



In June we did a Jubilee walk from the village around Medland manor area which was very popular.


Last Walk of 2022

Avian Influenza (Bird Flu) Outbreak

An Avian Influenza Prevention Zone has been declared by the Government across the whole of England. This is because of the increased number of cases of the disease across the country. All bird keepers (whether they have pet birds, commercial flocks or just a few birds in a backyard) are now required by law to take a range of precautions to protect their flocks. (Jeyes fluid is a Defra approved disinfectant for Avian Influenza).

There are minimum requirements for all bird keepers to follow. If your birds are not housed, they must be kept in fenced / enclosed outdoor areas. Precautions include (amongst others): feeding birds under cover where wild birds cannot access, preventing access by captive birds to ponds and watercourses, and effectively cleansing and disinfecting any hardstanding surfaces in areas where birds are kept. Enhanced measures apply for premises with over 500 poultry or other captive birds.

Full details of what is required can be found at www.gov.uk/guidance/avian-influenza-bird-flu#AIPZ. You can find a self-assessment checklist at the above link to help you put the measures in place, as well as more information about the virus.

You can keep up to date by regularly visiting the avian influenza section on the government website, and by registering for email or text alerts at www.gov.uk/guidance/apha-alert-subscription-service

Remember that if you have poultry/captive birds it is your responsibility to keep updated on any outbreaks and an easy way to do this is by signing up for text notifications – register with the APHA alerts service at www.gov.uk/guidance/apha-alert-subscription-service.

If you have any concerns about the health of your birds, you should speak to your vet.

The risk to public health from the virus is very low, however it is important that people don't pick up sick or dead birds. You can report

finding dead wild waterfowl (swans, geese or ducks) or other dead wild birds, such as birds of prey, to the DEFRA helpline on **03459 335577**.

Requirements for All Poultry and Captive Bird Keepers

Non-compliance with these biosecurity measures may be an offence.

- Keep free-ranging birds in fenced areas to minimise contact with wild birds, neigbouring poultry or captive birds.
- Inspect outdoor areas, removing wild bird contaminants like faeces, feathers and wild bird carcases.
- Fence off or put netting over areas of standing water or ponds.
- Provide feed and water undercover, so wild birds can't access it.
- Make your premises unattractive to wild birds.
 Use bird scarers, foils or streamers.
- Keep ducks and geese separate from other poultry.
- Store bedding under cover to reduce the risk of contamination.
- Clean and disinfect footwear before and after tending to your birds. If you own more than 50 birds, place foot dips containing Government approved disinfectant at entry and exit points.
- · Clean and disinfect hard surfaces regularly.
- Clean and disinfect equipment and vehicles to avoid disease spread between premises.
- Minimise the movement of people, vehicles and equipment to and from bird areas and keep records of movements.
- Keep records of poultry, captive bird and egg movements.
- Maintain buildings that house birds to prevent water ingress.
- Ensure pest control is effective.

Village Hall Update

The insurers have accepted our claim and the hall is now the responsibility of the surveyors, Brawdia, with no access for anybody else. The draft survey of work to be done was about a new roof and refurbishment, not a rebuild. The surveyor is now drawing up the definitive list of works ready to send out to contractors, which he hopes to get done before Christmas, and to get replies within 3 weeks. The start date will hopefully will be in the early New Year, with completion by the summer.

There may be some scope for the committee to negotiate with the contractor if there are things we would like changed. The insurance is on a 'like for like' basis, which means the induction loop, audio-visual system and PV panels will all be replaced. If the stage needs to be replaced, do we actually want that done or should we negotiate for a flat floor to give the hall greater space? The stage is small, and the only access is up steps from the front, so there is limited opportunity for amateur dramatics. Temporary stages can be hired, or we could buy blocks which provide a raised area for a band, disco etc.

Is there any desire for new sporting clubs in the hall? The ceiling will not be of Olympic height but would that stop a small village badminton club being able to play? Table tennis club?

Let Us Know: The committee would like to see the hall used more, so if there is anything you think could make it more useful please let me know and we will do our best.

News & Events from the Moor

As I write there is a rare bit of sunshine outside which is lovely to see after several days of heavy rain. In the garden at Castle Drogo, there is some winter colour from a late flowering bulb called Nerine bowdenii 'Isabel'. You can find it growing at the base of the sunny wall in the spring borders. Nerines are native to South Africa and enjoy sharp drainage and fairly poor, dry growing conditions so the base of a wall is perfect!

Christmas

Citizen's Advice



Seasonal Scam Alert!

Scammers' tactics are increasingly sophisticated and sometimes hard to recognise. However, there are things to look out for.

- If it seems too good to be true, it probably is. For example, tickets to an event that are much cheaper than being sold elsewhere or a holiday that's a lot less than you would expect to pay.
- Be wary of people contacting you out of the blue on social media, telephone or via text and email offering items for sale or a deal on something.
- If you're buying from a website you haven't used before do a bit of research. Look at the terms and conditions and check that the address is a proper address not just a PO box number. This information can usually be found in the 'contact us' section. Registered UK companies lodge their details on the Companies House website.
- Check what people have said about the company – don't just rely on the reviews on the website itself, have a look at other review sites.
- Scammers often ask you to pay in an unusual way or to pay very quickly.
- Never give away personal information such as a password or PIN and never click on or download anything you don't trust.

To find out about scams across the country, you can sign up to the Trading Standards

email alert on their website www.nationaltradingstandards.uk/workareas/scams-team/.

If you have transferred money speak to your bank and to the police. If you feel the scammer is in your area and you feel unsafe you should also inform the police. You can also report the scam to Citizens Advice Report a scam www.citizensadvice.org.uk/consumer/scams/reporting-a-scam/ and Action Fraud www.actionfraud.police.uk/.

Don't feel embarrassed reporting a scam – it can happen to any one of us and scammers are getting increasingly sophisticated. If you want to talk to someone locally you can contact CA TNMWD on our free, local AdviceLine 0808 27 87 999 or visit www.ruraldevoncab.org.uk and click on 'Get Advice'.

Neighbourhood Watch

A number of you have confirmed that Neighbourhood Watch should continue and you enjoy reading the articles. We look forward to responses from people to questions we may ask in future copies of the Newsletter.

The Old Thatch: There's been some movement in the building and an opening will be very much welcomed by many. A village without its pub is not complete and when the village hall is back in use, Cheriton Bishop will be complete.

Safety: Apparently, 77% of us think about our safety when out and about, and we're four times more likely to be concerned at night. Be vigilant and try not to put yourself in a dangerous situation.

Devon & Cornwall is a Safe Place:

According to National Statistics, we have the third lowest crime rate in the country. Having said that, overall crime rose by 9.5% in Devon & Cornwall in the twelve months to 30th June 2022, which is lower than the national average rise of 12.5%. These statistics were compared with years 2020/21 when there was lockdown and crime fell. But it is still a good indication how good this area is to live in.

Try to reduce burglary: Close and lock windows and doors; put interior lights on a timer; double lock or deadlock exterior doors; have exterior lights on a sensor; always keep an eye out for neighbours and each other; note strangers that are in the area or visiting properties. If you have a burglar alarm make sure it is working and serviced.

Driving Licence: The DVLA have said that there are nearly a million people in the UK with driving licences that are more than 12 months out of date. Driving licence photocards must be renewed every 10 years up to the age of 70 and then renewed every 3 years to legally be allowed to drive. The DVLA usually contacts drivers 56 days before the licence is due to expire. It is then the

responsibility of the driver to renew their licence. (Section 4b on the card shows the expiry date.)

Scams: If you receive an unexpected phone call or email that starts to ask for information, put the phone down and delete the email. You can check the legitimacy by using a different phone and dial a number that you know and can trust. The reason for using a different phone is that the scam caller may not have disconnected. Remember, if it does not sound right it is highly likely to be a scam.

Energy Bill Discount Scam: This money is intended to reduce your energy bill. You don't have to apply for the scheme and will not be asked for bank or building society details. Scam messages are being put out asking you to apply for this, to share personal or financial information. Do not do this.

Fuel Theft: Police are reminding people to remain vigilant by following their advice.

Vehicles: secure vehicles and keys; don't leave keys in vehicles; consider security lighting & CCTV; install alarms and anti siphoning measures; park vehicles in busy, well lit, overlooked areas if possible - ideally covered by CCTV; park with the filler cap facing the road if possible.

Tanks & heating oil: Position the tank close to the house where it can be overseen; when the tank is not in use, turn off switches that control the flow and isolate electricity supplies; install locks and an oil level gauge that sets off an alarm if oil level suddenly drops; protect tanks and lock gates.

In the Garden

The Winter Garden

This is the darkest time of year and many plants will be having a well earned rest.

With the extreme heat of the summer, some plants tried to flower again in the autumn. We have yet to see how this will affect them next year. Some autumn flowering plants started later and might well still be flowering at Christmas! Generally however, the garden looks fairly bleak in winter and it is an ideal time to plan how to improve it. Most shrubs, trees and hardy herbaceous plants will enjoy being planted now. It gives them time to establish before any more water shortages.

Prunus autumnalis is a delightful winter flowering tree with delicate white or pink blossom. Dogwood (Cornus sanguinea) has bright stems with red, yellow or lime green bark. Salix alba 'Britzensis' has wonderful flame coloured stems (which can all be cut back in Spring). Prunus Serrula has attractive polished brown bark.

Then for scent there is Sarcococca (to be planted near a path) and Hamamelis.
Underneath, there is a wealth of Hellebores you can plant to give you months of subtle flowers.
By January, snowdrops and aconites will be peeping through with a promise of Spring.

Hedges and shrubs can be pruned now to improve their shape and remove dead or crossing wood. January is a good time to get out and prune apple trees. Try to create an open space through the centre of the tree and stand back to see what you're doing.

Don't forget the birds in the winter.

They will appreciate some seeds when there are few to find in the hedges and gardens. Do give them some water too, especially if the weather is freezing.

Boundary Anomaly: Next Steps - Task Group, Petition and Governance Review?

Your parish council is currently attempting to find ways of reducing the unreasonable effects of an anomaly in the boundary between district councils. Some areas of Cheriton Bishop are treated as being part of Tedburn St Mary within Teignbridge district. One effect of this is to reduce our ability to influence the location, size and housing design of a development area currently part of Teignbridge's Local Plan review (see marked area on the map).

We should clarify that we are not against new development in principle, as some types of housing are in short supply - affordable rentals, homes in the price range of first time buyers and accessible homes for elderly or disabled residents as examples. What we are asking for is the right of the Cheriton Bishop community to have a full say in development applications, both in house numbers and types and to ensure careful consideration of the effects on local services such as the surgery, school and village amenities.

Both Teignbridge and our own Mid Devon district councils seem to want to ignore the issue. One of our representative district

councillors raised it at a district boundary review and was told it would be dealt with at an upcoming parish boundary review. At that review, he was told it could only be dealt with at a district review! A Teignbridge district councillor has recently told us that it's unlikely they would address the issue as it might affect their ability to meet their quota for new housing.

So What Next?

The parish council is setting up a task group to move the matter forward. Our likely next step – for which we will need your support as community members – is to organise a petition for a Community Governance Review (CGR). Based on the size of our parish, we will need 190 signatures to force the district councils to take our concerns seriously. A CGR requires the district(s) to review the way decisions are made in the affected area so that it: Reflects the identity and interests of the community, is effective and convenient, and takes into account arrangements for community representation and engagement.

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting

Held at Spalding Hall, Cheriton Bishop on Monday 14th November 2022

Present: Cllr Ball (Chair), Cllr Benjamin, Cllr Jackson, Cllr O'Neill and Cllr Coren (MDDC)

In attendance: The Clerk and two members of the public

- 1. To receive and accept apologies: Apologies received from Cllr Marshall, Cllr Salmon and Cllr Letch (DCC).
- 2. To receive declarations of personal and disclosable pecuniary interests in respect of items on the agenda: Cllr O'Neill declared a personal (non-registrable) interest in Planning Application 22/02051/FULL
- 3. Public Discussion an opportunity for members of the public to make representations, answer questions and give evidence in respect of any item on the agenda: One member of the public spoke regarding item 11 (road safety) expressing concerns about speeding by cars, buses and motorbikes at the western end of the village on the C50 which raises safety concerns for pedestrians (including school children) and for drivers entering onto the road from driveways. One member of the public spoke about item 10 (Moor Park).
- 4. Cheriton District Parish Council Meeting Minutes 10th October 2022 to consider the approval of the minutes as a correct record: The minutes were approved as a correct record.
- 5. To receive reports from MDDC Councillors for information only: Cllr Coren reported that MDDC is expecting a funding gap in its budget for 2023/24 and beyond. The Council will have to focus on the service provision it is required to supply by law. This is expected to result in a cut in non-statutory service provision throughout the district. MDDC has therefore written to all Parish Councils asking them to consider assisting in some way with the provision of non-statutory services.
- 6. To receive a report from Councillor Letch (DCC) for information only: The Clerk read out a written report. DCC has received an additional five million pounds for the Household Support Fund which is open to help households struggling most with the increase in the cost of living. The support is being allocated by MDDC. For more information visit the MDDC website middevon.gov.uk/residents. DCC is running a Train4Tomorrow Skills Bootcamp for adults aged 19 or over. This offers fully funded digital and technical courses for those looking to move into a new career. DCC's Corporate Infrastructure and Resources Services Scrutiny Committee will be looking at speeding and road safety.

A government report "Housing Our Ageing Population" published in 2022 and government planning guidance document "Housing for Older and Disabled People" encourage the development of smaller and accessible dwellings to support a wider demographic in communities. It was resolved to support this application which appears to meet the criteria of MDDC Local Plan Policy DM9, with the recommendation that if the application is approved conditions be imposed that: 1) the property should not be used for holiday lets; and 2) that the biodiversity mitigation measures identified in the Wildlife Survey be implemented. [Cllr O'Neill re-joined the meeting].

Cllrs noted that under planning application 17/01282 the applicant already has consent for most of the alterations referred to in this application. Bearing that in mind and after consideration of MDDC Local Plan Policy DM11 it was resolved to be neutral with regard to this application but to recommend that if the application is approved conditions be imposed that 1) natural screening along the roadside boundary in keeping with the rural location should be provided; and 2) the biodiversity mitigation measures identified in the Ecology Report be implemented.

Proposal: Erection of replacement dwelling to include annexe

Location: Pipistrelles Cheriton Bishop
Applicant: Mr Jeffery & Ms Wells

Cllrs noted that this proposal is to replace an existing property with a new dwelling with an improved carbon footprint. The application, which will include PV panels, appears to meet the criteria of MDDC Local Plan Policies S14 and DM10. The application includes an annex to facilitate multi-generational living (see government documents mentioned above). It was resolved to support the application.

- 10. Moor Park to consider further action on inclusion of Moor Park within the Parish: The Clerk reported that she had been informed that, because Moor Park lies outside Mid Devon, any boundary change to bring Moor Park into the Parish would be the responsibility of the Local Government Boundary Commission of England (LGBCE). Information about the LGBCE had been provided to councillors prior to the meeting. The boundary change would be between principal area authorities (MDDC and Teignbridge DC) and would require the support of both authorities. Councillors considered that a request for a Community Governance Review might be more likely to succeed as that request can be supported by a petition of local residents. However, it is not clear whether, even after submission of a petition, a CGR would be allowed because Moor Park is in Teignbridge DC. Cllr O'Neill will submit an update and explanation to the next Newsletter.
- 11. Road Safety to receive an update on road safety issues in the village and agree associated actions: Cllr O'Neill reported that there are now 7 volunteers for Community Speedwatch, some of whom have been trained. It is hoped that Speedwatch will be in action this year. It is also hoped that the group will become independent of the PC but for now Cllr O'Neill will continue to co-ordinate. Councillors discussed potential Speedwatch sites and the following were agreed: the Yeoford Road; by the pub; past the shop going towards Crockernwell and in the 20 mph zone in the village. However, sites have to be approved by the police and meet safety and other criteria. Realistically not all of these sites are expected to be agreed. The Village Hall repairs are expected to start in the New Year and last for up to 4 months. Cllr O'Neil has had no response to his emails to DCC Highways requesting temporary signage for the road outside the Hall Councillors discussed a Facebook post from a parishioner which highlights lack of co-ordination of roadworks in the area, with lane restrictions on the A30, the C50 being closed just past Tedburn from 21 – 25 November and Whitestone Road being closed on the 22nd and 23rd of November. Cllr Ball has emailed National Highways to enquire whether DCC had informed them of the DCC road closures and for confirmation that emergency vehicles would be able to get through but not had a reply. Cllr Jackson had submitted a request for information to DCC Highways and been informed he would receive a reply by 5th December! The Clerk explained that no progress has been made with the Vehicle Activated Speed Sign, as DCC Highways have still not responded to the request for a SCARF assessment. Clerk to try again. 21

12. Planning – to agree a standard comment on applications for submission to MDDC: Councillors agreed the following standard comment should be made when commenting upon planning applications:

"Cheriton Bishop Parish Council strongly recommends that all development complies with the National Planning Policy Framework and Mid Devon Local Plan 2013 – 2033, with particular reference to sustainable development including: use of renewable energy (eg car charging points, air and ground source heating); climate change resilience (eg water saving measures); and the protection and enhancement of biodiversity (eg bird and bat boxes). The Parish Council also strongly recommends that all dwellings comply with Building Regulations 2010 M4(2) Category 2: Accessible and adaptable dwellings."

- 13. Future provision of services by MDDC to discuss letter from MDDC dated 26th October 2022 and agree associated actions: Councillors agreed that it is difficult to identify any services provided by MDDC that the PC could realistically take on. Cllr Coren explained that MDDC should have more information on how services will be affected later in November.
- 14. Defibrillator to receive an update on the second defibrillator: The defibrillator was ordered in September. The Clerk will chase installation. The Clerk reported that she had contacted the PTFA so ask whether they would be prepared to use the £400 (which had been collected for a second defibrillator some time ago) to pay for annual support for the defibrillator. The PTFA had not agreed this because they had previously been told that the PC had no intention of installing a second defibrillator. The PTFA had removed the ringfencing and put the money into use within the remit of their constitution.
- **15. Budget 2023/24 to discuss the draft budget and agree associated actions:** After discussion various amendments to the draft were agreed. To go on the December agenda. Councillors discussed potential projects. Clerk to contact the Church Commissioners to see if some play equipment can be added to the Village Green. No response has been received from DAA to a request for an update on a night landing site.
- 16. Repairs & Maintenance to consider any repairs and maintenance needed for PC assets: Cllr Jackson reported that the wooden bollards at the entrances to the village are all rotten. Councillors discussed how best to replace them, bearing in mind that oak is very expensive. Cllr Jackson to progress. A licence for the work may be required as it is on the public highway. Cllr Ball has set up a shared rota for Councillors to record monthly inspections of Glebelands Play Area. Clerk to arrange for the hedge on the boundary between the Village Green and Chestnut Close to be trimmed. Some blocks have fallen onto the Village Green. These are a potential hazard for children and should be removed.

Funding cascades from central government to county then district and then your parish or town council. County and district council tax demands are capped which means that if those councils are to balance the books one of two things needs to happen an increase to the limit or the probable withdrawal of nonmandatory services. Although parish and town councils are not capped they have fairly limited powers.

With all this doom and gloom I am pleased to announce that this morning I received an e-mail from the leader of Devon County Council to say that we can now start spending what remains of our locality fund. I have just under £6000 left! So I advise those community groups in my division who are looking to plan things for the community that they have a word with me and also check on the Devon County Council website to see what the criteria for a locality fund grant are.






