

ACORN COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Farmers and Landowners: Land Needed for Community Allotments



Cheriton Bishop Parish Council has agreed to proceed with the Community Allotments project. We are now asking for proposals from local farmers and landowners who would be willing to rent an area of at least one acre for the allotments.

The Council will arrange a contractor – or pay the owner, if preferred – to install a perimeter fence (where needed) and fencing to divide part of the area into plots of around 25m x 5m. A water supply will be required and the Council will meet the costs of extending this to the site from the nearest source, if necessary.

The Council welcomes proposals – and understands that some flexibility may be needed – with the ideal site having the following characteristics:

- Less than 1 mile from the village centre
- Reasonably level (or at least a consistent shallow slope!)
- Reasonably well drained (most of the year)
- Close access to a road, with the potential for bringing vehicles on site in the summer, and possible parking off site close by

The site would be rented and maintained by the Council, with a volunteer committee from allotment holders managing membership, plot rentals and site rules. There would be no permanent buildings erected on site by allotment holders.

Citizen's Advice



Christmas is Coming and the Scammers are at Large!

"I mostly shop online and I'm always looking for a bargain especially at this time of year. However, I'm worried about scammers; what do I look for to avoid getting caught?"

More and more of us are shopping online – it's convenient and can save a lot of time. However, scammers are getting increasingly sophisticated with their tactics which can make them hard to spot. What you can do, though, is take steps to protect yourself.

The golden rule is that if it seems too good to be true it probably is. This goes for products that are 'must haves', are sold out at major retailers or are heavily discounted.

If you're buying from a site you haven't used before, do some research first. See what the company's returns and refunds policy is and look up the company's address which should be displayed on their website and make sure it is a street address and not a PO Box. Read reviews, not just the ones on their website but check out other review sites.

Be wary of people contacting you out of the blue on social media or via text and email and scammers will often ask you to pay in unusual ways like sending money through a transfer service such as MoneyGram or Western Union or even pay via vouchers. They may well put you under pressure to buy quickly; take your own time.

Scammers are clever and sneaky and regularly adapt making them harder to spot. Anyone can get scammed so if you do get caught don't feel embarrassed or ashamed. Rather, get practical; report it either to Citizens Advice www.citizensadvice.org.uk/consumer/scams/reporting-a-scam or to Action Fraud www.police.uk/advice/advice-and-information/fa/fraud/action-fraud/

If you have transferred money within the last 24 hours contact the police on **101** but if you feel unsafe use **999** and don't forget to contact your bank even if more than 24 hours have elapsed.

Here at CA TNMWD we get asked all kinds of questions and get to hear about all kinds of scams amongst other things. If you have a problem and need our help, our local AdviceLine is free; just ring 0808 27 87 999.

Thoughts of Christmas & the New Year

Christmas and New Year are not only times to celebrate, but also to reflect. It is always alarming to note how quickly we seem to go from one year end to another but when you pause to see how much is crammed into that intervening period, it can be quite uplifting.

Not every publication produces a monthly edition so not all the publications that support the CA TNMWD advice columns show each one, however, very soon, they will also be put up on our website so still accessible to all. (www.ruraldevoncab.org.uk)

Our advice columns this year have focussed on a range of topics; shoddy workmanship, employment issues, the risks of being let down on holidays abroad, scams, dealing with cost-of-living issues, the perils and pitfalls of buying second hand vehicles – we have really covered a great deal of ground and it is hoped that sharing this information and sharing the access routes to our services has helped people.

Recognising the huge increase in demand for our services due to the cost-of-living crisis and seeing that the problems people bring to us are increasingly complex as a direct result of this and therefore take more time to explore, advise and resolve, we continue our drive to recruit and train more volunteers. We are always keen to hear from people who would like to volunteer

with us and our trustee board is made up of volunteers too.

Trustees at CA TNMWD play a very active role in the running of the charity, attending four trustee board meetings a year, two strategy days where our strategy in moving the charity forward is discussed, as well as participating in specific working groups such as premises or workforce wellbeing. They also join the local office quarterly team meetings and the whole of organisation team meetings so they are an active bunch but if you would like to join them, we would like to hear from you. The experience of our trustees is very varied which is important in achieving balance in our decision making. Fly Tipping

Here we go again. Some 'don't care individuals' are travelling around presumably during the hours of darkness with vans, tipper trucks or trailers loaded with all kinds of rubbish and dumping illegally on someone's land to save money by not disposing of it properly.

These individuals do not care about the trouble and expense they are causing to the owner of the land where the stuff is dumped. The environment (and certainly not the lovely countryside that makes up Devon) is not on their minds when dumping, only to get rid of their loads.

This happened late in October very close to Cheriton Bishop. An assortment of rubbish containing boarding, plastic trims, guttering, pipes, coffee cups, plus bags of all kinds of rubbish and what was more serious were further bags found to contain asbestos.

All of this was dumped in a field gateway and so became someone else's problem. In this case, the rubbish was dumpted on private land (not on a Local Authority public road or verge), and therefore, the private landowner was responsible for its clearance and required to pay all costs for removal by a specialist company.

As asbestos existed this required further procedures to be followed including to a certified disposal site. The bill reflected this amounting to £550.00 plus VAT

Please Note:

This can happen to any owner of a property when unscrupulous individuals want to get rid of their rubbish and save disposal site fees. There are so many open property entrances around and if not immediately available there are the quiet highways and verges to be taken advantage of.

If you require any rubbish to be taken away from your property, check and see for yourself that the specialist company produces a CBDU 'Carrier Broker Dealer Upper' Licence from the Environment Agency as a registered Waste Carrier which contains their name, registration number and expiry date. If possible, only pay the waste company an initial amount with the final payment when they return with proof that the rubbish has been disposed of correctly and lawfully. This should ensure that the stuff is not now someone else's problem!

Remember that the Local Authority will only remove rubbish dumped on public land.

Storm & Wind Damage

We have had a number of storms and high winds through 2023 and criminals can take advantage of the situation where property damage may have occurred.

Beware of cold callers claiming to be specialist roofers, tree surgeons and other trades people coming around after storms or high winds have been experienced. These are uninvited individuals and call to try to take advantage of the situation if damage is sustained or expected. Often they try to convince the owner there is a problem when in fact there isn't or they can fix the damage quickly at a good rate. Have nothing to do with these people, they are unscrupulous and say "No, I am not interested" Report to Citizens Advice **0808 223 1133**, or the police.

Safety

Always be observant & vigilant and keep your eyes open when out and about. We are all encouraged to report a crime, any suspicious behaviour or vehicles around. It is up to us all to do our part and be on our guard when we are out and about. Report to the police.

In the Garden

The Bare Bones of the Garden

In December the structure of the garden is clearly visible. If there is anything you want to change then this is the time...

The dying herbaceous foliage can be cut back, plants that are taking over can be thinned out, dug out and given away.

If you have beds which have proved difficult to manage because they are too wide, you could perhaps put a wood chip path through them. If you have a chipper you can use prunings from fruit trees and woody shrubs to create a sympathetic path surface. This means you can walk through your plants to reach weeds more easily, without compacting the soil. It is very satisfying to prune, chip and end up with a new path as well.

If you don't have enough evergreen plant material to provide plant structure during the winter, then now is the time to plan what to plant where. Many of our best winter flowering shrubs are scented so it makes sense to plant them near hard paths which you can access easily. Sarcococca and Daphne are both evergreen and very fragrant.



- Continue to mulch the garden whenever possible and clear leaves to make next year's leaf mould.
- Don't forget to insulate your outside taps and pipes before they freeze.
- Feed the birds & make sure they have access to water, especially when it freezes.
- Use a pressure washer on hard surfaces to make sure they don't get slippery in wet weather.

If you don't want to go out and work in a cold wet garden perhaps you could spend some time cleaning and sharpening your tools ready for a warmer, drier day!

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting

Held at Spalding Hall, Cheriton Bishop on Monday 13th November 2023, 7pm

Present: Cllr P O'Neill, Cllr P Mitchell, Cllr T Ball, Cllr I Cowley, Cllr F Letch (DCC), M Binks (MDDC), J Clark (parish clerk) and 4 members of the public.

- 1. To receive and accept apologies: Cllr R Marshall (away) Approved.
- 2. To receive Declarations of Interest: NONE
- **3. Public Discussion:** The applicant for the planning application item 7.2 on the agenda attended and took questions from the council.

A member of Drewsteignton Parish Council attended, to point out that in the 8 parishes close to Cheriton Bishop there was a sizeable amount of financial reserves. They wished to draw the parish council's attention to this so that if a suitable project presented itself, that could benefit all the parishes involved, it may be worth considering a joint venture, if one was identified.

He also updated the parish council on the success of the recent fund-raising efforts for the purchase of the Drewsteignton public house, The Drewe Arms, and that the new landlord will be Simon Saunders.

- 4. Cheriton Bishop Parish Council Meeting Minutes 9th October 2023 to consider the approval of the minutes as a correct record: UNANIMOUS by a show of hands.
- 5. To receive reports from MDDC Councillors for information only: Cllr Binks apologised for his recent absence due to illness. He reported that the recent effort to retain mobile libraries had not been successful due to lack of funding and dilapidated vehicle stock.

Cllr Mitchell suggested alternatives to the travelling library, for example, if the Local Authority could fund hiring village hall for the purpose of books swaps, etc. Cllr Binks responded saying that using local facilities has strong support from MDDC. The majority of village halls are used less than 50% of the time, so, local initiatives would be a good idea although it is unlikely there would be funding at Local Authority level. The Chair said he had heard that the books from the mobile library may be distributed to parish councils.

The Chair asked Cllr Mitchell if he would look into funding for a library in the village hall for hall hire and asked him to do a report. CLLR MITCHELL TO ACTION

MDDC have recently begun a review process of governance in its departments.

6. To receive a report from DCC Cllr F Letch - for information only: A copy had previously been circulated to councillors. Cllr Letch summarised. DCC is currently 50 officers short, putting pressure on those currently working.

All parish councils in his ward are under-represented and co-option can be used to fill these vacancies. Cheriton Bishop currently has three vacancies and this puts more pressure on existing councillors.

It is the time of year when all councils, County, District and Parish, are looking at budgets and planning for 2024-2025. The top tier councils have their council tax capped at 2.99%. As we know inflation is well above that figure and so we can expect some changes in the services provided.

As a member of the children's scrutiny committee and an ex-teacher he is concerned at the level of education in Devon and in particular the overspend in provision for pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). A report on this has been requested.

There are two areas of encouragement. Figures in from the care sector show and improvement in recruitment and the county is retaining the £2 fare cap for buses until December 2024.

7. Mid Devon District Council Planning Applications – to consider the following applications upon which the Council is asked to comment:

7.1 Reference: DCC/3863/2016

Proposal: Variation of Condition 5 of planning permission DCC/3863/2016 to increase the amount of

septic tank waste that can be imported onto and processed at the site in any calendar year

from 1500 tonnes to 4000 tonnes

Location: Old Tellams Yard, Road from Pitton Cross To Hook Farm, Cheriton Bishop.

In the discussion, there was support for the application because it is a local business providing local employment and septic tank waste is a form of recycling with waste going back on the land as an alternative to chemicals, often processed outside the UK. There was also concern about the potential impacts on water quality. Following the discussion, the council resolved to support the application by a vote on the following wording (For 3 and Against 1).

"Cheriton Bishop Parish Council supports this application, with the following observations:

- 1. Given the Environment Agency High Priority status for protection of water quality in our local area, our assumption is that the applicant will carry out an operational review (based on up-to-date mandatory sludge and soil sampling) to ensure that the proposed increased quantity of sludge injection poses no additional risk to water quality in terms of either faecal or PTE (Potentially Toxic Element) contamination.
- 2. If possible, the Parish Council will request a copy of an internal or compliance assessment carried out once the new level of operation is established, as reassurance that the risks above are being managed successfully".

DCC Cllr Letch said there is a new Vehicle Automated Sign in Newton St Cyres. Cllr Binks to provide an update on Newton St Cyres. MDDC CLLR BINKS TO ACTION
- 9. Memorial Cross Plans update on project: Cllr Ball reported that he had checked whether planning permission was required for the planned improvements. However, it was agreed that the planned changes were not of a level that triggered the need for an application. The Chair will arrange to have the plan drawn up and presented to the parish. Following a discussion, the council resolved to carry out the project and to consider the costs as part of the budget round for 2024-2025. UNANIMOUS by a show of hands. COUNCIL TO CONSIDER COSTS AND DISCUSS AT THE DECEMBER MEETING WHEN SETTING THE PRECEPT REQUEST

- 10. Local History Archive Project: The Chair reported that the proposed archive for the village is generating interest. Eco-friendly wrapping paper is made from sustainable recycled materials such as kraft paper, hemp, plant fibres or bamboo. Eco-friendly paper should also be sustainably sourced and recyclable, so it should be free from glitter, foil and toxic dyes.


