Sculpture Exhibition

Sir Tim Smit is set to open the Ashburner Prize sculpture exhibition at Stone Lane Gardens to the public on **1st July**. Sir Tim Smit is a co-founder of the Eden project and first gained notability with his re-discovery of the Lost Gardens of Heligan in Cornwall.

The prestigious exhibition will showcase the South West's emerging artists and will be open to visitors until October 31st.

Now in its 30th year the exhibition has received a record number of entries from artists competing for the prize (sponsored by Caradon Granite). Most pieces will be available to buy.

Located, near Chagford, only minutes from the A30 and Castle Drogo, the Gardens have been described as "a gem" by horticulturalist and broadcaster Jo Swift. Stone Lane Gardens is an RHS Partner Garden, which holds a unique National Collection of Birch and Alder trees from around the world. The Gardens are an inspiration to artists and visitors.

The Ashburner Prize is named after the Garden's founders, June and Kenneth Ashburner.

This year's panel of judges consists of internationally renowned ceramic sculptor. Sandy... Brown, author and academic Penny Florence, and charity trustee Sandy Lipo. The theme of the 2022 exhibition is Connectivity.

Update from Acorn



Acorn Jubilee Trifle Recipe

Our trifle is fun and easy to make.

It aims to represent our various peoples and the monarchy. It has a WI recipe Victoria sponge (of course!), Scottish raspberry jam and whisky, custard the colour of a Welsh daffodil, and lovely double cream representing the dairy products of Northern Ireland.

At the heart of our trifle, we have more exotic ingredients to represent our friends in the commonwealth and all those who have made their homes in our wonderful United Kingdom.

And of course, pride of place goes to Her Majesty in the form of a crown of edible delights on top.

Beryl, (one of our tasters) said: "Lovely, t'is fit for a queen". We hope you agree.

2 litre bowl - serves 8-10

INGREDIENTS

Victoria Sponge

- 175g hard margarine
- 175g caster sugar
- 3 large eggs
- 175g self raising flour
- 175g raspberry jam (no lumps)

Filling

- 80q ginger nut biscuits (broken)
- 175g drained mandarins
- 30g flaked almonds
- 225mls whisky/mandarin juice (50/50 mix)

Custard

- 60g custard powder
- 60g caster sugar
- 800mls full fat milk

Cream

250mls double cream

Decoration

- 8-10 fresh clementine/mandarin segments
- 8-10 blanched almonds

METHOD

Victoria Sponge

1 Line a 28 x18cm baking or roasting tray with grease proof paper.

- 2 Set oven to Gas Mark 4 / Electric 180 C / Fan 160 C
- 3 Use an electric hand whisk to cream the margarine and sugar together until light and fluffy.
- 4 Beat the eggs in, one by one.
- 5 Fold in the flour.
- 6 Pour into the tin and spread flat. Bake for 20 30 mins until light brown and springy to the touch.
- 7 Leave in the tin for 5 mins, then turn out onto a wire rack to cool.
- 8 Cut the edges off to neaten, and slice off the top if it is too brown or uneven. There will still be plenty.
- 9 Turn over and spread the jam on the bottom side. *This will be flat.*
- 10 Cut in half to give two equal 9x14cm pieces and put one on top of the other so it's cake, jam, cake, jam.
- 11 Slice into 1.5cm wide fingers and carefully line the bottom 2/3 of the bowl, always putting a jammy edge against a plain edge. If you start across the bottom you should end up with a smile on both sides.

Filling

- 1 Layer into the middle of the bowl the ginger nuts, then the drained mandarins, and finally the flaked almonds
- 2 Pour over the whisky/mandarin juice mix contacting as much of the cake and contents as possible.

Custard

- 1 Mix the custard powder and sugar with a little of the milk.
- Warm the milk to blood temperature and add a little of this to the custard powder/sugar mix.
- 3 Pour this mix into the warmed milk.
- 4 Continue to cook, stirring continuously, over a low heat until the custard thickens and leaves a trail as you stir. Do not boil.
- 5 Pour over the trifle and tap to bring air bubbles to the top. Refrigerate to set. This will make a thick custard so don't make it before you are ready to pour.

Cream

- 1 Whisk the double cream to a soft, spreadable consistency.
- 2 Spread over the set custard using a spatula.

Decoration

- 1 Make a crown with the clementine and almonds.
- 2 Refrigerate until required. Can be made a day or two before the event.

ACE Archaeology Club

Since I last wrote we have had three ACE days. The weather was kind to us on all of them, so we must be doing something right.

March: We set off to finish something we started a few years ago, helping out an ACE member with work on her parish churchyard at South Tawton. We had previously surveyed most of it but have now finished that off and also helped to decipher some of the older inscriptions on the gravestones. This will help visitors trying to do family research.

April: We explored prehistoric cairns, saw stone rows and discussed local legends at Mardon Down, near Moretonhampstead. The surprise of the day was that seemingly the whole of Marden Down is riddled with World War 2 practice trenches. There was even evidence of bridging, railway cuttings and embankments which had been constructed by American engineers. The morning prehistory session was led by Andy Crabb, our Archaeology adviser and also a Dartmoor National Park archaeologist. The afternoon WW2 session was led by our member Anne Whitbourn.

May: The Goadstone area is very popular and accessible with the result that there is a fair amount of erosion happening around the prehistoric sites. We were comparing 4 previous surveys with what we could now see on the ground and working out what remedial work needs to be done to protect the sites. We surveyed 2 cairns and started an off-set survey of 2 stone rows but this wasn't finished so we will be going back there.

The rest of the summer will be taken up with preparation for our dig in July, 16th to the 31st. We hope to have an open day, probably on the 23rd so do look out for information about that on our website and our FaceBook page, we really would like to see anyone who is interested. Citizens Advice: Struggling with Bills...

We can all face problems that seem complicated or intimidating. At Citizens Advice Torridge, North, Mid & West Devon we provide free, independent, confidential and impartial advice to everyone on their rights and responsibilities. Here is an example of the kind of questions we are being asked and the advice we give in response.

"I am a single parent, with two young children.
I am already struggling to stay on top of my
household bills; my weekly food shop isn't
stretching as far anymore and now my energy
bill is going up too. I don't know how I'm going to
afford all of these price rises. What can I do to stop
my finances spiralling out of control?"

Our Response:

Firstly, you are not alone in this and there's support to help you. It's worth checking if there are benefits you don't know about that you're eligible for, including support with your energy and living costs. On the Citizens Advice website there's a benefits calculator, advice on how to reduce living costs and information on other ways to increase your income. There's also emergency support that you may have access

to, like food bank vouchers or fuel vouchers. You could contact your local council to see if they could offer support. If you're struggling to stay on top of bills, it's really important to understand what money you have coming in and going out each month. Citizens Advice has a budgeting tool on its website to help with this. If you're already behind on bills, prioritise paying your rent or mortgage, plus energy bills and Council Tax first. Not paying these bills has serious consequences. You should speak to the person or company you owe money to, to see if they can help you repay your bills sustainably. We know that times are incredibly tough but please remember, you don't have to face this alone, do contact us at CA TNMWD to help you find a way forward.

Community Led Housing

How can communities create more homes that are affordable to local people? In much of rural Devon house prices are 11 times the average income, and rented accommodation is scarce, whether 'affordable' or not.

One route is that taken by Cheriton Bishop Community Land Trust, which has worked with a Housing Association to provide affordable rented homes at Higher Shippon, with a local connection test for prospective residents. Rents are 80% of market value, which is still a lot for some, although those eligible for housing benefit receive help with the rent. The development won a prize for its design, the outcome of local consultation and environmentally aware architects.

Some people have achieved lower housing costs through co-housing projects, where residents have their own homes but there can be shared facilities like a laundry, a guest flat or a communal dining area. Hazelmead, a development by Bridport Co-housing, is one of the largest with 53 affordable eco-homes.

Housing co-ops are another way to share the costs and facilities of a larger property – sometimes with individual flats. Corani Housing Co-op allows a family and some individuals to share a large house and garden near Crediton station. Some financial models let occupants build up equity with their rent. There are also intentional communities, such as Beech Hill,

occupying an old mansion in Morchard Bishop providing very low cost living, with large grounds and vegetable gardens.

For Devon villages, the Community Land Trust is probably the most popular route, allowing individual homes, with some for affordable rent, built and managed by a Housing Association. You can see some examples on the Devon Community Housing Hub www. devonhousinghub.org.uk/. Christow, has CLT homes for both rent and shared ownership (purchased at 80% market value with a resale covenant to keep their resale value capped at 'affordable'). There are homes for families and for older people to downsize. The Christow group were supported by the same non-profit agency – Middlemarch – which helped the Cheriton Bishop CLT through all its stages.

Several CLT's in Devon are running community shops, or pubs which would otherwise have been lost, usually financed through a mixture of grants, loans and a share issue.

Cheriton Bishop CLT is looking for a few new trustees to join and help take it forward; and perhaps, who knows, undertake a new project, whether for residential homes or securing a community asset. Neighbourhood Watch

Villagers Awareness Proposal

Cheriton Bishop Neighbourhood Watch Initiative

It is that time of year when there seems to be an increase of cold callers, some can appear aggressive or very pushy. You are likely to feel less vulnerable if you are aware of their presence and can take prior action. A decision can be made to talk to them or not and also to ensure external doors and windows are secure and even seek support from a neighbour.

Early knowledge of this is the key or of anything untoward in the village. To achieve this is to belong to a telephone cascade system consisting of a list of people with their telephone numbers.

All members have the responsibility to phone the

next person on the list to pass the message on. If that person is not available, a message is left and then called again later. The cascade continues by phoning the next number on the list, and so on.

Anyone who would like to be informed of what is going on and are happy to have their name and phone number on a list will be part of the cascade.

To start the cascade please send your name, address and phone number to Jean Martin on **01647 24586** who will let you have a list of members and their phone numbers forming the cascade. This will be updated when required.

Home Burglary Protection

We are told that opportunity plays a big role in enabling crimes to be committed. Most domestic burglaries are committed by opportunists who look out for property that seems to be unoccupied, has little or no apparent security, has doors and windows left open, and where they won't be seen.

As a rule, a home's overall impression will influence whether it is targeted. If it looks occupied and it looks well cared for and tidy then the burglar is likely to go elsewhere.

'Tick' Season

An tick bite can affect both humans and animals. Prevention and being prepared to respond quickly is the best form of protection including: Walking to defined paths, covering up as much as possible, wearing light coloured clothing so that ticks are easier to spot, wear insect repellent, carry out regular checks after outdoor activity, as spotting them early allows you to act promptly.

For tick removal use fine headed tweezers or a 'tick removal tool', to hold onto the tick as close to the skin and slowly pull upwards. Afterwards wipe the site with an antibacterial wipe.

Local Policing Team

Two local officers visited Cheriton Bishop early in May and were available for two hours at the Doctors Surgery Carpark. The idea was that anyone could seek advice, ask questions or have a chat about 'things' in the village. We hope that people took advantage and informed the officers of what was on their mind or cause of concern. It is understood that the police hope to do this again in the future.

Remote Access Scams

It's reported that over 20,000 people in the UK were victims to scams last year where they were tricked into handing over control of their computer and smartphone to criminals. The average loss was £2,870 per victim.

Protect yourself and be on you guard if you are contacted. Never install software or grant remote access to your computer or device by someone you do not know or browser pop up or to a text message. Bank or service provider will never contact you asking for access to your device. If your device has been infected with a virus or malware, follow NCSC's guidance for recovery on the internet. Protect your money by contacting your bank on a different device or phone to the one the scammer has contacted you on. Report the incident to Action Fraud by phoning **0300 123 2040** or *actionfraud.police.uk*

Always be observant & vigilant and keep your eyes open when out and about.

In the Garden

Busy in the Garden...

June is a busy month in the garden. There is still time to plant before the heat of the summer. If you have any tender plants left to put out, you might need to create a space. It is warm enough for exotics like cannas and begonias. Generally it is easier to look after plants in the ground rather than in pots, although they will need watering until established. Alternatively, you could sink the pot into the ground to fill a space.

Spring flowering plants can be cut back now and should produce new foliage and flowers in a few weeks.

Hellebores will look tatty and often get blackspot on the older leaves so they can be removed. Spring bulbs will be ready to cut back or lift if you have somewhere to store them. Oriental poppies often flop untidily when they finish flowering so cut them right back. Clematis montana and clematis alpina can be trimmed back with shears. The new growth will bear flowers next year.

Spring flowering shrubs such as lilac, deutzia and kolkwitzia can be cut back by up to a third. But rather than trimming the flower heads, it is better to cut out some of the older branches at the base.

You might find that hedges have grown over paths and gateways. Trim them so that you can pass through without getting soaked after a shower of rain. The main cut should of course be left until after birds have finished nesting, in September.

Look out for suckers on roses, which should be pulled off as low down as possible. But most important of all, take time to enjoy the fabulous show and perfume of roses at their June best.

There is a story of the pig and the hen having a conversation about how they are so important in the traditional British way of life. They each have a part to play in the Great British cooked breakfast. However, the pig points out to the chicken, the chicken is involved but the pig is committed! One of the parties is giving sacrificially whilst the other is only a regular giver.

This month sees the Queen celebrate her Platinum Jubilee, the first British monarch to reach this milestone. In her Accession Day message, she referred to the pledge she made on her 21st birthday broadcast.

We have let our attention slip and miss the signs of danger before it is too late. We are reminded painfully it is much harder to sort out a mess than prevent it. The Christian faith is rooted in service and helping others in need. It is not marked by helping ourselves to a better life at the expense of others. There are echoes of the Queen's faith in her pledge of service celebrated this month.

I have finished my first year as a county councillor. It has been a very steep learning curve having to take into consideration the needs and demands of the several parishes that make up my division. I have done my best to get to know people by attending all the parish council meetings as well as holding surgeries in five of the parishes.

Responsibilities

As a county councillor you suddenly realise that people ask questions that are outside your remit. The three local councils (Parish, District and County) have differing responsibilities. County is responsible for health, education, adult welfare and children's services. It is also responsible for transport and highways. It is this latter responsibility that occasions the most questions and enquiries. One piece of advice that I can offer is that it is often better for a group of people to go online and each report the same pothole because it seems to work on the numbers basis. Once a certain number of people have clicked on a pothole it results in action being taken. The same can be said for blocked drains and street-lighting.

The District Council is responsible for housing, recycling and planning. I am a district councillor for

Crediton but have never worried about this division because if a parishioner raises an issue that is of concern, I liaise with my DC colleagues.

The budget for highways has received a minimal increase which in real terms means a decrease and so I am sure that over the coming year we will see no improvement in our roads. This is an issue that I think that we as a party, I mean the Liberal Democrats on Devon County Council, must push the Cabinet to consider.

As well as representing the constituents in my division I'm also aware of the fact that we as councillors have a more overall responsibility for the workings of the county. Issues such as education and well-being are countywide. This is why I am pleased to be on the children's scrutiny committee and hope to be on the health and adult care scrutiny committee from May. It is a delicate balancing act to represent the locals as energetically as possible and to keep an overview of the challenges to Devon County Council of which we are members.


