Village Hall News: Fire Update

I expect everybody knows now that the Village Hall roof caught fire during the afternoon of 1st September. The hall was not being used at the time, and nobody was injured.

The fire started at the end above the stage, and fortunately, the wind was from the east which meant the flames were blown along the ridge towards the road. Had the wind been from the prevailing direction, the flames would have been blown towards the surgery, and we are grateful that it was spared.

We have not had the reports from the Forensic Investigator, the surveyor nor the insurance agent, although all three have inspected the building. We are hoping that we will need a new roof rather than a complete new build. At first glance the kitchen and toilets appear to have survived, and the built-on store cupboard at the far end with the tables and chairs. However, the building is fenced off and we are not allowed access to check.

We do not know the definitive cause of the fire but the firemen who dealt with the blaze suggested it may have started because a solar panel overheated.

We are sorry that half the car park has been put out of bounds by protective fencing, which makes it difficult for people wanting to collect prescriptions etc, but there is nothing anybody can do until all reports are in and a course of action decided on.

In the Garden

Gardening into Autumn

To prevent wind rock and damage to tall shrubs such as buddleia, prune them back by half. A harder prune can be done in the spring. Climbing roses can be cut back by a third and stems tied as horizontally as possible. This will encourage side shoots which are the ones which will bear flowers next summer.

Lifting and dividing of perennials, such as crocosmia, can start now and continue through the winter as conditions allow. The younger growth on the outside of the clump will grow more vigorously when separated.

Some plants, such as salvias and dahlias, are almost looking their best now. A cold spring held them back and then drought delayed them further. Finally the September rain allowed them to flourish and bloom. Keep dead heading dahlias to keep them at their best. The soil is still warm and they will continue to grow until the first frosts.

If the lawn is dry enough to mow, it is a good way to pick up fallen leaves too. The chopped leaves and grass mixture is ideal for making compost. Hardwood cuttings can be taken now. Select healthy straight pieces of stem, the thickness of a pencil, from this year's growth. Cut to about 20cm lengths, remove leaves, and push into well drained soil leaving only a few centimetres above the soil.

Plant garlic cloves (the bigger the better) and continue to plant spring bulbs.

Collect seeds on a dry day and store them in paper envelopes in a cool dry place.

Citizen's Advice

Stretching the Budget

"My oldest child is starting school this month and, with uniforms and PE kits, the costs are already mounting. The school we got into isn't within walking distance so I now need to budget for bus money five days a week too. We're already pretty stretched so I'm not sure how to cover these new costs. Is there any extra help I can get?"

Our advice:

The start of a school year can be tough for many people whose budgets are stretched, especially now so you are by no means alone in your worries. The good news is that there is help available.

A good place to start is the Citizens Advice website www.citizensadvice.org.uk where there is lots of information on the support you may be able to get for school related costs. If you're claiming benefits it's worth checking if you can get extra help for things like school lunches, transport and uniforms. If you are not claiming benefits it may be helpful to use our benefits calculator to see if you are, in fact, entitled to make a claim. At Citizens Advice Torridge, North, Mid & West Devon (CA TNMWD) we can also advise on this and help you to claim if necessary. Simply ring our local, free AdviceLine on 0808 27 87 999 or visit our website www.ruraldevoncab. org.uk and click on 'Get Advice.'

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 automatically get free school meals if you are claiming benefits. For older children you can apply for free school meals if you claim certain types of benefits; the full list is on the Citizens Advice website but it includes Universal Credit, Child Tax Credit and Income Support.

You mentioned you are worried about transport costs. For children aged 5 to 16 your local education authority might be able to offer free or discounted transport if you're not able to walk to the school.

Contact them directly to find out how

they can support you. Your local education authority might also be able to help you with activity and school uniform costs if you are on a low income. You're probably considered to be on a low income if you get means tested benefits like Universal Credit or Housing Benefit. There are also some local charitable schemes that can help – check with your school as they will usually know if these kinds of schemes are in your area. Schools can also sometimes advise on finding cheap or free second hand uniforms.

If your child is disabled or has a health condition you can also claim Disability Living Allowance which is not means tested.

Help is Available

A lot of people are feeling the squeeze at the moment, but it is important to remember that help is available. Remember, CA TNMWD can be contacted on their free, local AdviceLine **0808 27 87 999** or access our website, **www.ruraldevoncab.org.uk**, to search for information to help you.

As you can imagine, CA TNMWD are experiencing an increase in demand for our services. Volunteers are key to helping us deliver. Volunteering is an interesting and worthwhile experience. Don't Miss the Bishop of Exeter!

What do they say about waiting around for a bus? When you wait a long time you will find that two come along at once. (Although it might be that the bus no longer runs on this route sadly). I am not sure that this also applies to Bishops. I spoke to Bishop Robert just before Easter at a meeting and he commented that he had not visited our villages. I was delighted to invite him to come and be with us. He is coming to Tedburn St Mary Parish Church on the 30th of October for a Communion service at 10.30 am. We will be remembering All Saints Day.

The last time the Bishop of Exeter visited our churches was 25th June 2007. I remember the date very clearly as it was the day that I became the priest in charge of these churches. That was over fifteen years ago. As you can see visits by the Bishop of Exeter are a special occasion. You might have to wait a long time for another opportunity.

I guess most of us have experienced the visit of a very important person. There are often weeks of planning and panic at the end to get everything just right for the visit. I remember in Wells, the Queen was coming for her Golden Jubilee. The council decided to upgrade the road on the High Street. Needless to say, the work was running late! The roadworks suddenly were happening twelve hours a day, seven days a week to finish in time. When the very important guest arrives, they are shown around and introduced to some of the local important people. Their visit is often brief just a couple of hours at the most. Most people just get to watch the event as part of the crowd. I always remember just how much work goes into the hosting. I wonder if you have met someone really important and what impression they made on you? Hopefully, the impression has been positive and it has inspired you to do or continue doing great things.

Returning to the visit of the Bishop of Exeter, it is a great chance to meet someone important. My prayer is that the Bishop will point to an even more important truth. Our relationship with God needs cultivating and maintaining. The church relies on people to make church.

Whilst the buildings are important and significant, without people coming together in church they lose their function as a meeting place for people with God. Just as there is an invitation to come to meet the Bishop, there is also an invitation to become part of the local church congregation.

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting

Held at Spalding Hall, Cheriton Bishop on Monday 12th September 2022

Present:	Cllr Ball (Chair), Cllr Benjamin, Cllr Jackson, Cllr O'Neill, Cllr Salmon, Cllr Letch (DCC) and Cllr Coren (MDDC)
In attendance:	The Clerk, two members of the public, and four representatives of Bunnybuild Ltd $% \mathcal{A}(\mathcal{A})$
	Before the meeting commenced a one minute silence was observed in remembrance of the late Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

- To elect a Chair and receive Declaration of Acceptance: Cllr Ball agreed to Chair for three months and was elected (Proposed – Cllr Benjamin, Seconded – Cllr Salmon). The Declaration of Acceptance was received.
- 2. To co-opt a new Councillor and received Declaration of Acceptance: Carried forward to Octobers meeting.
- 3. To receive and accept apologies: None
- 4. To receive declarations of personal and disclosable pecuniary interests in respect of items on the agenda: Cllrs Jackson and O'Neill both declared personal interests in Planning Application 22/01375.
- 5. Public Discussion an opportunity for members of the public to make representations, answer questions and give evidence in respect of any item on the agenda: [Councillors Jackson and O'Neill left the meeting]

Two members of the public raised concerns about Planning Application 22/01375. One explained that he had attended to receive confirmation from Bunnybuild Ltd that the hedge along Church Lane would not be removed. He had now received the confirmation. The other member of the public raised concerns about the capacity of the existing sewer to cope with foul draining and stressed that the pumping station and retainment pond will require maintenance. Concerns were also raised about the proposed footpath along the western boundary of the development site (ie Church Lane). It was suggested that it would be better if the footpath ran long the whole length of the boundary. Representatives of Bunnybuild Ltd summarised the planning process in respect of the application to date, explained how plans had been adapted after receiving feedback from public consultation and gave information on proposed S106 contributions (approximately £25.5k to the NHS Trust, £93k to primary education and £11k for secondary education transport).

6. Mid Devon District Council Planning Application – to consider the following application upon which the Council has been asked to comment:

Reference:	22/01375/MFUL
Proposal:	Erection of 24 dwellings including affordable housing, with associated access,
	landscaping and infrastructure
Location:	Land at NGR 277371 93228 East of Church Lane Cheriton Bishop
Applicant:	Bunnybuild Ltd

[The meeting was suspended whilst the applicant answered questions from Councillors.]

Councillors asked for information about various concerns which had been raised previously by councillors and parishioners including:

- The length of the footpath and place of re-entry for pedestrians onto Church Lane. Bunnybuild Ltd stated that this has been approved by DCC Highways, who advised it was a safe place for pedestrians as the visibility was better there.
- The installation of sleeping policemen on Church Lane to slow down traffic in the 20 mph zone and make the site entrance safer. The applicant responded that this was an issue for DCC Highways but reiterated the comments above regarding Highways approval.
- Concerns about capacity in South West Water's foul drainage. The applicant stated that they have consent to connect to the mains sewer. South West Water have stated that there have only been

3 reported incidents regarding foul drainage during the last decade. The proposed pumping station will have 2 pumps and is unlikely to fail. If there are problems with foul drainage in the future it will be South West Water's responsibility to remedy.

- The proposed housing density (24 homes as opposed to the 20 homes identified in MDDC Local Plan Policy CB1). Bunnybuild responded that the proposed density is within national guidance for housing density. The provision of 24 homes is in their opinion an effective use of the site as encouraged by the National Planning Policy Framework. Also, if the number of homes is reduced the prices will increase.
- Recommendations from the Devon & Cornwall Police Designing Out Crime Officer. Bunnybuild confirmed that access to the rear of the row of bungalows along the southern edge of the site will be restricted via a gate, and that only the site management company will have access to this zone. However, the orchard area at the southwestern corner of the site will be accessible to anyone using the foot path inside the site. Management of the site will eventually become the homeowners responsibility.
- The importance of the self-build plot. Councillors stressed that this is the only way an individual can build their own full market value home under MDDC's current Local Plan. Its size was queried and whether the open space adjacent to the self-build plot could be attached to it to provide more options on layout and design. Bunny Homes advised that this area had been included in their biodiversity/ habitat net gains calculations, but that they would discuss this further.

[The meeting was re-started].

After lengthy discussion about the merits of the application, and bearing in mind that Bunnybuild Ltd had taken on board some local concerns, it was resolved (2 for, 1 neutral) to support the application with the following suggestions:

- That the size of the self-build plot be increased
- That the design of the retainment pond be reviewed to provide an improved ingress & egress safety ratio

[Cllrs Jackson and O'Neill re-joined the meeting]

- 7. Cheriton Bishop Parish Council Meeting Minutes 11th July 2022 to consider the approval of the minutes as a correct record: It was resolved to approve the minutes as a correct record.
- 8. To receive reports from MDDC Councillors for information only:

Cllr Coren explained that he had arranged for Mel Stride MP to view the fire damage to the Village Hall and gain his support for the repair/rebuild. Councillors were reminded of the Village Tidy on Saturday 17th September. He has arranged for a Teignbridge DC Councillor to attend the October meeting to discuss the parish boundary in relation to Moor Park.

9. To receive a report from Cllr Letch (DCC) – for information only:

DCC has had a disappointing OFSTED review of the provision of childrens' services in the County. There are issues with staffing and funding. Cllr Letch offered his support for re-starting a Cheriton Bishop Speedwatch.

10. Mid Devon District Council Planning Applications – to consider the following applications upon which the Council has been asked to comment:

12. Daffodils for the Village Green – to consider joining the Allies Mid Devon Project to plant daffodils across Mid Devon:

Cllr Benjamin explained that the project aims to plant more than 130,000 daffodils across Mid Devon in acknowledgement of the lives lost during the Covid-19 pandemic. The bulbs (which are provided free of charge) will also be an important early source of pollen for bees and other insects. It was resolved to join the project. Cllr Benjamin will ask for 500 bulbs and volunteers to help with planting.

- 14. Planning to consider reports from the Task & Finish Group on guidance notes for consideration of planning applications and related site visits:

Cllr O'Neill reported on the notes which had previously been circulated. Amendments to the notes were agreed. Cllr O'Neill to action. Councillors asked the Clerk to draft a standard planning comment for consideration at the October meeting. Cllr Benjamin will put wording on the Facebook pages to advise planning applicants that their applications may be considered at PC meetings, make it clear that all applicants are welcome to attend PC meetings and that they should therefore check upcoming agendas.

15. Planning - to consider whether the PC should write to MDDC regarding the duty of care they owe to planning applicants with regard to comments submitted on the MDDC public planning portal: Carried forward to October meeting.

16. Speedwatch - to consider re-starting the Community Speedwatch group:

Cllr O'Neil hopes to re-start the group and will seek volunteers. There are particular concerns at the moment on the Yeoford Road because more cars will park on the road as a result of the fire at the Village Hall. A minimum of 6 volunteers is needed.

17. Defibrillator – to receive an update:

The Clerk reported that the order has been placed and she is liaising with the school. As the defibrillator is being acquired via a Managed Plan it will be insured with the provider.

18. Repairs & Maintenance -to consider any repairs and maintenance needed for PC assets:

South West Water: Customer Promise

Concerns were raised at the September PC meeting about recent problems with the water supply to some homes in Cheriton Bishop. These concerns have been raised with South West Water and here is their response:

"As per our customer promise, If the public water supply to your home is unexpectedly interrupted (due to a burst main, for instance) or where we have to carry out emergency repairs affecting your water supply, we'll restore the supply within 12 hours of becoming aware of the interruption. If we fail to restore your supply within these times, we'll automatically pay you £30, plus an additional £30 for each further 12-hour period your supply remains unrestored.

We'll make payment within 20 working days of the supply interruption. If we don't make a payment which we should know is due to you, we'll automatically make an additional payment of £20. Where we don't identify that you're affected and are therefore unable to make an automatic payment, you can claim your payment within three months of the date on which your supply is interrupted.

Where you experience a planned or an emergency interruption lasting more than 12 hours, we'll provide an alternative source of water.

If we fail to do this you can claim £20. If your water supply is interrupted three or more times in any 12-month period due to a burst main, you can claim a payment of £10 for the third and each subsequent supply interruption. A payment is not due where the burst main is caused by third party damage.
