CHERITON BISHOP PARISH COUNCIL

Report of a meeting of the Council that took place on 11th March in the Spalding Hall at 7.30 pm.

Present at the meeting were Councillors: Tim Vooght (Chairman), Gill Westcott, Phil Dicker, Peter Endacott and Leigh Rix. Also District councillors Derek Coren and Peter Heal, and County Councillor Nick Way, and the clerk, Derek Madge. Apologies were received from Paul Mitchell and Jenny Grist.

Declarations of Interest: Councillor Dicker, personal interest agenda item 10, Crossways farm, and District Councillor Coren, personal interest agenda item 10, land at Medland Lane.

Councillor's reports: The Yeoford road sign has been repaired and also is on the list of items for replacement. The chairman was pleased to report the peacocks had been re-homed. Councillor Endacott reminded councillors about the spring clean on Saturday and asked them to encourage more volunteers to take part. A blocked drain at Crocky dip has been reported to highways. Councillor Coren reported traffic cones on the road from Argermay to Dabby Lane had mysteriously disappeared. He circulated details of the council tax charges for the coming year both County and District charges had been frozen. Councillor Heal reported the proposed CIL rate of £90 had not been approved by the Inspector, who had suggested it should be £40. Some District Councillors are challenging the increased parking charges proposed for some car parks in Crediton. Councillor Way reported D.C.C. has cut budgets to freeze tax but he is concerned that the highways budgets had been cut too much. He had toured the area with the highways engineer and looked at various items that had been raised by Councillors and the public. He was pleased to help the PTFA with £ 3,000 from his locality budget.

Clerk's report: There was a reply from Western Greyhound ref 510 and 599 services with details of the current timetables.

There has been an enquiry from Trand Limited with regard to affordable housing at Moor View. They would like to meet the Parish Council to discuss a planning application for the site. Agreed to invite them to the April meeting.

The Clerk mentioned that the notice board was becoming unstable and the chairman agreed he would take it down.

Planning applications:

13/00209/FULL Crossways Farm, Cheriton Bishop: erection of double garage workshop and office building.

- Council requests that a condition is attached to tie the building to the main residence, allowing it to only be used as a garage/workshop. If the Officer is minded to approve the application the Parish Council requests it goes to committee.

13/00296/FULL Land at (Oaklands Farm) Medland Lane, Cheriton Bishop: erection of agricultural building.

- Council objects to the application because the need for an agricultural building has not been proven and it is overdevelopment in the countryside.

Planning decisions by the District Planning Authority

12/01633/FULL Horselake Farm, Cheriton Bishop: Erection of a recreational building for holiday makers, formation of patio area, construction of access ramp. Approved.

12/01404/FULL Horselake Farm, Adjacent to Horselake Bungalow, Cheriton Bishop: Erection of two holiday units with associated parking area. Approved.

12/01647/FULL Partridge Farm, Cheriton Bishop: variation of condition 6 to allow additional use within class B1 confectionary manufacturing business. Approved.

12/01738/FULL Oak Cross House, Cheriton Bishop: conversion of garage to form additional living accommodation. Approved.

0029/13 Lower Eggbeer Farm, Cheriton Bishop: erection of agricultural building. Approved.

The next meeting will be Monday 8th April at 7.30 pm in the Spalding Hall.

District Councillor's comments

Throughout the ward pot-holes have been high on the list of requests. Many have been repaired but there is still a long way to go. Devon County Council is responsible for over 8000 miles of road and this is no small task as they cover the longest network of any county in England. Over the last two years throughout England and Wales Highway Authorities have repaired 4 million pot-holes that is 1 every 16 seconds!

Last year motorists claimed more than £22 million in compensation for damage to their vehicles caused by pot-holes etc. If you know of a pot-hole you feel is dangerous then please report it to Devon Highways by going online to <u>csc.roads@devon.gov.uk</u> or telephone 0845 155 1004. If you phone then please remember to ask for a log number.

We are grateful to Devon Highways for repainting the SLOW sign on Yeoford Road and replacing the 'Give Way' sign at Four Crossways on the Yeoford Road.

This winter there has been some very disturbing incidents involving carbon monoxide poisoning. There have been 5 incidents at least that I am aware of which have resulted in the deaths of 4 people. Carbon monoxide is an odourless gas which comes from burning oil, coal, wood or gas. Anyone using only electric heating will not have a problem. Most people have a smoke alarm fitted in their dwelling but that will not detect carbon monoxide. In order to detect carbon monoxide you need a carbon monoxide alarm and these can be purchased costing in the region of £16 to £28. A word of warning - If you already have smoke and carbon monoxide alarms fitted do ensure that the batteries in them are still working! All Mid Devon District Council houses are fitted with alarms.

Crockernwell News from Drewsteignton Parish Council

Thanks to Tim Cox Services the Crockernwell bus shelter has now been repaired and reinforced, the cost to the Parish is £100 which is the excess on our insurance who met the rest of the cost. The reduction in Western Greyhound bus services to and from Exeter have been discussed at the Eastern Links meeting of Parish Councils, Mel Stride MP has been consulted and the latest news is some alterations will be made on 15th April 2013, which will hopefully bring some improvements. In the meantime the latest timetable can be downloaded from their website or can be viewed in the Crockernwell bus shelter at Stanbury's Orchard (thanks to the Cheriton Bishop magazine!).

The Clerk is keeping an up to date list of highways problems mainly of course potholes, which are passed to Devon CC for attention. We are at their mercy as to when the jobs are completed because of the funding situation. That being accepted we are looking at some works done for example where drains have been flushed out, debris has been pushed back to allow access to the drain and just left which means the next rain we get the drain will block again. It is this Council's view that if a job is to be done it should be done properly or don't waste our money in doing half a job.

We are still trying to get an answer relating to who is fly tipping along Harepath Straight and West Devon Borough Council have already cleared some of this rubbish.

The Council voted to support a planning application for a horse schooling area at North Down Crockernwell.

I came to have tremendous respect and admiration for Don. He was awarded the DFC and this, for me, encapsulated his whole personality. He was always cool, calm, collected, and confident with a quiet assertiveness, inspirational, knowledgeable, courteous, modest and kind.

A real old fashioned English gentleman who, without doubt, was a natural leader.

I will miss him a great deal. I wish I was half the man!

From the Rector

Raising doubts

Easter has only just come and gone. The Cross and Resurrection have been negotiated on Good Friday and Easter day. In the church's year we are between Resurrection and Ascension (May). In these clear-cut events lies the notion of something certain and real. However there are still some big gaps and unanswered questions that make us wonder what was really going on. We are in good company because some of the disciples still doubted at Jesus' Ascension.

"Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted." Matthew 28 verses 16, 17

Doubt in this case is rooted in a lack of understanding, what might be happening, and what is its significance? I truly believe that the reactions to the resurrection by Jesus' disciples echo this uncertainty and doubt. If I look at the resurrection accounts there are no explanations of what happened to Jesus between Friday night and dawn on Easter Sunday. The absence of a physical body is given as evidence of resurrection but the resurrected body is able to appear and disappear in locked rooms. It is clear that the resurrected body appears to demonstrate a freedom from physical constraints. The apparent inability of Mary and the two disciples on the road to Emmaus to identify Jesus and then their immediate recognition of him raises questions about how different Jesus appeared to be. I wonder if they were prevented from recognising him to ensure that they heard the message before being able to see the risen Christ.

What is clear in the post resurrection appearances of Christ is that he is able to bring people from doubt back to belief. In resurrecting the faith of the disciples, Jesus goes to great lengths to tackle their doubts, to provide explanations and give tangible proof of his resurrection. It is clear that this made the disciples see more clearly.

In the Easter course starting at Pathfinder Church on Thursday 4th April we shall look at the resurrection accounts and try to get as much insight as we can. We also ask some questions to which there will be no clear answers and we shall have to see what emerges. It is a six week course which moves around both the days of the week and the villages (see advert for details). Do come and join in and learn more about Easter. There will be material available for you to follow the course if you cannot make all six dates.

I can only marvel at the transformation of the disciples between Easter and Pentecost. At Easter they were in fear of their lives and by Pentecost they were preaching to a crowd of strangers about the resurrected Christ. The transformation is rooted in the rescue of faith in the face of growing doubts. I am sure that the questioning and the doubting are part of growing our faith as long as we allow God the freedom to work within us.

News from Elsewhere

Moretonhampstead Hospital, Temporary Closure Update

Approaching 300 people packed St.Andrews Church on 31st January to question the temporary closure of the hospital. The closure was triggered by the need to improve the skills and experience of our nursing staff as perceived by the CQC (Care Quality Commission) inspection carried out in October. Asked directly by Phil Fowler, Chair of the Hospital League of Friends, Carolyn Mills, Head of Nursing at NDHCT, assured the meeting that they had every intention of reopening the 5 in-patient beds on 1st May, 2013. Following that, the CQC will revisit to ensure their recommendations have been carried out. Meanwhile, other services, clinics and physiotherapy will continue. The ongoing protest petition has raised over 3000 signatures and more were collected at the meeting.

Northern, Eastern and Western Devon Clinical Commissioning Group is replacing the Primary Care Trust. It will be responsible for commissioning local health services from 1st April, 2013. From then the new CCG will be formed where G.P.'s will purchase services for the local community. For these to work to the benefit of the

community it is vital that all of us get involved by expressing our needs, perceptions, suggestions and opinions. Your contributions are vital to the successful running of the new scheme and this is your chance to influence the type and quality of services you receive in the future. Please get involved and drop your comments in the suggestions boxes at the surgery at Cheriton Bishop. All contributions will be considered and good suggestions will be put before the Clinical Commissioning Group.

Hospital Latest Update_- Since the hospital in-patient beds closed, staff have been reassigned to Okehampton Hospital to refresh their skills in readiness for the reopening. The League of Friends is monitoring this progress and making regular enquiries as to the cleanliness and maintenance of the hospital, also the progress of plans for reopening. We will require a Senior Nurse to be in charge of the nursing team and are encouraging the North Devon Health Care Trust to actively seek to have the Senior Nurse in post ready for the in-patients beds reopening. *Betty Short e-m mollypolly@bettyshort.plus.com*
