Update on Local Allotments

As a number of local residents have expressed an interest in the provision of allotments, your Parish Council has a statutory responsibility to do it's best to ensure they can be provided. We've hit an administrative barrier at present, but are hopeful that a solution can be found. Here's the current situation:

When MDDC planning department was asked to check if the likely approach of the Parish Council leasing a small area of farmland for a self-managed allotment group, one unexpected issue was raised as below:

"As the allotments would be classed as agricultural (as previously mentioned that there would be no change of use), it is very likely that if individual allotment holders wanted to erect their own shed, then we would require full planning applications"

The planning applications referred to would be for buildings not more than 465 square metres and would cost each allotment holder £96. To our knowledge, no allotment holder in the Tedburn allotments (using the same approach) has ever been required to make a planning application to put a shed for tools, etc, on site and such sheds are required to be temporary structures (no foundation or services), of less than 10 square metres.

Aside from the cost and paperwork required from each allotment holder if this was applied, there is also the problem that – unless we knew that planning permission was guaranteed to be granted – the project could not proceed to leasing the land.

We have requested a meeting with Planning to try to find a solution, but received no response – although we have been informed that the Parish Council can pay £290 for pre-application advice! We are escalating the issue through our Ward Councillors on MDDC and we hope that common sense will prevail.

Some of these issues need time outside the meetings and councillors can volunteer to

Jamboree Diary

I have now returned from the huge trip that was the World Scout Jamboree in South Korea. I just want to say that what was reported on the news, that some of you might have seen, wasn't wrong but for my unit and me, it wasn't so bad, but more of that later. The trip started with trying to get 36 young people and 4 leaders from Exeter services to Seoul via Bristol and Amsterdam airports, luckily, we didn't lose anyone or any bags. We then spent 4 days in Seoul visiting local museums and temples whilst also spotting other units from other countries and acclimatizing to the heat and humidity. The adrenalin really started to build as the days drew near to actually arriving on the campsite. Our arrival on site was then delayed by 1 day due to a monsoon flooding the site.

When we finally arrived on site, the heat really hit us with the lack of shade and lots of work to do putting up tents and preparing dinner before the opening ceremony. Our next few days on site were very relaxed as all our scheduled activities were cancelled due to the heat. This meant we had more time to find and trade badges with other units though it was really too hot to do anything. The conditions on site were rather unpleasant - insufficient toilets that weren't cleaned often enough and too few recycling bins that weren't emptied often enough - and the lack of shade made it ten times worse. We were relatively lucky though, our unit didn't suffer the worst. Only a few of our unit suffered with bad bug bites and heat stroke but they were cured very quickly. After 3 days we were given the news that the UK contingent were no longer going to take part in the World Scout Jamboree due to the poor, non-improving conditions and so the next morning we left to go back to Seoul.

Despite the poor state of the facilities we were all bitterly disappointed to be leaving the campsite, however, looking back on it, it was the right decision as, had we stayed for the full 12 days, with the heat, the toilets, the bins; it would have been unbearable and more of us would have been ill.

Back in Seoul we began what became known as 'Jamboree 2.0' with hastily arranged visits and activities run by the UK contingent. We visited the Olympic Park which had lots of activities dotted around all run by the UK contingent. Whilst we were in Seoul, lots of Koreans spoke to us and gave us free gifts as they felt very embarrassed that the jamboree didn't go to plan. We were given face masks and sweets and general words of support. Though we missed the site, my unit were placed in a 5-star hotel for the rest of the trip, so it wasn't all bad! The Jamboree became more of a cultural trip as we went to night markets, museums and even tried on traditional Korean costumes. A few days after we left, Korea was due to be hit by a typhoon so the whole site was evacuated, a task made easier as they didn't have the whole of the UK, US, Singaporeans and Australians to move too. We spent the rest of our trip searching around Seoul and enjoying the culture across Seoul (I loved the aquarium) culminating in a re planned closing ceremony in the national stadium, with the vast majority of the other Scouts from the Jamboree. When we arrived back at Exeter services it was very emotional, and we are already planning a reunion later this year.

It was an amazing experience, even if not the one we thought and hoped we would have.

And if you ask me if I would like to be involved in another international Scout trip, the answer is where do I sign.

As I close I would like to say a huge thank you to everyone who supported me, whether that was coming to a Big Breakfast, the Book Sale, or my sponsored 11 Tors challenge. Thank you.

Reminiscence Project Enters New Phase

In the Garden

Gather in Your Harvest & Prepare for Winter

October is a busy month in the garden, clearing and planting before the first frosts. Your ponds should be covered with wire before leaves fall into the water. As leaves decompose in the pond they give off gases which are not good for wildlife in the water. Divide pond plants if they have taken up too much of the surface area after a summer of fast growth.

By October you probably want to clear tomatoes out of your greenhouse to leave room for tender plants which need protection. Any unripe tomatoes can be stored in the dark to ripen. If you put a ripe banana with them this speeds up the process due to gases which the banana gives off.

Pick pumpkins and squash, being sure to leave a piece of stalk. Leave them to ripen in the sun and then store in a cool, dark place. Pick and store apples as long as they are undamaged.

Lift dahlia tubers if you are going to, turning them upside down with a section of stalk intact. Otherwise, mulch them in situ and if they are well drained they will probably survive the winter well.

Strawberry plants can be planted out now so that they establish for next season. Make sure new plants are free from virus (visible as streaks in the foliage) and plant them where you haven't grown strawberries before. weather before it grows. Put individual cloves (the bigger the better)into well drained soil 10cms (4") apart, with the tip just below the surface. Autumn onion sets can be planted in a similar fashion.

If you dig up a few roots of mint and parsley, these will happily grow in a pot on your kitchen window sill, giving you fresh herbs throughout the winter. Other more tender herbs, such as basil, can be picked and frozen.

Herbaceous plants can be cut back so that they don't fall over and damage the roots. Now



is a good time to dig and divide perennials if they are outgrowing their space. Lift a clump and using two forks back to back, prise it apart. Often the centre will be growing less vigorously than the outer parts. Discard this and replant (or give away) the healthier portions.

October is a good time to be planting trees, shrubs, hedges and climbers so you will need an outing to your favourite nursery or garden centre!

Focus on Scams

"I need a car for work but can't afford brand new, so I'm looking at second-hand options. I've heard horror stories about people buying faulty vehicles and I don't know much about cars. What do I need to check to make sure I don't buy a dud?"

Firstly, where are you planning to buy the car? If it's from a trader, choose a trustworthy one with an established reputation. Ideally, they will belong to a trade association or at least follow the industry's code of practice. Buying at an auction is much riskier; you'll have fewer legal protections like the right to returns or refunds so read the terms and conditions very carefully before you bid. If you buy from a private seller, try and buy the car at their home address in case anything goes wrong later.

Also, if buying privately, make sure the car's details are correct using the DVLA's free online vehicle information checker. You'll need the registration number, MOT test number, mileage and make and model of the car. You can also check the car's MOT history for free on **gov.uk**. Keep a copy of both these results and the original advert or description of the car. A private history check will show if it has been reported stolen, still has money owing on it, or has been in a serious crash. This costs about £20.

Ideally, inspect the vehicle during the day when it's not raining as scratches are harder to see on a wet car. Take it for a test drive for at least 15 minutes and on different types of road if possible. (Check you have the appropriate insurance for a test drive).

Once you have decided on a car, don't be afraid to negotiate on the price. If you take out a loan or finance, make sure you can afford the payments over the lifetime of the contract. Paying with cash gives you fewer protections than other options.

It may be, despite all this, you still find something wrong with the car after you've bought it. You may have a legal right to a repair, the cost of a repair or some money back but it's on a case-by-case basis; for instance, the car's mileage might be wrong or it keeps breaking down.

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting

Held at Spalding Hall, Cheriton Bishop on Monday 11th September 2023, 7pm

Present: Cllr P O'Neil, Cllr Roger Marshall, Cllr Paul Mitchell, Cllr Toby Ball and five members of the public.

1. To receive and accept apologies. Mid Devon District (MDDC) Cllr F. Letch (another appointment), MDDC Cllr M Binks (another appointment).

2. To receive Declarations of Interest. None.

3. Public Discussion: A member of the public asked if there are plans to refurbish the Memorial Area in the centre of the village. The Chair and Cllr Ball explained that there is a project to improve the area and once an assessment had been made of requirements, suggestions would be available for public discussion. A member of the public suggested the school should be involved in designing the improvements. Concern was also expressed that the area around 'The Triangle' warrants some attention. COUNCIL WILL CONSIDER INCLUDING 'THE TRIANGLE' IN THE MEMORIAL CROSS AREA IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT.

Members of the public also expressed concern that the Woodleigh roundabout was looking unkempt. This had previously benefited from work sponsored by a local business. However, as this input may not continue, the council agreed to assess who will keep the roundabout tidy in the future. - 6. To receive a report from Devon County Councillor Letch (DCC). A copy has previously been circulated to councillors. Noted.
- 7. Mid Devon District Council Planning Applications to consider the following applications upon which the Council has been asked to comment.

Reference: 23/01330/FULL

Proposal: Removal of condition 4 of planning permission 16/00668/FULL (Erection of 2 holiday cottages following demolition of existing agricultural buildings) to allow use as permanent dwelling.

Location: Land and Buildings at NGR 274687 94504 (South Pitton Farm) Cheriton Bishop, Devon.

Condition 4 approves the cottages for holiday occupation. Removal grants the right for the buildings to become permanent residences. A member of the public pointed out that they had observed that the buildings in question currently do not seem to be used for holiday occupancy.

Following a discussion, the parish council did not object to the application in principle but asks the County Council to take into the account the pressure this may put on infrastructure, particularly, schools, doctor's surgery and water / sewage. The parish council also noted that the cottages do not seem to have gardens and are, consequently, more suitable for holiday occupancy. The parish council would also like MDDC to consider buildings with full residency may be better offered to local people before being sold on the open market. The parish council neither supports nor objects to the application but strongly recommends the District Council take their observations into consideration before making their decision.

Following a discussion, the parish council concluded that the five houses look like a small and pleasant development. Again, could this development be considered for affordable housing for local buyers? The Chair reported that people in the area were concerned about the number of houses being built in the village but felt the development to be an improvement on current condition of the site. Given the size of the development, the

council recommends that MDDC considers levying a contribution to local facilities and infrastructure. In conclusion the parish council neither supports nor objects to the application but asks MDDC to take its comments into consideration when considering the application. In addition, two further applications were received during August.

23/01129/ Demolition of barns and erection of 3 dwellings following grant of Class Q Prior Approval (20/01161/ PNCOU) Location: Land and Buildings at NGR 274761 94383 Pitton Barton Cheriton Bishop. The consultation deadline could not be extended to accommodate meeting dates.

23/01036/HOUSE Erection of single storey rear extension Location: Southcombe, Cheriton Bishop Exeter Site Vicinity Grid Ref: 275349 / 93661.

Both applications required minimal input, the first because the parish council will be part of the consultation process if, and when, the full application is presented and the second as the application is low impact on the village and its environs. Both noted at the September meeting for information but without comment.

Planning Decisions: Retention of extension to building with B8 use class including subdivision to create third unit Location: Land at NGR 274175 93696 Thorne Cross Farm Cheriton Bishop Devon Site Vicinity Grid Ref: 274149/93711. Granted by Mid Devon District Council.

Planning Decision – Mid Devon District Council granted permission for West Down Cottage, Cheriton Bishop for erection of replacement dwelling following demolition of existing dwelling and outbuildings.

8. Casual Vacancies update. The council currently has four vacancies. Mr Ian Cowley confirmed his interest in rejoining the parish council. He explained that he has useful experience in his former career and is keen to put this to use on behalf of the community. The parish council thanked him for his application and his co-option will be an item on the October agenda. CLERK TO INCLUDE CO-OPTION ON OCTOBER AGENDA AND TO ARRANGE NOTICES OF THE OTHER VACANCIES TO BE DISPLAYED IN ADVANCE.

Cllr Mitchell emphasised that Cheriton Bishop is a pleasant and thriving community. Underpinning this are the volunteers who give their time and skills. He urged anyone interested in contributing, either as a volunteer or as a councillor, to contact the parish council. The clerk pointed out that new councillors are offered support as well as formal training through the Devon Association of Local Councils.

- 9. Speed signs update on project. Cllr Marshall reported said the application sits with Devon County Council. This will include an assessment and liaison with Police. This is still ongoing. The County Council is responsible for placing the posts to support the signs, while the parish council meets the costs. Noted.
- 10. Memorial Cross Plans update on project. As discussed during the Open Forum.
- 11. Allotments to consider an outline for meeting the parish council's obligation to respond to interest from the community for providing allotments. There are now ten people in the village who have registered an interest in taking up an allotment. This places an obligation on the parish council to look into making such a provision. However, early investigation has identified a serious barrier. Advice from MDDC Planning is that every allotment would need an individual planning application for placing a shed and each application will be subject to planning charges of nearly £100. Upon further investigation, the Chair has been told that if the parish council wish to talk to MDDC about allotments then there will be a charge of £250. The Chair questioned this approach, particularly the need for individual planning applications. Cllr Ball offered to find out if suitable land was available for allotments. CHAIR TO LOOK INTO THIS FURTHER AND REPORT BACK TO COUNCIL. CLLR BALL TO RESEARCH POTENTIAL SITES.
- **12. Equipment for clerk (laptop and mobile phone) to consider associated costs.** Following a discussion, the council approved the purchase of a new computer and leasing a phone. UNANIMOUS. Approved by a show of hands. CHAIR TO ARRANGE PURCHASE / LEASE.
- 13. Repairs & Maintenance to consider any repairs and maintenance needed for PC assets (including signs). Cllr Marshall agreed to repair the playground surface as the council believes the surface to be out of warranty. There is a repair kit available at a cost of (approx.) £70. The council resolved to support this purchase and the work involved. UNANIMOUS. Approved by a show of hands.
- **14. Confirmation of administrative responsibilities.** To formally note that the Parish Newsletter comes under the aegis of the parish council and the parish council is responsible for the newsletter's financial activity. UNANIMOUS. Approved by a show of hands.

15. Community History – to consider a suggestion from a community member to initiate an archive of community memories; verbal, documented and photographic. The council has received a proposal from a member of the public mooting the idea that the village sets up and stores historical records and documents.

A member of the public stated that they wish to garner support to set up and store historical documents and records for Cheriton Bishop. There is currently no place to store such items. There are things to consider, for example, storage, funding and volunteers. It was mooted that an appropriate time for an exhibition could be organised to coincide with the re-opening of the village hall. It would be of interest to both long standing members of the community as well as newcomers.

Cllr Mitchell made the point that such an archive would require a formal group of people to run it. Cllr Marshall said that he could provide support and pointed out that GDPR would need to be taken into account. Cllr Ball asked if the parish had a suitable building in which to store documents.

The Chair pointed out that the council could provide a statement of its support, the use of the newsletter for publicity and he will look into the possibility of storage at the village hall. However, there needs to be a push for volunteers to be involved. He asked for the proposer of the idea to draft a statement for the newsletter, website and Facebook. THE CHAIR AND THE PROPOSER TO MEET TO DISCUSS FURTHER.

There is another volunteer for the Speedwatch team, bringing the total to 8. Cllr O'Neill reported that at first the Speedwatch Group recorded around 25 speeding vehicles each session but this has dropped considerably and this may be evidence of the success of the group.
- **18. To receive reports from Councillors: for information only.** Cllr Mitchell asked for the reinstatement of the village picnic. The Chair responded that there are requests to hold another 'Bring and Share Tea Party' and combining these two events would be worth considering. The Chair said dates for such an event are to be considered.
- **19.** Correspondence/Clerk's Report: for information only. MDDC informed the clerk that it is conducting a review of polling districts and polling places, the consultation for which officially starts on 2 October 2023, but that at the moment this does not directly affect Cheriton Bishop. As mentioned previously the clerk was unable to establish the warranty for the play area surface. MDDC informed the council that it is erecting signage associated with the Public Spaces Protection Order at Glebelands Play Area.

Take Care

With autumn fast approaching and British Summer Time coming to an end on 29th October, we would like to remind you to be extra careful when walking in the narrow lanes and roads in our area and within the village itself. We should protect ourselves as much as possible by wearing high visibility clothing that can be more easily seen by motorists. *Always walk facing the oncoming traffic*.

Vehicle drivers should take into account road conditions which can have potholes, defective surfaces, leaves, hedge cuttings etc, together with low level sunshine. These are all potential hazards and care is required when driving. Walkers can do their part by being visible due to clothing and walking on the correct side of the road.

Winter Approach

It is important to think about what this means in your home. We all want it to be safe and warm, so here are some reminders:

- Have the boiler checked and serviced so that it is working safely and efficiently.
- Roof spaces are well insulated to keep heat in and expensive energy bills down.
- Insulate pipes, especially those in roof spaces and external taps, to prevent freezing.
- Hang lined, insulated curtains to windows and draft preventers around doors.
- Clean out / repair gutters and rainwater pipes.
- Check that you are on the best energy tariff.
- Check the home insurance policy meets your requirements and is up to date.

Home Security

With the darker nights creeping in, now is a good time to ensure your home is as secure as possible. This especially applies when the property is left unattended for a while.

- Windows and doors closed and locked, sensors activated. The same applies to garages, sheds and outbuildings.
- Inside lights are on a timer or use smart bulbs.
- Home alarms are working and switched on.
- Valuable items are out of sight.
- Keep photographs and written records of items of value, including sentimental value.
- Draw ground floor curtains.
- Leave the radio on for short spells.
- Door keys and car keys are kept out of sight
- Don't leave keys in locks on the inside of the door or window.
- Put exterior lights on a motion sensor.
- Plants and foliage are cut back so as not to provide cover or protection.
- Valuable item packaging to be put out of sight.
- Vehicles locked and valuables removed or locked in the boot.
- Put away items that can be used to break in such as ladders, play equipment etc.
- Inform neighbours that you are going away.

As with all types of crime, prevention is better than cure. Opportunity plays a big role in any burglary.
