Bunnyhomes, Church Lane

Twenty-four new homes will be built by developer Bunnyhomes on land off Church Lane in Cheriton Bishop. The plan was unanimously approved by Mid Devon District Council's planning committee.

Seven of the 24 homes will be classed as 'affordable' with one plot set aside for selfbuilders. Properties range from one-bed flats to four-bedroom homes. The development will include a total of sixty parking spaces, while each property will have an air source heat pump and electric vehicle charging point. The plan was supported by the village parish council.

Recommending approval, the planning officer's report concluded the development will have 'no adverse impact on local flood risk, ecology, archaeology, surrounding character, residential amenity and highway safety.' Members of the committee agreed, approving the application unanimously subject to a number of conditions.

I have asked Bunnyhomes for an update on this development and hope to get some information regarding when work will begin on site. Watch this space...

Neighbourhood Watch

Community Speed Watch

This is now up and running in Cheriton Bishop. Six C B volunteers have now completed their training and will be in action at approved police sites around the village. These volunteers will be monitoring vehicle speeds within statutory speed limits and will be wearing high visibility jackets. Action is likely to be at different times during the week and at weekends. Drivers should take note and keep their speed below the designated speed limit. At the time of the check, vehicles above the speed limit will be recorded and repeat offenders or excessive speeds will likely receive a communication from the police.

Walking on Lanes & Roads

At the present time everything is growing so very fast in hedges and from the banking on each side of the lanes. This is tending to reduce road and lane widths and with Cow Parsley hanging or leaning out further reducing the width even more to walk upon. When foliage gets wet through rain or becomes older it tends to lean out even further. Therefore everyone walking should take extra care and especially when accompanying children to and from school. Drivers should take extra care, drive at a safe speed the road conditions allow, keep within the speed limit or at a reduced speed and expect the unexpected.

Open Spaces Visits

Everyone should remember that when going out and walking in the countryside, that all land is owned by someone. By not taking care of access to land can have a significant impact on landowners, farmers, their livestock, birds nesting and wildlife. We should all comply with the 'Countryside Code' to protect the landscape so that everyone can enjoy it.

Take note of local signs and farmers information signs, respect wildlife and any livestock, keep dogs on a lead to protect livestock such as sheep and ground nesting birds.

Scams Going Around

PayPal: These scams are usually carried out through fake emails or links to fake PayPal sites that ask for personal payment details. Remember that the real PayPal only sends out payment notifications, receipts and for promotional purposes and addresses you by name. Always verify the authenticity of each email and transaction before sharing personal or financial information.

Make sure you: Check for spelling errors. Be sceptical about the email. Don't click on links in emails. Don't use delivery services that are not familiar to you. Don't share personal information. Use PayPal's 'Sellers Protection Programme'

NatWest Phishing Scam: Scams impersonating NatWest are trying to get people to hand over their personal bank details. Emails will attempt to deceive customers into entering their login information onto the scammers website posing as NatWest.

These dodgy emails have some giveaways: the email does not come from an official NatWest account (ending @natwest.com.) Scam accounts may come from an address ending; @natwestsecure.com. The email begins with 'Dear Customer' rather than by naming the customer directly as NatWest will do. Delete the email and contact your bank.

Amazon: There seems to be a growing threat of Amazon impersonation scams. Amazon recommends that the following tips will help to spot and avoid phishing calls and messages: Amazon will never ask you to install anything on your mobile phone or computer. They will never ask for payment information over the phone. Don't be rushed as scammers may try this tactic. Lastly, Amazon says that it will not call, text or email you about orders you aren't expecting.

Filling in the correct form, with all information and facts, will enable the police to take action more quickly.

NEDCare Comes to the Rescue!

A NEDCare carer recently came to the rescue of an elderly person who uses their services when she turned up for a visit to find a smartly dressed man just leaving the house. She was informed this was a sales representative from a supposed building firm who had left with a cheque for £3,950 for imaginary foam insulation removal.

NEDCare's employee immediately raised the alarm to family members, the cheque was cancelled and the cheque book hidden. A family member expressed their gratitude to NEDCare: "many thanks to you all (for) going above and beyond to help Mum and myself out."

This was an example of how the charity's carers go the extra mile to help the people they serve, and how their visits often provide a vital lifeline. As part of the service, they also cooperate with the NHS community nursing team to remedy health and safety issues at home, thus preventing more serious illness or injury, freeing up valuable hospital beds and enabling people to remain in their own homes.

NEDCare's regulated care services are vital in our rural communities to support people who wish to remain in their own homes. Currently, over 65% of NEDCare's visit hours are to local authority funded residents who would not otherwise be able to afford their own care, fulfilling their charitable purpose to care for all those who need it, regardless of their financial situation.

NEDCare is delighted to say that following difficulties last summer they have been getting back up to strength in the past few months. The community-owned, not-for-profit charity has grown back to providing almost 1,000 hours of care per month thanks to the determination of their staff and partnership support via Karrek Community CIC.

News from the Moor

It feels like summer is just around the corner and there are so many lovely sights and sounds to enjoy.

At Lydford Gorge, now is the perfect time for a hike along the most captivating section of the River Lyd, while escaping the crowds. The full Lydford Gorge trail has now reopened. This challenging 3-mile circular walk is well worth the effort; it's like exploring an ancient world full of water and life. There's also the option of one of the shorter walking trails to experience the raging Devil's Cauldron or towering Whitelady Waterfall.

Back in October 2022 we had to close the main riverside trail to do some major repair work on a section of the river path that had started to sink. The ranger team have been shoring up the path by building a new log revetment made from tree trunks sourced from tree safety work in the gorge. It has been a lengthy process due to the restrictive access; the path is narrow with steep slopes either side, and 400m from the nearest vehicle access point. The rangers have used hand-powered winches to move the heavy logs, which have then been pinned in place. They will be checking this section on a weekly basis, alongside their usual safety checks around the gorge, to make sure the path is settling in correctly.

At Castle Drogo, we are celebrating Bees in the garden. There is a lovely display in the Luncheon House with plenty of bee related facts and you can do a bit of bee spotting too. There is also a fascinating display in the Nursery rooms with some items which have never been on display before which belonged to Mary Drewe. Please pop in to find out more – the photos of the family dogs are a must for any dog lovers out there. Trusty the Old English Sheepdog is my favourite.

Finally, the guided tours at Finch are going really well with refreshed displays in the gallery and Carpenters shop. The running of the machinery is always a favourite with visitors and is a full sensory experience. The garden is looking beautiful too and, in late September, will be the location for a pop-up exhibition by local artists. Donations in the second hand bookshop have gone really well so thank you to everyone who has supported.

Citizen's Advice

"I've just had my bathroom re-tiled but I'm not happy with the work. At first, things seemed to be going well then the tradesperson left to do another job and I had to chase them for updates. They eventually came back and finished the job, but it was pretty rough around the edges. They also left all the old tiles and plaster for me to dispose of which I wasn't expecting. I've been invoiced, but I don't think the price reflects the work done or the service I got. Can I challenge this?"

You mention that the job 'looked rough around the edges'; if this is to a degree you consider the job unfinished or unsafe, you should be able to get the tiler to come back to fix it and also suggest removing the old tiles be considered part of finishing the job.

You are protected by the Consumer Rights Act 2015, which says that work should be completed 'with reasonable care and skill.' If they haven't done this, they've broken the law. The Act means you're legally entitled to ask the tiler to fix the problem (if they provided the tiles as well as the service), or get money refunded (if they just provided the service and you bought the tiles).

They should fix the problem or refund you in a reasonable amount of time without causing too much inconvenience.

As you've received the invoice for the work but not paid yet, now would be a good time to ask them to fix the issue or negotiate a lower price for the work.

Let the tiler know you understand what you're entitled to. Speak to them or contact them in writing by letter or email.

There are template letters on the Citizens Advice website, *www.citizensadvice.org.uk* /consumer/templateletters/letters/#sec 55337

Make sure you have a written copy of anything agreed. Before you contact them it's a good idea to take photographs to use as evidence of the problem. Make notes about what happened, including dates and times. Also gather any paperwork and receipts – was there any prior written agreement about who would dispose of the old tiles? Was the final cost in line with estimates or quotes given to you at the outset of the work? If not, further advice is available on the Citizens Advice website or you could contact us using our free, local AdviceLine **0808 27 87 999**.

Alternatively, you can log on to our local website, *www.ruraldevoncab.org.uk* and click on 'Get Advice'.

If, despite all efforts, you are still struggling to come to an agreement with the tiler, there are other steps you can take to solve your problem including 'alternative dispute resolution'. In the Garden

Gardening in June

Hardy annuals, such as calendula, can be sown now to fill any gaps.

Spring flowering perennials, such as hardy geraniums and hellebores, can be cut back to ground level. Oriental poppies can also be given this treatment and they should all regrow fresh foliage. Flowering shrubs such as deutzia, kolkwitzia and wiegela, can be pruned when they have finished flowering. Cut up to one third of the older stems right back to the ground, rather than cutting off the ends of branches. Bulb foliage can be cut back now that goodness from the plant has gone back into the bulb. Lift and divide any bulbs that you want to.

Hoe paths when it is hot rather than using chemicals.

Water well but less often to encourage roots to go deeper into the soil.



Dog Fouling in the Village

While most dog owners are caring and responsible, there are still some people who do not clean up after their pets. Anyone who fails to clear up after their dog can be issued with a £100 Fixed Penalty Notice. If the case goes to court this could cost the person in charge of the animal up to £1,000.

Being unaware a dog has fouled or not having a suitable bag is not an excuse

Listen to Your Body

I'd like to share an analogy with you which many people I know have found interesting and thought provoking.

Think of your car. Have you ever got in your car, started the engine, and seen that the dreaded warning light has appeared on the dashboard?

The car works perfectly well most of the time (which we often take for granted!) yet now we must find the time to get this issue sorted. So, what are our options? We could cover the warning light up with some tape, ignore it and carry on as normal? Or we could take the car to the garage to get it checked by a mechanic?

Most people would do the latter. The warning light is clearly telling us that there is an issue with the car, so we should get it sorted before the issue gets worse.

Our bodies, too, have an internal warning system for many different eventualities. We have all at some point experienced: stress, overwhelming, pain, discomfort, suffering, anxiety, and other such feelings. This is usually the body sending us a message that there is an issue internally or in our external environment.

Sometimes, it may be our only option to cover up the pain, and other things we feel, just to be able to continue with our day. However, like covering the car warning light, covering the pain so we can't feel it anymore, doesn't fix the issue the pain is warning us about...

So, I encourage you to listen to the messages your body sends you, contemplate the reasons why your body may be warning you and take positive action.

All those 'niggles' and 'twinges' are an important reminder that our bodies are not out to get us but are, reassuringly, trying to guide us towards health and happiness.

Message from St Mary's

Busy Times

The middle of June will be a busy time in the calendar. It will be the first official birthday of King Charles III on 17th June which is marked by the Trooping the Colour at Horse Guards Parade in London. (King Charles's other birthday is on 14th November when he will celebrate his 75th birthday).

The same weekend is also Father's Day on Sunday 18th June which is always on the third Sunday.

Then, that same week we have the Summer Solstice on Wednesday the 21st at 3.57 pm. However, while most people consider the summer solstice to be a day, it is in reality an exact moment in time. At this moment the earth is most tilted towards the Sun which gives you the longest day of the year.

In Devon, the sun rises at 5.02 am and sets at 9.32 pm giving an impressive sixteen and half hours of daylight. The slightly saddening fact is that by the end of June, we have already lost nearly four minutes of daylight, and the nights are growing longer. However, summer is only just beginning and we hope for the heat of the Sun to bring warm sunny days in July and August. What the clouds and rains do might make a quite different picture to that which we had hoped for!

I suspect that you might have noticed that life is not evenly spaced and carefully ordered.

It often feels like things come together at the most inconvenient time.

A lot of people believe in the rule of three.

When two things happen, there is an expectation that a third is about to happen. I do not think there is any evidence for this to be true, it is just when we notice three things happening we recognise it as a triplet. It becomes more memorable than a single event or double event. It is interesting to note how much we forget and discard and how we selectively remember significant things.

Memory is formed by what impacts us and how we see the world and so is unique to us.

You must remember arguing about the same event because two different people see it from an entirely different perspective. It can be infuriating when someone did not see the same event the way that you did.

We know from DNA that each one of us is unique, we are not all the same and we know that our memories are part of that uniqueness.

For me, it speaks of a God of infinite possibilities and the real wonder of creation. The more we discover about our world the more we realise that there is so much more to learn about it.

If we know there is so much that is unique about our world, we should want to celebrate the amazing diversity we find in people and our world.

It often feels safer to be in a world conforming to the way we want it to be. We discover that we are just a small part of it and are called to share it with other people. We want future generations to be able to experience the rich diversity of our world.

We really need the help of a few more volunteer councillors. No need to make an instant decision – have a chat with me or any other councillor. We will be happy to tell you more about what's involved and answer any of your questions.

County Councillor's Report

With striking nurses, doctors, teachers and railway workers it feels as if our society is undergoing a social earthquake! This coupled with international news of wars in several countries makes listening to the news a rather depressing pastime.

So let's get on with things Devon!

There was some consternation when we heard that Go Devon Bus routes 315/345/377 were being discontinued after June. I contacted the portfolio holder in Devon County and was assured that officers are in negotiations with other bus companies and the routes will be maintained. We also learnt that Devon County has been awarded a £14 million grant from central government for improvement of rural buses over the next three years. The county had asked for £100 million! A £2 single journey fare will continue until June and there are negotiations to see if it can be extended. Let us hope so because it has been very popular.

I was at a meeting which touched on the library service. One thing we all know is that libraries are just not places for borrowing books, they have a big social impact. One sad comment was that four mobile libraries in the county are very old vehicles which often break down and cost a lot to repair. You will not be surprised when I tell you that officers are looking at scrapping the service which could save half a million pounds. I proposed that the money saved should be reallocated to those libraries whose volunteers carry out a home visiting service. We have an excellent one in Crediton. Two weeks ago I met a group of children and young adult carers. I was amazed to learn that in Devon we have 2,500 children or young adult carers. They look after parents, other family members or siblings. Some of them have very responsible roles and are in charge of medication and even giving a parent a daily injection. They are well trained but they did say that they didn't always feel supported and so we are looking into this because they form an essential part of keeping people safe.

I have been fighting the usual battle of potholes and can confirm that £50k has been set aside for the road surface on the A3072 in Bow! Quite how far that the amount of money will go I do not know, locals think not very far. I've also had to report faulty street lights in Bow and Copplestone and been pleased to be told they will fixed as soon as possible. It is probably not quite as pressing in the summer but winter is just four or five months away and they are very important for local people's safety.

I attended a very interesting and complicated meeting about the use of technology by the NHS. We were shown how it will make appointments much easier and give patients a much better access to the service. We were all concerned however about those people who do not have Internet, computers or who might struggle to cope with apps and things of that sort.
