
Gardening Club Village Show

What would I be coming along to?



Neighbourhood Watch

Lovely Weather

We hope that you have stayed safe whilst in the sun by wearing a hat, using sunscreen and keeping hydrated by drinking plenty of water. The maximum temperature is usually between 11am and 3pm. Moving to a shady area, wearing light fitting clothing and taking cool showers will help you feel better. In your home, having air moving through and closing curtains during the day will help to reduce the heat. Take care if you are vulnerable and look out for others that are most at risk. Remember, closed parked vehicles can be very hot inside.

Summer

Having said all of the above about trying to stay cool, it is one of those times when windows and doors are left open. Do think about the opportunity that this offers a burglar. Remember to always lock external doors and secure and lock windows especially on the ground floor. Make sure access to your garden is difficult for example, remove wheelie bins from being used as a way to get over a fence to access a rear garden.

TV Licence

We have been warned that there is an email going around which leads you to think your TV licence may not be automatically renewed. It prompts you to click on a link to renew which is very likely then to request you to provide further information. If you receive such an email its likely to be a scam.

Doorstep Scam

This type of scam is very much alive especially at this time of year. These people turn up at your door out of the blue, with the intention of either tricking you out of money or gaining access to your property. It can be difficult to tell the difference between a genuine doorstep seller and a scammer. A scammer will try to get you to sign a document or buy something that you do not want or need. If you have any suspicions of any one who shows up uninvited at your door, tell them that you are not interested. If you feel intimidated or in danger at any point, contact your neighbour and also call the police **999** or **101**.

Covid-19

If you get report a positive test result after 27th June, you will no longer be automatically contacted by the NHS about any treatments now available. Instead you should contact your GP surgery, NHS **111** or hospital specialist (if you have one) so that they can refer an assessment on you for treatment to reduce the chance of getting seriously ill.

Community Speed Watch

Cheriton Bishop Community Speed Watch has two teams in action – you may have noticed them when in the village. Vehicle speed is being checked in 20, 30 and 40 mph road restriction areas in the village. Checks are being carried out at various times of the day and also at weekends. The aim is to make all road users safe and to encourage drivers to keep within the speed limit or lower. The grim facts show that if a vehicle hits someone at 30 mph or below, they are likely to survive. At 35 mph, a person is not likely to survive, and at 40 mph, it will be a fatality. Therefore, please keep within speed limits when out driving anywhere and certainly at a lower speed where necessary.

Livestock Worrying

The police have reporting an increase in 'worrying' and are reminding the public to keep dogs on leads when visiting open spaces. It is a criminal offence when a dog attacks or chases livestock. This can have a devastating impact on the animals, farmers and the dog and its owner. On land designated as 'access land' a dog must be on a lead between 1st March and 31st July, and at all times when livestock are present and or to protect ground nesting birds.

Antisocial Behaviour Awareness



It's That Time of Year...

"We've booked a package holiday to Spain. It's our first time booking this sort of getaway and a friend recently had a terrible experience when things went wrong on a similar trip. What sort of help is available if something does go wrong?"

Firstly, tell the company or travel agent you booked with as soon as possible so you're more likely to be able to get it sorted quicker. If you wait until you get home, you might get less or no compensation at all.

If the holiday you went on turned out to be lower in value than the one you originally booked you can make a claim for 'loss of value.' Eg. you paid for a deluxe room but only got a standard one. If it wasn't sorted out at the time, you can claim back the difference.

You can also claim compensation for any extra money you have to spend while away – eg. the beach was a bus ride away from the hotel, not across the road as advertised. This is 'claiming for out- of-pocket expenses' but make sure you keep all your receipts.

If big parts of the trip you booked didn't happen or services weren't provided, eg. a planned two day excursion was cancelled and no alternative was organised, you can make a claim for 'loss of enjoyment.' You can also make this claim if something happens that causes distress or disappointment - like the pool was closed the whole time. There are no strict guidelines on how much you can claim for loss of enjoyment but any claim you make must be reasonable. You can't get compensation if you simply did not enjoy the holiday or if the problem was outside the control of the holiday company such as bad weather.

Check the information you received when you made the booking to see what you're supposed to get. If you don't get the service you've been promised you may be entitled to compensation for breach of contract. You might also be able to claim from your travel insurance – check if your policy covers this.

In the Garden

The Summer Garden

Watering plants and keeping bird baths full is an essential part of summer gardening. If you have bare soil then try and mulch it



after you have watered to retain the moisture for longer. If you are planting new plants, it is best to dig a hole, fill it with water and then put the plant into it, covering the surface over with some dry soil.

The summer is probably the time when we use & enjoy our gardens most.

Keep the level of ponds filled up, preferably with rain water, but if that has all been used up, then add tap water gradually in small amounts. Pond plants can easily take over in warm weather so keep them under control but always leave them on the edge of the pond for a few days until any pond life has returned to the water.

The borders should be full of flowers and the vegetable garden ripe and ready for harvesting. Lift potatoes and pull up

onions & garlic. Leave onions & garlic to dry in the sun before storing them in a dry place.

Pinch out runner beans when they reach the top of their supports. Start to remove tomato foliage to allow the fruits to ripen.

Harvest herbs whilst they are luxuriant and full of flavour. Traditionally, they were hung in the kitchen to dry gradually. You can also freeze them to keep that fresh summer flavour. Your house plants will enjoy a holiday outside, especially if you are going away. They will probably be happiest all together and that makes watering easier too.



Keep on picking sweet peas to encourage them to flower more, and enjoy their wonderful scent in the house. Trim lavender to keep your bushes neat when they have finished flowering. If rambling roses need to be controlled, they can be pruned after flowering. Wisteria can be pruned back to about 6 buds from the main stem.

Enjoy being able to spend time in your garden on warm evenings!

By August there may be some seeds that you want to collect. Take cuttings of tender perennials such as fuchsias and pelargoniums to make good sized plants for next year.

As a child, I always remember the unfairness of being stuck in school when it was really hot, and then it raining hard in the summer holidays. I am more of an occasional camper than a dedicated camper. I remember more wet holidays than dry ones!

My theory is that when you camp you can avoid the damp for only a certain amount of time. Once everything is soggy it is time to go home. The more rain you have, the sooner you get to that point where you are forced to give up. When the sun shines and everything is dry camping can be great fun. It certainly feels like these times were in the minority!

I wonder what plans you have for the summer and how much the weather will affect what you can and cannot do.

One explanation is that as the sea warms up that generates more rain so logically there is more rain in late summer and early autumn. It is likely with global warming this will only get worse.

Devon County Council

County Councillor's Report

Chairs have been chosen for the councils and committees. In Devon County Council we welcomed Percy Prowse as the new chairman. He is a County Councillor from the Pennsylvania area of Exeter. He is a retired policeman and a very engaging man to talk to. For his year as Chairman he will focus on young people, youth development, education and children in care.

At the county's annual meeting it was comforting to learn that I'm not the only councillor who is hounded by residents who are naturally annoyed at the state of the roads. It seems that potholes are everywhere in Devon. As a consequence of this a question was asked about damage claims. This year up there were 286 damage claims which cost the county £9133!

The question of 20 mph speed limits was also raised. Six areas in the county now have these restrictions in place and the council is using £150,000 in order to look at a further survey throughout the County. They want to consider the effectiveness of introducing the 20 mph scheme on driver behaviour because it does cost money.

There were also great changes at town and district level with elections in May.

Mid Devon District Council saw the greatest change where the Liberal Democrats gained 33 of the 42 seats and so now have a very large majority. As a result of this I was elected chairman of Mid Devon District Council. I am naturally delighted to have been elected to the position and have already produced a sort of 'Chairman's manifesto' where I hope to promote the profile of mid Devon.

The low turnout for the local elections seemed to show public apathy and lack of interest in what goes on at parish, town and district level.

People seem to forget that councillors decide on how to spend the council taxes paid for by residents. As chairman I hope to do something about this. I aim to talk to as many local community groups as possible and to go into local schools, both primary & secondary. We must remember that the young people in secondary schools will soon be able to vote and so I want them to be aware of this responsibility and to use the power of their vote, a right that has been achieved with many painful protests in the distant past.

If you have any contact with clubs, community groups or schools and think that they would benefit from a talk about my 'Chairman's manifesto' then do please contact me.
