# Cheriton Bishop Parish Council Report 13<sup>th</sup> March 2017

# **Public Open Session:**

A member of the Public came to talk to the Council about the various roadworks that were and had been taking place in and around Cheriton Bishop. He commented that there had been the potential for all of the roads to Crediton to be blocked by some form of roadworks. He and the District Councillors had spent a considerable amount of time talking to the various Contractors, South West Highways and Devon County Council. They had been extremely surprised by the lack of coordination that seemed to have been shown. It was agreed by the Council to send a letter to Devon Highways to outline the situation and asked for assurances that this would not happen again.

# **Councillor's reports:**

**Village Tidy –** the Council were reminded that the Spring village tidy would be taking place on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> April 2017, meeting at the Village Green at 9:30 am.

**The Annual Parish Meeting** – This is taking place on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> March 2017 at 19:30, everyone is welcome.

# **District and County Councillors Reports:**

Council Tax is due to increase. This will mean that a Band D property will go up by £75 per year. Even with this increase, budgets will be tightened across the board including Schools, which are already conceived to be under-funded.

Section 106 payment amount from Moor Park had been confirmed by Teignbridge District Council. An invoice had been sent to the value of £20,485.

Mid Devon District Council wanted to remind the public that they operate a low cost loan scheme to help people who struggle to finance home repairs. More details can be obtained from Mid Devon District Council or by phoning 01823 461099.

There is also a credit union called Plough and Share in Crediton which is available for personal loans, savings, deposits and small business loans. To find out more, drop into the Community room at The Fire Station in Crediton, Saturdays, 10:30 – 12:00. It is run by Sustainable Crediton volunteers.

As from 10<sup>th</sup> May our District Councillor, Peter Heal, has been elected as Chairman of Mid Devon District Council.

Recycling in Mid Devon has increased by 3%, to 54%, in the last year.

District Councillors reported that, still, 30–40% of rubbish in black bags could be recycled and would encourage everyone to make sure that the rubbish they are putting into landfill is truly landfill and that all recyclable items are placed into the relevant recycling bins. They noted that there is still the possibility that recycling could become compulsory, but nothing has been agreed as yet.

Councillors wish to remind everyone that every 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of each month, there is a Highways surgery held in the Council Offices in Crediton, 10:00 – 13:00. Anyone with any Highways issues is welcome to make an appointment with the Town Clerk to attend. Contact number is 01363 773755.

Also, there is a new Crediton-Exeter train service leaving Crediton at 07:07 weekdays. This should help early commuters.

An update was given on Southcombe Hill Farm: the various planning issues there are still under investigation by the Planning Enforcement Officer.

# **Clerks Reports:**

The Governors of the Woodleigh Federation had acknowledged the letter inviting them to attend the Annual Parish Meeting. A second letter had been received from the Governors detailing the timetable of the public consultation for the proposed joining of The Link, Multi Academy Trust.

The Parish Council needs to appoint an internal Auditor. Anyone interested in the position, please apply to the Parish Clerk. The Risk Management is also being reviewed.

The Clerk also announced that he wishes to retire from his role as Cheriton Bishop Parish Clerk. The Clerk is willing to help in the transition and finding a replacement. Anyone who is interested in the role should contact him.

# **Planning Decisions:**

Medland Manor Cheriton Bishop – conversion of a Stable to a dwelling – permitted with conditions to discharge.

Wisteria House, Cheriton Bishop – conversion of garage to annex – permission granted.

Checkers Post Office and Stores – retention and re-positioning of x3 condensing units and erection of acoustic enclosure – permission granted.

# **Village Green refurbishment:**

Estimates for new signs and posts have been received. It was agreed to order these items and that they would be fitted on the Village Tidy day.

#### **Bus Shelters:**

The groundwork invoice has been received; this has enabled the Parish Council to draw the grant promised from Devon County Council. A final revised quote for the building work was awaited. Works are expected to start from mid–end of April 2017. Demolition of the x2 bus shelters was expected to take place on or around 7<sup>th</sup> April 2017. There will be a period of time where there will be no bus shelters. A local Project Manager has volunteered to oversee the works.

#### **District Councillor's Comments**

I want to start on a really positive note by saying how beautiful the daffodils, primroses and other spring flowers are in people's gardens, and along the roadside and in places around the neighbourhood, some in places where I have never noticed them before.

#### Recycling:

The latest figures for recycling have just been released, and I am pleased to say that in Mid Devon now some 53.7% of our waste is being recycled, but we know there is still room for improvement. At the same time waste going to landfill continues to drop.

# Fly Tipping:

Just recently two fly-tippers were fined £300 for dumping their rubbish near Tiverton. A quick-thinking passer by took the registration number of the vehicle together with some photographs which led to a successful prosecution.

Within the last week/10 days a load of dead broiler chicken was dumped locally on private land in Cheriton Bishop parish. Unfortunately the land owner has to bear the cost of the clear up.

If you see some activity that looks suspicious and you can record any evidence, such as taking a registration number or a photograph with your phone etc please report it to MDDC.

#### **Garages at Glebelands:**

MDDC own several garages in Glebelands and from time to time one becomes vacant. #### **Moor Park**

The development at Moor Park is expected to reach completion in July or August. Most of the homes there will be for sale. There are also expected to be 6 affordable rented houses (2 one-bedroom flats and 4 two bedroom houses) and two affordable shared ownership houses (both 2 bedrooms). Shared ownership is where households can buy a share and pay less rent.

To be eligible for affordable housing, you have to be signed up to the Housing Register via Devon Home Choice. The Housing Register application is made via the following website – <a href="https://www.devonhomechoice.com">https://www.devonhomechoice.com</a>. There is also a local connection test so that people who live locally, have family or work connections, or have lived locally for some time will have priority.

The Housing Association development partner (we don't yet know which HA it will be) will administer the affordable housing units.

# **Villages in Action**

Many thanks to all the people who turned up for the Villages in Action Concert in the Village Hall. I think people enjoyed it, and the band certainly did — they have offered to come again!

This was the last Villages in Action event: the Charity, whose brief was to promote cultural events in villages in Devon, has lost all its funding from local councils and has had to fold.

Promoters from here and in Longdown, however, are planning to run events on their own initiative. Watch this space!

# From the Rector

# Spring and Easter

I am often asked why the date of Easter moves around so much.

The simple answer is that it is connected to the new full spring moon. Why is it connected to the lunar cycle? We know that Jesus was celebrating the Passover. The Passover festival looks back to when the Israelites escaped from slavery in Egypt. The people were instructed to be ready to leave in the middle of the night and the full new moon would help guide them during the journey. I guess we do not plan many night walks and then check to see if there is going to be a full moon to lighten our way in the dark. It is amazing how bright a full moon can be on a clear night, you really can see so much more in the darkness. Our problem is often seeing the full moon for all the cloud that is in the sky. I guess that there are many more clear nights in the Middle East.

The question that is not often asked of me is, what is Easter? If you look around it must have something to do with eggs, chicks, lambs, Easter Bunny and chocolate. It is a confusing picture. The word Easter is thought to refer to the English month of spring, April. If Easter is connected to Spring and new life, we start to see the connections to chicks, lambs and new life. There is still the outstanding question about chocolate! In other countries the word for Easter, is Pascha or Passover. There is a more direct link to the Jewish Passover.

The story of the Passover remembers that the angel of death passed over the houses of the Israelites because they had painted the door-posts with the blood of the sacrificed lamb. The sacrificed lamb had averted the death to come upon that household. It would be the pain of that angel of death that would sway the Pharaoh to tell Moses and the people to go. As we think of Passover we see the connections to Jesus and his self-sacrifice. Jesus rather than avoiding death and saving himself, allows himself to be wrongly accused and executed. It appears that death has the upper hand snuffing out all that was good in Jesus. All the hope and goodness appear to die on the cross on Good Friday.

The final acts of compassion of a decent burial for Jesus are incomplete, as the Jewish Sabbath (Saturday) prevents completion of this final ritual. The women return to the tomb on Sunday to complete the burial customs to find the tomb open and empty of a body. The angels redirect the women to life and not death. The resurrected Jesus appears to his followers. Sunday becomes a special Christian day as we remember Jesus' resurrection from death. Easter Sunday being the most important and linked directly to the Passover festival and the new spring full moon. Chocolate being a special treat, is given as special gift. We remember God's special gift to us, Jesus and new life over death.

Eureka! The Police apprehend the perpetrator(s) and recover your stolen property – maybe hundreds of miles away from where the crime took place. So YOU are a winner ....or MAYBE NOT!

Most stolen property recovered by the Police is never repatriated to the owners, simply because there is no way of identifying it. In fact, the latest statistics issued to Neighbourhood Watch suggest that only 9% of stolen property finds its way back to the person it belongs to.

So, how not to be a "loser"?

Our new PCSO Nicola Payne, is holding a "Surgery" in the Spalding Hall on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> May at 7.00 p.m. (early warning, so make a note in your diary!) at which, amongst other things, she will not only explain how to make sure you get property stolen from you back but, if you want to bring along expensive equipment like chain saws etc., etc., will engrave it there and then FOR FREE, with your postcode – CODED FOR KEEPS!

If you have items that are too bulky to carry, Nicola will call at your home and engrave them. A bonus! If you then put a sign up at home to say your gear is marked, a thief is very unlikely to remove it.

# The Road to Registration

Thanks to the generosity of local people and the Moretonhampstead Hospital League of Friends, in late 2016 we secured the start-up funding required to establish a new home care service, regulated by the Care Quality Commission.

A key milestone in this is the recruitment of a qualified and experienced care professional. We are delighted to announce that we have appointed Simon Tickner to the post of Registered Manager. Simon started in post on 6th February 2017 and is focussed on achieving 'Registered Status' for NEDCare, as soon as possible.
