

Devon & Cornwall Police are following this up, but at the time of writing, there are no clues as to how they got our villagers' details, nor do they know, how much money has disappeared into the ether.

A possible clue – a misspelling in one of the e-mails – a frequent occurrence in scam e-mails.

No-one knows how this came about; it could have been documents put in the bin or could be from someone hacking into their internet banking account. In this respect, it is important that when signing off from your Bank Account you use the Bank's procedures to "Log Off".

The moral to this sickening story is always be over-cautious – assume the worse when anyone is trying to elicit personal information from you. These scammers are getting more and more sophisticated and friendly in their methods.

If you have the slightest doubt, DON'T GIVE AWAY PERSONAL INFORMATION.

And if you have a computer, log onto "Get Safe on –Line!, it gives free expert advice on all aspects of Computer Security – www.getsafeonline.

Finally, thank you to the victims of this crime who wanted us to publish it to help others from falling into the same trap.
