

As I write this month's update, the sun is set to shine and temperatures are starting to creep up. The gardens in our care are springing in to life, the blossom is starting to appear and the countryside seems to be full of daffodils. The seeds in my little greenhouse are getting a good start to the year too. I do hope that you all have chance to enjoy the signs of spring.

The main news from us is the ongoing clear up following the run of storms in Feb. Sadly, we had a lot of damage to trees at Parke, Lydford Gorge, Finch Foundry and Drogo. The Ranger and Garden teams have been working to make the trees safe and remove them where necessary with incredible help from our team of volunteers.

On a happier note, Castle Drogo has now re-opened for the new season and it has been wonderful to welcome people back in to the castle again. We have also hosted a creative writing workshop at Parke with the Learn Devon team and plans are underway for workshops at Lydford Gorge too. Funny Milk - Or Who

Despite their tetrapacks, Ethical Consumer reckon that vegan milk substitutes involve a fraction of the carbon footprint of real milk. This isn't the only thing to worry about though. Our Whitestone advisor Peter Hanson says:

"You may have decided to cut down on eating meat and meat products to do your bit for the planet and you may even have gone so far as to stop having cow's milk on your cornflakes and try something like almond milk instead.

The trouble is, nothing's as simple as it sometimes seems. In the case of almond milk for example, it apparently takes 1,677 litres of water to make a single litre of almond milk.

Most (over 80%) of world almond supplies come from California which has been enduring severe drought for most of the last decade - so farmers there need to drill increasingly deep boreholes to get their water supplies. Then even when you've got your almonds they still need to be processed and shipped over here.

What else should we try instead? One suggestion is to try oat milk instead - popular

in coffee shops these days. To make it yourself you just soak oats in water overnight then blend it all together in a liquidiser".

Another is to use our local milk supplier 'Milk on the Moove', organic, so less carbon intensive. You can get it in re-usable glass bottles, and it has travelled all of the half mile from Haylake Farm!

In the Garden

Let's Get Growing!

May is a wonderful month in the garden and few of us can fail to feel the sudden rush of enthusiasm for planting and enjoying Spring flowers.

By mid May at least, we should be able to put tender plants outside.

Clear away flowering plants that have finished, such as wallflowers and forget-me-nots. Don't forget that wallflowers are a brassica so you shouldn't plant anything else in that family, such as Brussels sprouts or cauliflower, in their place.

Sow beans outside, next to a support. By the time they emerge, all risk of frost should have passed.

Prune raspberry canes so that energy is concentrated in fewer, stronger shoots. This



will allow air to circulate more freely between them and result in bigger, healthier fruit.

Inevitably, just as our plants are beginning to grow and flourish in the warmer weather, so are the creatures that feed on them. In a healthy garden environment, however, predators of these should soon appear and create an acceptable balance. If you keep your plants healthy and stress free, they have a good chance of coping. Look after your soil and when planting new additions to the garden, water well and then mulch to maintain the moisture.

Message from St. Mary's

War Dominates People's Lives & Security

As I write today we are in the fifth week of the invasion of Ukraine, by the time you read this article another month will have passed. It would be amazing to think that a ceasefire had been agreed upon and peace talks were yielding a lasting peace. However, I am more pessimistic and it looks like the Russians are willing to wage a long and drawn-out war.

There are real reminders of the conflicts that Russia has supported in Syria and Afghanistan. They have in common the relentless shelling and bombing that destroys everything in its pathway, people are displaced and often end up as refugees in neighbouring countries. I would love to be proved wrong and my worst fears not realised. It feels that at this moment in time, that military might is overcoming people's rights. Naively, I cannot see what is achieved by turning everything in front of you into a wasteland!

The counterbalance to this destruction and brokenness is the kindness and generosity of strangers.

For me, this was most clearly demonstrated on a train station platform where local residents held up plaques giving accommodation details for refugees to come and stay in their homes.

It is the essence of loving your neighbour even if you do not know who the neighbour is.

It does not take effort to see the trauma and shock on the faces of the refugee families, the offer of shelter, food and security is the first step to meeting their needs. It has also been amazing to see people

collecting practical things like clothes, bedding, toiletries and arranging for their transportation to the Ukraine border. We have seen volunteers driving vans across Europe, ambulances with medical supplies being driven to the war zone and surplus firefighting equipment being donated. It is wonderful to see the creativity and generosity of helpers.

It comes down to what would you hope that someone might do for you if you were in the position of a refugee.

Sadly none of this is new, human history is littered with wars and conflict. I guess this is so much closer to us that we see and feel its effects more acutely. As you read the bible it too mirrors human history. The key message is always to care and look out for the widow, the orphan and the foreigner. It reveals the compassion of God and his expectation that his followers should follow his example. This is further reinforced by Jesus who looks for and helps the outcasts and those on the margin of society. Jesus is unjustly and unfairly treated. We see God caring about love and justice. We rightly renounce hatred and injustice that leads to destruction and devastation. Sadly we see this all too vividly played out in the rages of war. Yet there is still hope for reconciliation and rebuilding as the antidote to war.

We keep praying for peace and keep offering practical help to those in dire need.

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting

Held at Cheriton Bishop Village Hall on Monday 11th April 2022

Present: Cllr Ball (Chair), Cllr O'Neill. Cllr Salmon, Cllr Westcott, Cllr Letch (DCC) and Cllr Coren (MDDC)

In attendance: The Clerk and 17 members of the public

 To receive and accept apologies: Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr Benjamin, Cllr Edwards and Cllr Tomlinson

- 2. To receive declarations of personal and disclosable pecuniary interests in respect of items on the agenda: None
- Public Discussion an opportunity for members of the public to make representations, answer questions and give evidence in respect of any item on the agenda:

Two representatives of Bunnyhomes updated those present on plans to develop 24 homes on land off Church Lane. They are still in the pre-application process and expect to submit the planning application in the next 1 to 2 months with the hope of determination by MDDC in late Autumn. Bunnyhomes reported that they have successfully negotiated with DCC that they do not need to remove or move the hedge along Church Lane. DCC Highways have required that Church Lane be widened in parts to enable a safe highway with sufficient visibility. This will be achieved by removing grass and weeds at the base of the hedge and pruning the hedge back at pinch points. When the development is completed maintenance of the hedge at the correct width will be the responsibility of the management company. The public footpath will run along the inside of the hedge. Bunnyhomes confirmed that one self-build plot will be included in the application. Their landscaper is working with an ecologist to provide a 3-4 metre screening hedge on the southern boundary of the development. They are waiting to hear from South West Water regarding the capacity of the local sewerage system.

Two members of the public spoke about the poor condition of the surface around the war memorial, which is now even more of a dangerous trip hazard. They also provided historical information about the memorial and the laying of the surface. The Clerk and Councillors will try to establish ownership of the surface around the memorial and renew efforts to find a way to renew the surface.

- 4. Cheriton Bishop Parish Council Meeting Minutes 14th March 2022 to consider the approval of the minutes as a correct record: It was resolved to approve the minutes as a correct record.
- 5. To receive reports from MDDC Councillors for information only: Cllr Coren reported that the Village Tidy Up had been successful and well attended. He thanked the organisers and all volunteers for their hard work. Cllr Coren had spent a couple of hours with the DCC Highways team who cleaned gulleys and drains in the Parish.
- 6. To receive a report from Cllr Letch (DCC) for information only: The 2022/3 Locality Fund will be open to requests from May. The North Devon Hospital Trust has merged with RD&E and it is hoped that this will help get through the backlog for elective surgery. The Nightingale Hospital has been kept open for eye and 'cold' surgery.

Councillors also discussed the use of the S106 monies now received to purchase a new picnic bench for the play area. Clerk to resolve how best to complete the project and check that a Wellington bench can be purchased instead of an Exeter bench. This will be more accessible. (The lack of accessible seating was identified in the March ROSPA Play Area Access Audit)

- 12. Repairs & Maintenance to consider any repairs and maintenance needed for PC assets: Cllr Ball reported that the condition of the oak village entrance signs have deteriorated further. At the Exeter end of the village the concrete has collapsed and the signs are falling into the road. The PC had previously asked for tenders to repair the signs but none had been received. Councillor's Greeting

As we look out of our windows and see the bright sunshine and fluffy clouds, the trees and flowers in bloom which attract butterflies and birds it is easy to understand the enthusiasm for this wonderful month. Unfortunately, we still receive council tax bills, new energy contracts and the other financial impacts that we are undergoing at the moment.

When you look at your council tax bill I'm sure you will see that it is in several parts and I'm going only to comment on the county council contribution as I am your county councillor. The increase is 2.99% which is the maximum the council could ask for. When we look at the budgets the main headlines that will interest local people are the fact that adult health and care has increased by 10.4%, children's services by 10.8% and highways by 0.4%. As most of the complaints I receive are about highways you understand my gasp at this last figure. Although it is an increase in percentage terms with the increase in salaries, materials and fuel it really represents a decrease in potential expenditure.

For this reason I hope you will be understanding when I push as hard as I can on potholes, road conditions and traffic calming measures.

I was recently present at a briefing which looked at the amalgamation of the Northern Devon Healthcare NHS Trust and the Royal Devon and Exeter NHS Foundation Trust. The combined services will be titled the Royal Devon University Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust! It was born on April 1st. This is quite a mouthful and we all hope that it will be effective. We were told that at the moment there are over 12,000 people who have been waiting more than 52 weeks for elective surgery. Some 700 patients have been waiting for more than two years for elective surgery. The new merging of the two services hopes that both these figures will come down over the next few years. This will be achieved by more targeted use of consultants and specialist healthcare.

I have begun my tour of surgeries. The first Saturday of the month is in Crediton, the second in Cheriton Bishop and Yeoford, the third is in Copplestone and the final one is in Bow. I remind you of my e-mail address below.


