## CHERITON BISHOP PARISH COUNCIL

Cheriton Bishop Parish Council met on the 11<sup>th</sup> December and the 8<sup>th</sup> January 7.30 at Spalding Hall, Cheriton Bishop.

**Footpath at the End of Hescane Park:** Cllrs discussed this footpath and how to get it adopted by Devon County Council. Cllr Way looked into this and advised that a report from DCC Development Control section would be required to find out what work would be needed to bring the footpath up to standard for adoption. Cllrs await the report.

**Dog Fouling:** Cllrs were advised that there have been no further incidents since MDDC had visited the area with signs. Cllrs would wish to be advised of any new incidents.

**Budget and Precept Request 2018/19:** Cllrs agreed a budget for 2018/19 and resolved to request a precept of £12,000 to support possible future expenditure including monies for the Road Warden Scheme, installing and maintaining outdoor gym equipment and the improvement of the Footpath at Hescane Park.

**Archiving Village Records:** Cllrs are currently negotiating to archive Village records at the Village Hall.

**MDDC Play Area:** Cllrs investigated taking over responsibility for the Play Area but having considered the costs of maintenance and insurance they resolved not to do so at this time whilst MDDC is able to maintain the area.

**Defibrillator:** The Council has applied for a Lottery Grant to purchase a Defibrillator for the parish.

**Hask Lane to Pitton Cross:** Cllrs discussed their concerns about this stretch of road. They confirmed that this road was continuing to deteriorate and was a safety matter. Cllr Way explained the problems with the shrinking DCC budget and that priority is given to A and B roads. He urged as many people as possible to report the problem on the DCC website <https://new.devon.gov.uk/roadsandtransport/report-a-problem/>. The Clerk was also asked to write to DCC.

**Planning:** Cllrs were neutral about the following Planning Application 17/02007 the erection of a 2 storey extension and a single story extension with balcony over and Garage at Little Thorne.

**Tiverton and District Community Transport:** Cllrs resolved not to provide any financial support to this organisation that operates in the parish.

**Cheriton Bishop Community Land Trust:** Cllrs resolved that, in their view, street lighting should be provided.

## ***From the Rector***

### **Seeing clearly and not being blind to our shortcomings**

As we move into February my mind turns to Lent, Ash Wednesday is on 14th February.

Ash Wednesday and Valentine's day seem to be in conflict this year! It only feels like a few weeks ago we were still celebrating Christmas and before that Advent. Advent and Lent I describe as the seasons of watching and waiting. However, we are waiting for very different things, Jesus' birth and Jesus' death and resurrection. The periods of waiting are quite different. Advent can be three to four weeks and Lent is just over seven weeks long. There is also quite a different feel to these similar seasons. There is excitement and anticipation with Advent, whereas Lent feels more like a build up to something we are dreading and probably wish to avoid.

Of course, in real terms, there was around thirty years separating Jesus' birth and crucifixion. For most of those thirty years we know very little about Jesus, we have the birth accounts and trip to Jerusalem as a child where he gets left behind. We pick up his story as he is baptised by John the Baptist and then goes into the wilderness for forty days. We follow his ministry, which brings him into contact with many people. Many who encounter Jesus are transformed by him. Equally, some people are polarized against Jesus and they do not believe God is working through him. They see Jesus as a threat against the God they believe they know and work to get rid of that threat. We follow that build-up of goodness pushing against a tradition that has become blinkered to any other possibility. It becomes a battle of light against darkness. On Good Friday the darkness, finally puts out the light and the icy grip of death wins over life. The hope that we see in Jesus appears to be extinguished, only on Easter Sunday does that hope rekindle and appear brighter than ever before.

As we approach Lent we have the benefit of knowing the end does not result in a death that is not redeemed, but instead God's revelation of a new hope. Even with this assurance, Lent is still a hard path to follow as we are brought back to that basic conflict, of good being overwhelmed by intended darkness, or even harder by misdirected people thinking they are doing the right thing. As we look around our world we see those same conflicts still tearing people apart and causing division. It was the same in Jesus' time, he brought the hope of reconciliation. Lent is very much part of the process of reconciliation, as we individually and collectively look at our shortcomings and try to align ourselves with God's will for us and his world. Perhaps when we are blinkered by our traditions and only see things from our own point of view, we might be causing trouble rather than creating new possibilities?

I am delighted with the report and feel it celebrates some of the wonderful qualities of our school. I feel the teaching of the ‘whole’ child is evident throughout the report and love that the report states that we are a ‘warm and friendly village school’; that children are ‘made to feel welcome by other children and, as a result, they flourish’ and that children ‘feel proud to be trusted to take charge and to be empowered to demonstrate and extend their areas of interest’. Your children are really rather marvellous!

I would also like to say a huge thank you and well done to the staff and governors. They all work incredibly hard and constantly strive to do the very best for all of your children. We have a superb team. Thank you also for the support from colleagues in The Woodleigh Federation and The Link.”

I hope Mrs Waterman won’t mind but I’ve taken the liberty of reproducing her comments from the Newsletter of 20<sup>th</sup> December about the Short OFSTED Inspection of the school which took place on 6<sup>th</sup> December. I have read the report and it really is a great report. It really is encouraging to know that our village school is maintaining its ‘good’ standard. One of the things that always impressed me when I was a School Governor was the friendly atmosphere that permeated throughout the school. To have this and the standard of education confirmed again is super. Well done to Teachers, Staff, Governors, Parents and the children. The whole village should be proud of our school.
