



Want to Be a Parish Councillor?

We currently have 5 volunteers from our community who feel that it's a useful role in helping to protect and improve the area that we live in. We have vacancies for 3 more councillors, and these can be filled in a very simple process if more people would like to help us.

We'd particularly welcome enquiries from younger people (minimum age 18) and female volunteers, so that we can represent the community as broadly as possible.

What's involved?

That's a choice for individual councillors. The minimum is to attend 11 monthly meetings, on the 2nd Monday of the month.

In the meetings (which are open to the public), we discuss a wide range of local issues such as development plans, facilities & services, road safety, village events, defibrillators, repairs, allotments....

Improper Battery Disposal Causes Fires

Two incidents took place in one day, serving as a stark reminder of the importance of responsible recycling.

Last month, a small fire broke out in the back of a waste collection vehicle in Bradninch. The driver noticed in his camera system a large amount of smoke billowing out of the hopper at the back of the vehicle. When investigated, a battery was found that had been compacted and caught fire. This was disposed of in a black waste bin rather than recycled correctly.

On the very same day, a second fire broke out, this time at the Council's depot in Willand. Once again, a discarded battery was found to be the cause. The fire occurred whilst the depot team were baling cardboard – they noticed smoke coming from the top of the baler and took swift action to stop production. The bale of cardboard that had caught fire was taken outside and broken down. Crushed batteries were found which had caused them to ignite.

These incidents underline the importance of proper battery disposal. Batteries, especially lithium-ion batteries commonly found in everyday devices, can pose a severe fire hazard when disposed of incorrectly.

Recycling batteries correctly is not only a matter of safety but also a vital environmental responsibility. Batteries contain hazardous materials that can leach into the soil and water if not recycled properly. By ensuring batteries are placed in designated recycling boxes, we contribute to the protection of our environment and reduce the risk of accidents like these fires.

To prevent further incidents, the Council is launching an awareness campaign focused on the proper disposal of batteries. We urge residents to follow these essential guidelines:

- Use designated recycling boxes: General household batteries can be recycled as part of your fortnightly recycling collection - batteries must be placed in a clear plastic bag or tub, and left on top of the black box clearly visible for our collection crews. We do not collect Lithium-Ion batteries.
- Wrap or tape batteries: Used batteries are not always completely discharged. To dispose of the batteries safely, cover the positive terminal of each battery with tape.
- Drop off at recycling centres: When in doubt, consider dropping off batteries at designated recycling centres.
- Educate others: Spread the word about the importance of proper battery disposal to friends, family, and neighbours.

Autumn Wellbeing

We are now deep into autumn; the season of abundance, harvest and change. With the darker, wetter, windier and colder days upon us, summer seems like a distant memory with winter just around the corner.

For me, it feels like the rest of nature is getting ready to hunker down for the next few months, yet for us, we're expected (expectations coming from others and ourselves!) to carry on with our daily routines like there is no change happening around us at all.

The seasonal food we eat has changed, as things that grew in the summer no longer grow; exercising outside becomes trickier and less appealing; and less sunlight exposure changes our body rhythms, cycles, energy levels and chemistry.

It would be ideal if we could adapt our work and home routines to take it easier on ourselves and slow down as we move through autumn, but for most of us that is not practical for many reasons.

However, we can add things into our existing routines to enhance our experience through this season transition.

Try adding things into your life that feel good for you. I'm thinking cosy, snuggly and warm. Think thick socks, hot chocolates, a great novel, a hot water bottle, lovely candles, gatherings with loved ones, feelgood movies, hearty soups, and getting out in the fresh autumn air wrapped up warm.

In the Garden

Deepest Autumn in the Garden

The days are shorter and plants are dying back in the garden. Nevertheless, I always find plenty to do at this time of year. Wet, soggy foliage can be cleared away and brown herbaceous plants cut back. Leave anything that has useful seeds for the birds and plants that provide architectural structure. There will still be areas of bare soil between your structural remains. This is an opportunity to get a good mulch onto the ground to encourage worms to aerate and feed your soil. There is no need to dig as the worms will improve the texture of your soil if you leave them undisturbed.

Terracotta pots will probably need protection over winter if they are too large to bring indoors. Putting them on feet to lift them off the ground is helpful to improve drainage. Plant roots are more vulnerable in pots than they are if buried in the ground. Hessian wraps look attractive but use whatever insulating material you have.

November is the month in which to ideally

plant tulip bulbs. Put plenty of grit or perlite under the bulbs so that they don't rot if it is very wet. It is fun to choose which flowers you want to cheer up Spring days, anticipating warmer lighter days next year.

There will be plenty of leaves to collect now and they should be treated as a valuable resource for the garden. If you stored last year's leaves in bags to rot down into leaf mould, you can tip that out to mulch favoured plants and refill the bag with fresh leaves.

Winter pruning of apple and pear trees can start now, after the leaves have dropped.
Branches can be cut back by up to a third.
Also check for any crossing or rubbing branches and remove these to prevent wounds and diseases. Fruit trees benefit from a layer of organic mulch after pruning.

If you leave Cannas or Dahlias in the soil, a good layer of mulch will help protect them from winter cold.

Message from St Mary's

A Month For Reflection

The month of November is a time when we remember some very significant dates both in the church year and the life of our country.

All Souls' Day

The church remembers all the Saints on the 1st November and all those who died on the 2nd November, also known as All Souls' Day. All Saints' Day is transferred to Sunday 5th November, which coincidentally is also Bonfire Night or Guy Fawkes Night.

There is a strong sense of looking back to the past and remembering the good, those who have loved us and some who got it badly wrong. Remembering the past is a good way to deal with the present, we can gain strength from those who have gone before us.

Remembrance

The National Remembrance is on Saturday 11th November as we remember 11th November 1918 and focus on an act of remembrance for those killed and wounded in the two world wars and military conflicts since the Second World War. This theme is continued onto Remembrance Sunday on the 12th November.

Each year sees significant anniversaries in conflicts around the world. This year marks 70 years since fighting in the Korean War came to an end.

The 27th July was the anniversary of the Armistice in 1953 of what many call 'the Forgotten War'. It was overshadowed by the end of the Second World War and the subsequent 'Cold War', and yet the sacrifice of the Allied Armed Forces was extremely high, and its legacy still has a global impact.

I have to confess to being completely unaware of this anniversary. The division between North and South Korea is still very much an issue even today. The end of November sees the church marking the end of the church year on Sunday 26th November. In essence, our goal is heaven and the month of November reminds us of that lifelong journey to heaven.

It finishes with Jesus as our King in heaven. The company of all the Saints and those who loved us reminds us of two very important things. Firstly, life is a struggle and difficult and we have to keep going in the face of pitfalls and obstacles. Secondly, the bible tells us that we are cheered on by those who have gone before us in the race that is life, Hebrews 12 verse 1:

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us"

We need to remember we are never really alone and we are encouraged to keep going in our journey through life.

I am often encouraged by being able to offer help or receive help from others.

We do not succeed in our own strength entirely, we have to work together for things beyond our grasp. We are interconnected, not isolated, and held by God

1. To receive and accept apologies. MDDC Cllr M Binks (illness), Cllr Chenore (alternate meeting attendance), Cllr R Marshall (away) Approved.

- 2. To receive Declarations of Interest. None
- **3. Public Discussion.** A member of the public raised the issue of the untidiness of the roundabout at Woodleigh Junction. The Chair responded that this is a subject that would be picked up in item later in the meeting when discussing parish council project management.
- **4. Co-option of new councillor.** Ian Cowley was proposed by Cllr P Mitchell and seconded by Cllr T Ball. UNANIMOUS by a show of hands. Cllr Cowley signed a Declaration of Acceptance of Office.
- 5. Cheriton Bishop Parish Council Meeting Minutes Monday 11th September, 2023 to consider the approval of the minutes as a correct record. Approved. UNANIMOUS by a show of hands.
- 6. To receive reports from Mid Devon District (MDDC) Councillors for information only. Cllr Letch updated the meeting on some MDDC issues. To receive a report from MDDC Councillor (DCC) F Letch. Cllr Letch had previously provided his DCC report which was circulated with the agenda.

The Chair asked about supporting parish and town councils applying for 20 mph. The parish council has been asking for this and the Chair asked if permission would now be likely? Chair to send a map of the proposed 20 mph zone in the village to ClIr Letch. CHAIR TO ACTION

7. MDDC Planning Applications – to consider the applications upon which the Council has been asked to comment.

8. Update on setting up of Projects Task Group to facilitate current projects. The Chair suggested that councillors get together to discuss various projects, including the care of the roundabout at Woodleigh Junction. Cllr Cowley said there had previously been a group clearing ditches but this was stopped due to liability of the council. He suspected the War Memorial project could suffer a similar fate. He asked that the parish council make MDDC aware so that support can be gauged before work of this type begins.

A similar problem happened with the Snow Warden Scheme. MDDC Cllr Letch asked the parish council to note that trained Snow Wardens are now allowed to salt pavements and roads. Cllr Mitchell said that when he had worked previously on the War Memorial, he had support from

MDDC. Cllr Letch suggested the council look into Chapter 8 training which is now available and facilitates work involving traffic management. Clerk to contact Rachel Avery regarding a Volunteers Policy. Clerk to report back to council. CLERK TO ACTION

Councillors agreed to meet informally to discuss progress on various projects. Cllr O'Neil to circulate potential dates and the venue to be Cllr Mitchell's home. CHAIR TO ACTION

Cllr Letch to investigate ownership of the land on which the War Memorial stands and report back to the parish council. CLLR LETCH TO ACTION.

- 9. Update on Vehicle Activated Speed Signs (VAS) to receive an update from the VAS task group and agree associated actions. Cllr O'Neil reported that Cllr Marshall has been trying to get permission for the signs and yet there has been no response from Steve Short at DCC. Cllr Marshall has provided all the information requested by DDC. Cllr Letch to look into the reason for the delay in the response from the County Council. The parish council is funding the signs and would like to progress the installation of the signs as soon as possible. Cllr Letch to report back to the council. CLLR LETCH TO ACTION
- 10. Repairs & Maintenance The play area surface has been repaired. The Chair thanked Cllr Marshall for his efforts.

Cllr Letch asked the parish council to let him have a list of roads suitable for 'patching'. This does not involve single potholes but is where the road surface has a stretch of dips, bumps and holes justifying repair of a full strip of road. Cllr Mitchell suggested the road to Crockernwell (Crocky Dip). Cllr Ball suggested part of the old A30. Chair will liaise with Cllr Letch. CHAIR TO ACTION

- 11. Update of potential provision of allotments. Cllr O'Neill was concerned that allotment plots must apply for full planning permission to site huts on individual plots. The planning applications referred to would be for buildings not more than 465 square metres and would cost each allotment holder £96 at least twice their annual rental for sheds no larger than 10 square metres. Cllr Letch would raise the issue with Planning CLLR LETCH TO ACTION. Cllr Letch asked the parish clerk to contact Rachel Avery at MDDC to request a copy of the Allotment Tenants Agreement for information. CLERK TO ACTION.






