## Welcome to the Newsletter

In celebration the Coronation, Their Majesties have shared a recipe for a Coronation Quiche. A deep quiche with a crisp, light pastry case and delicate flavours of Spinach, Broad Beans and fresh Tarragon. Eat hot or cold with a green salad and boiled new potatoes - perfect for a Coronation Lunch!

x1, 20cm flan tin (serves 6)

#### **Ingredients: Pastry**

125g plain flour Pinch of salt

25g cold butter, diced

25g lard

2 tablespoons milk

(or 250g block of ready-made shortcrust pastry)

#### Ingredients: Filling

125ml milk

175ml double cream

2 medium eggs

1 tablespoon chopped fresh tarragon,

Salt and pepper

100g grated cheddar cheese,

180g cooked spinach, lightly chopped

60g cooked broad beans or soya beans

#### Method

Sieve the flour and salt into a bowl; add the fats and rub the mixture together using your finger tips until you get a sandy, breadcrumb like texture.

Add the milk a little at a time and bring the ingredients together into a dough. Cover and allow to rest in the fridge for 30-45 minutes

Lightly flour the work surface and roll out the pastry to a circle a little larger than the top of the tin and approximately 5mm thick.

Line the tin with the pastry, taking care not to have any holes or the mixture could leak. Cover and rest for a further 30 minutes in the fridge.

Preheat the oven to 190°C.

Line the pastry case with greaseproof paper, add baking beans and bake blind for 15 minutes, before removing the greaseproof paper and baking beans.

Reduce the oven temperature to 160°C.

Beat together the milk, cream, eggs, herbs and seasoning.

Scatter 1/2 of the grated cheese in the blind-baked base, top with the chopped spinach and beans and herbs, then pour over the liquid mixture.

If required gently give the mixture a delicate stir to ensure the filling is evenly dispersed but be careful not to damage the pastry case.

Sprinkle over the remaining cheese. Place into the oven and bake for 20-25 minutes until set and lightly golden.

#### Crewel Work with Judith Richards

Judith Richards will demonstrate and guide us through the intricacies of crewel work. Crewel work is an ancient form of embroidery dating back to the 17th century when wool thread was used to decorate bed spreads, curtains and adorn lavish homes. The earliest surviving example is the Bayeux Tapestry which depicts the Norman Conquest. The word crewel is the old word for twisted wool and most of the wool originated from Worsted, a small village in Norfolk. Judith will be using silk threads and using stitches such as stem and couching.

## News from the Scout Group

If you have been past Crofter's Mead recently you cannot have failed to notice a change; we have had the line of trees that border the road cut down! Whilst this may appear a drastic move that isn't terribly environmentally friendly there were a number of reasons behind that. First, the road border was only ever intended to be a hedge, not a line of mature trees; a number of the trees were either dead or suffering ash dieback and so would have been removed anyway; and it was shading out a considerable area of our site and also impacting the light levels entering our neighbours properties on the other side of the road.

Our plan is to allow the 3 or 4 young trees deliberately left standing to mature naturally as a way of breaking up the length then, every 2 or 3 years, to lay the new growth. This will, in time, thicken the hedge and provide even more opportunities for wildlife than it did. In addition we are not wasting any of the wood that was cut, all of which we have kept. Some will be used for firewood, some for bug hotels and wildlife friendly

log piles, and the brash has been chipped (sorry about the noise, the chipper was a real beast and very loud) to be used to mulch the Christmas trees we have been growing.

By the time you read this we will have celebrated St. George's Day with our annual parade, in Okehampton, along with other Scout groups in the mid-Devon district. This year we will have had the added cacophony of the national emergency alert test - several hundred devices all going off at the same time in Okehampton College hall may just have challenged the tree surgeon's chipper!!!

Lastly, we will be making the most of the Coronation weekend by joining the rest of the village at the tea party on Sunday and we will be hosting a 'big help out' on Monday 8th May. We have a long list of jobs to do around our site, so as well as the families of our young people, you will be would be very welcome to join us.

## Citizen's Advice



### Working During Bank Holidays

"I recently started a new job where my boss has told me I will have to work on Bank Holidays. This was never the case in my old job. Can my employer really make me work on a public holiday and should I get paid extra if I do?"

Unfortunately, when it comes to bank holidays, whether or not staff have to work is up to their employer and you don't have to be paid more if you do. The situation will vary from job to job and will depend on a number of factors such as whether your place of work is open on bank holidays, your hours of work and, crucially, what your contract of employment says.

Take a look at your contract. It may say that you will always get bank holidays off or it may say that sometimes you will be required to work them. If your place of work is open on bank holidays you may be asked to work some but if your contract clearly says that you get bank holidays off you shouldn't be asked to work them.

Your contract may say 'In addition to bank and public holidays, your annual holiday entitlement is x days.' This means you get public holidays off in addition to your annual leave entitlement but might not mean you are entitled to take specific days off. You may be required to work on a bank holiday in which case you should get another day off instead.

Alternatively, it may say something like 'Your annual holiday entitlement (inclusive of bank and public holidays) is x days.' This means that you have to take bank holidays off as part of your annual leave allowance (so you'll have to book all bank holidays as paid time off) or counted as additional holiday days.

A common misunderstanding is that employers have to pay you extra when you work a bank holiday. This is not the case unless your contract specifies otherwise. Your employer needs to stand by what is in your contract of employment. In the absence of a contract, the legal default position is that your employer can tell you when you can and can't take time off. If you wish to take a bank holiday off you should request it in the usual way within your organisation. If this becomes an issue with your employer you should try and resolve it via an informal chat in the first instance and if that doesn't get you anywhere, raise a formal grievance. ## In the Garden

## May Magnificence!

May is lush and green and everything is growing fast. Twiggy supports from pruning are useful for pea sticks and for tall perennials which might become too heavy, like delphiniums. Sweet peas might need to be gently tied to their supports so that they grow upwards rather than into their neighbours. The heads of daffodils and tulips can be snapped off. Leave the foliage to die back for at least six weeks before disturbing it, although you can move the plants to a different location if necessary.

Alyssum and aubretia stay much more compact if you cut them back after flowering. Trim them almost to the ground and they should produce fresh new growth. Pulmonarias also respond well to this

treatment and look much better if you remove the mouldy leaves.

Clematis Montana often outgrows its space, so after its wonderful show of blossom has finished, cut it back to where you need to. It will produce young shoots which will flower next Spring.

Sow and plant out tender vegetables such as sweetcorn and courgettes this month.

Move tender plants, like cannas and dahlias, outside. If a cold night threatens, wrap some fleece around them to protect growing shoots.

If you start runner beans and French beans inside, it does give them slightly more chance against those hungry slugs at this time of year!

Enjoy the sheer exuberance of flowers and foliage which changes every day in this magnificent month in the garden.

## Message from St Mary's

### The King's Coronation

Can you remember the last Coronation on 2nd June 1953? You would probably be aged 74 to remember much about the day which means only 1 in 10 of us would have memories of the last Coronation.

My father remembered the Coronation, he recollected that it rained heavily and only the Queen of Tonga refused to have a cover put over her carriage, she was visible to the crowds on the streets.

This month of May will see the Coronation of King Charles III on Saturday 6th May at Westminster Abbey. As part of the weekend of celebrations, there is now an extra bank holiday on Monday 8th May.

King Charles is distinguished as the most mature King of England by age, let us pray for great wisdom to accompany such maturity.

In the bible God's people, the Israelites decided that they needed a visible King rather than being indirectly governed by God. They asked the prophet Samuel to sort out a King with God. There is sadness at their rebellion against God and his rule.

We are told that God warns them that the King will want an army to wage war, that he will demand the finest things and that the King will take taxes and servants to achieve the things he wants. The people are not deterred by God's warnings and say that they want to be like other nations to have a King that might govern them and fight their battles (1 Samuel 8 vs 19-22).

So God relents and Samuel anoints Saul as the first King of Israel. As you read on through the bible a lot of the problems that are encountered stem from the King drifting away from God and seeking his selfish agenda.

It is not limited to Kings, the great prophets Eli and Samuel, and their children drift away from God for their own interests.

It is a very human condition that when placing ourselves at the centre of the world and only looking out for ourselves we often ignore the greater needs of those around us.

It is not a coincidence that two of the Ten Commandments put God first and we are not to have any other idols. If we centre ourselves around God's way then we have a hope of improving our world. Often following examples is a good way to model ourselves.

The example that God gives is Jesus Christ and he is a great example of compassion and care. Our late Queen Elizabeth gave a great model of service to her subjects.

As you watch King Charles III's Coronation, notice that it happens in an abbey, by an Archbishop. It acknowledges that God's spirit is required to enable the King to fulfil his life of service to our country. It is set within a communion service which Jesus started on the night before he died. This has more powerful resonance as we have just celebrated Easter, his rising from death.

We pray that King Charles will continue his life of service. We pray this would be a moment for all to encounter afresh the person of Jesus Christ – the servant King – and be renewed in our calling to serve Him by serving others.

## Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting

#### Held at Spalding Hall, Cheriton Bishop on Monday 11th April 2023

Present: Cllr Ball, Cllr Benjamin, Cllr O'Neill (Chair) Cllr Salmon, Cllr Coren (MDDC) Cllr Letch (DCC)

In attendance: The Clerk and one member of the public

1. To receive and accept apologies: Apologies received and accepted from Cllr Marshall

- 2. To receive declarations of personal and dis-closable pecuniary interests in respect of items on the agenda: None
- 3. Public Discussion an opportunity for members of the public to make representations, answer questions and give evidence in respect of any item on the agenda: None
- 4. Cheriton District Parish Council Meeting Minutes: The minutes were not approved and require amending.
- 5. To receive reports from MDDC Councillors for information only: Cllr Coren indicated this is his last meeting and he provided some insights into matters he has assisted with i.e. the Young Farmers, and with other matters with Dartmoor National Park. There were some amusing tales. The Chairman indicated how much the parish council appreciates all the time and effort that Cllr Coren has put into this parish council.
- 6. To receive a report from Councillor Letch (DCC) for information only: Cllr Letch indicated that he is on the children's committee and was pleased to report that the renumeration and appointments board has made two appointments, deputy director of children's services and the head of children's social care, they hope to be appointing a director of children's services this month. Cllr Letch also mentioned:
  - £9m allocated to repairing potholes, which have increased by around 30% in a year.
  - Mobile library service to be discontinued. Perhaps funding could be moved to libraries with local volunteers
    providing a service.
  - School attendance is below national levels, although Ofsted have given a rating of 87% Good or Outstanding to our schools.
  - Cllr Letch is now part of Bridges, to help to prevent children being taken into care. Last year's figures show 85% of supported children are still in their homes.
  - The £2 bus fare is to be kept until June, with DCC receiving £14m towards bus services.

#### 7. Matters arising, these will be moved to future agendas:

- a) Civility and respect project to consider and/or adopt the guidelines the chairman indicated this was about signing up to a pledge on the civility and respect project. As no one had any experience on this, the chair indicated that this should go on the May agenda as a training program is required for this. So further information and/or training will be required. There is a standard code of conduct within the details.
- b) Update on the speed signs to receive a report Cllr Marshall (currently away) has informed the chair of his current activities which include conversations with Whitestone Parish Council about their mobile speed signs. Cllr Marshall has been informed that it is unlikely permission would be allowed to mount these on lamp posts, therefore the council will have to consider battery powered devices. Cllr Ball mentioned (after speaking with Tedburn) that unless there are any safety concerns raised, then there can be no objection to putting speed signs up, he will liaise with Cllr Marshall over the conversations he has had with Tedburn. Mention has been made of putting sign on verges.

#### 8. Mid Devon District Council Planning Applications:

Reference: 23/00378 and LBC 23/00380 (Standard and Listed Building applications for same site). A full and robust discussion was held on the details of this application. Including the siting of the prefab building. After discussion, it was agreed that the Council would oppose the application on the following basis:

- 1. That approval would create an unwelcome precedent as it appears that the proposed new location is outside the residential curtilage of Gorwyn House and on agricultural land.
- That there was no condition of use only as ancillary accommodation in the original approval in the garden location, but if MDDC is minded to approve a more distant location from the House this condition should be applied.

#### 9. Mid Devon District Council Planning Applications – refused/withdrawn/approved:

Reference: 23/00018/HOUSE is approved. One of the conditions placed by the council concerned the ecological situation. Therefore any demolition work had to be carried out by hand held tools.

Reference: 23/00042/HOUSE is withdrawn. West Down Cottage, the Chair indicated that they have been advised to re-apply.

Reference: 23/00020/LBC is approved.

- 10. ### County Councillor's Report

We are moving towards the May elections, I would like to remind you that in order to vote you will need photo identity. You can use your passport, driving licence or your over 65s bus pass. If you have none of these it is possible to get a photo identity form by going online to www.gov.uk and follow the instructions for downloading a photo ID form.

Unfortunately, you do need to do this online and you will need a photograph that you have on your device.

The other alternative is to apply to Mid Devon District Council's electoral services on **01884 234318** for a postal vote. This has two advantages, the first is that you do not need a photo ID and the second is that when you have the forms through you will have a two-week window in which to vote. In order to facilitate this I shall be bringing some postal vote forms with me to my surgeries.

I started my surgeries in March and will keep to the dates I used last year, namely the 1st Saturday of the month at Crediton, the 2nd Saturday to Cheriton Bishop at 10am and Yeoford at 11am, the 3rd Saturday at Copplestone and the 4th Saturday in Bow village hall. If you cannot get to my surgeries, do remember you can contact me by e-mail.

I have attended one interesting and important meeting which was highways. There is a programme of road repairs which is undertaken in Summer by 16 gangs but in Winter this number is augmented by contractors to 40. There is a new idea that when inspectors go out to look at potholes that are on the system they will also mark up any nearby that they think need repair!

During the meeting I did raise the question of road signs indicating road ahead closed. If it is an emergency, we will have no warning as repairs have to be done there and then. I did raise a question about going along the A377 and finding signs on the road that give you the impression that you are on the road that will be closed ahead but often it is a road off to the side. We are pushed for signs with a 90 degree line to indicate a side road closure.

I am sure many of you breathed a sigh of relief at the halting of the increase in car park charges. Our petitions and arguments help sway the change of heart!
