

# Doctor Clunie Supports Acorn As He Retires

Huge thanks & congratulations to Dr Clunie, as he retires on 31st May.

Over the (many) years Dr Clunie has raised much needed funds for Acorn.

Below will be a brief history of his slightly off the wall endeavours.

To mark his retirement after 26 years at the practice he will again be raising funds for Acorn by cycling 2360 miles in one go from home to Bari in Southeast Italy.

It all began when Acorn were looking to buy their first minibus back in 2001 and needed to raise a substantial amount of money and Dr Clunie said he would help.

Firstly, he and his long distance running chum Rob Hitchings decided it would be a good thing to run from one side of the Dartmoor National Park boundary to the other. So, in June they did just that, running from Lydford to the Manor Inn, Ashton. In 2002, Dr Clunie decided he would run the London Marathon and completed that in 3 hours 5 minutes.

Both these events and some grant applications enabled Acorn to purchase their very first minibus.

Inevitable knee issues brought his running career to a premature end and so the first of many bicycles was purchased.

In 2008, Dr Clunie persuaded his son Ben, at the tender age of 16 to cycle John O'Groats to Lands End raising money jointly for Acorn and the RNLI. This was duly completed over 10 days, cycling 100 miles a day. In 2014 the two Doctors: Hayter and Clunie thought it a grand idea to cycle 260 miles around the perimeter of Devon, again raising funds for Acorn.

Perhaps the most bonkers endeavour of all, in 2019 Dr Clunie decided to cycle half-way

up Mount Everest, using Bridford Hill as his mountain. It comprised 27 cycles up and 27 cycles down. A total of 4200m of vertical climbing and over 54 miles. Lastly, he did the Acorn cycle of 300 miles in September 2020 over a weekend cycling 152 miles a day.

All of these challenges have raised significant sums that have helped Acorn immeasurably over the years including helping buy and replace two minibuses.

So here we are. The Doc has decided to hang up his stethoscope but not his cycling helmet.

He has generously committed to raising his last tranche of funds for Acorn by cycling from home in Devon to the coastal town, Bari in Southeast Italy via Paris, Geneva, Milan and Rome. He will be accompanied by his good friend, Olaf and the plan is that it should take them 3-4 weeks. There will be several places where you can follow their trip and keep up to date with the Doc's daily blog:

## News from the Moor

I hope that you are all well.

The brief glimpse of Spring seems to have vanished. As I write this, it has been raining for 5 hours. Thank goodness for the daffodils bringing some brightness and joy.



#### **Lydford Gorge Path Closures**

Speaking of the weirdness of the weather, we've had to take proactive action against the effects of climate change at Lydford Gorge. Extended periods of drought followed by heavy rain have taken a toll on the thin soils and steep slopes of the gorge.

It has required increasing costly interventions, in both time and money, to open safely to visitors each year. The path along the river, between Whitelady Waterfall and Pixie Glen, has suffered several significant landslips in recent years and we've made the tough decision to close this part of the route.

#### **New Visitor Trails**

A new operating model started in March with two beautiful feature trails, the Devil's Cauldron trail and the Waterfall trail, available for visitors. The higher path through the woodland, that links the Devil's Cauldron entrance and Waterfall entrance (renamed the Lyd link), and the path to Tucker's Pool will open as two-way routes during quieter times only as these paths are so narrow.

Visitors will still be able to enjoy the temperate rainforest as the trails to the Devil's Cauldron and Whitelady waterfall both have some lovely temperate rainforest habitat. The Devil's Cauldron trail is better to see lower plants like mosses, liverworts and ferns that love the damp and shady environment there. The Waterfall trail is better to see trees and plants, especially wild

flowers in spring, that thrive in the humidity created by the waterfall.

#### **Guided Tours at the Forge**

Finch Foundry re-opened for the new season at the end of March and the team there are eager to share the sights and sounds of the forge with visitors on the guided tours.

Castle Drogo is gearing up for Easter with the usual trails around the grounds and lots to see and do in the castle itself – including trying on a top hat similar to the one Mr Drewe wore!

#### **Volunteer Opportunities**

Finally, our Ranger team in the Teign Valley have a couple of new volunteer opportunities including Volunteer Ranger, Workshop Volunteer and a Trail Inspector role.

If you are interested, or know of anyone that might be, the team have a drop-in event planned on **Tuesday 30th April** for a 'Meet the Team' and 'Task' day. The Ranger team will be in the woods from 10am until 2pm completing some footpath maintenance and woodland aftercare.



# Citizen's Advice



#### Council Tax

Our 'regular' monthly Advice Column focuses on Council Tax and what to do if you cannot afford to pay the increased amount in the forthcoming financial year. (Essentially, it boils down to contacting your local council to see if you are eligible for any discounts – there are a number of options available). However, for our Mid Devon connections, we have some really exciting news that could be of much wider benefit to Mid Devon residents, so we are taking this opportunity to share it with you.

CA TNMWD operates as a charity and whilst we benefit from some local authority funding, we need to supplement this and consequently, we invest a great deal of time and effort applying for grants from a wide range of funding bodies. We were absolutely thrilled, therefore, when we learned that we had been awarded a grant from the National Lottery Community Fund specifically to provide dedicated services in Mid Devon. This project is called Improving Financial Wellbeing and focuses on advising on debt and energy issues as well as income maximisation.

We have a team specifically designated to work in Mid Devon so any inquiries that are

received via our AdviceLine (free and local on 0808 27 87 999) are directed to that team. We have an outreach office in Crediton that people can book their own appointments for (every Wednesday) and the link for that will soon be up on our website and face to face appointments can be arranged elsewhere in Mid Devon on a case by case basis. #### Disruption To Normal Service Between 20th & 30th April

We are in the process of moving over to a new computer system that we use for all your medical records and prescriptions. This is so we can improve our services and bring our systems completely up to date.

#### **Shingles**

Did you know that more than 50,000 cases of shingles occur in the over 70s every year in England and Wales. Symptoms include: rashes or blisters on one side of the body, burning or shooting pain, itching, fever, fatigue or headache, in addition, almost 30% of individuals develop a painful complication called Post Herpetic Neuralgia (PHN).

Generally, this pain continues for 3 to 6 months, but it can last even longer. On average, cases last 3 to 5 weeks.

Most people only get shingles once, but you can get it more than once. The risk of shingles is higher in those with conditions such as diabetes or rheumatoid arthritis.

#### **Pneumococcal Disease**

More than 5,000 cases of IPD Pneumonia are diagnosed each year in England. Pneumonia symptoms include: a high temperature, a cough, shortness of breath, chest pain, an aching body, feeling very tired, loss of appetite or feeling confused (common in older people).

Complications can follow a mild illness and lead to more serious infections. The risk of Pneumococcal disease is greater for adults aged 65 years or older and for those with conditions such as COPD.

# In the Garden

### April's New Shoots & Roots

Well if the rain in March dampened your enthusiasm to get out into the garden, there is still plenty of time in April! The soil should be warming up and seeds will begin to germinate.

Leeks can be sown outside now in a nursery bed. When they grow to 10 cm, they are ready to be transplanted. Keep sowing lettuce, broad beans, peas, radish a few at a time so that you have a good succession of vegetables to harvest at their best during the summer. Thin out the seedlings (these can be used in salads) and keep them watered.

Tender vegetables such as sweetcorn, courgettes and runner beans are better sown at the end of April. These are fast growers and don't want to be emerging before the risk of frost has passed. Tomatoes, peppers and aubergines need a longer growing season so it might be better to buy plants now rather than sowing seeds.

If you do have tomato plants in a greenhouse, keep potting them on and make sure they have plenty of light so that they don't become etiolated. If you want to grow tomatoes outside then you can sow seed now but make sure it is one of the hardier varieties.

Earth up your early potatoes so that you prevent them going green. Maincrop potatoes can still be planted now. Push twiggy prunings in around pea shoots to support them. Sweet peas can be planted out now and they will appreciate similar support. Unless you want a few long stemmed show sweet peas, pinch out the tips to encourage more side shoots.

Overwintered pelargoniums will be sending out new shoots now. Trim these back to a more compact shape and take the opportunity to take some cuttings. These should be inserted into some gritty, well drained but moist compost. Keep the cuttings uncovered (unlike most herbaceous cuttings) and in a warm place until they have rooted. If you want to repot phalaenopsis orchids, now is a good time when they have finished flowering. Trim the roots and repot into a bark based orchid compost.

Dead head your daffodils when they have finished flowering but don't forget to leave the foliage to die back and feed the bulb ready for next year. This will take about 6 weeks so please be patient! Meanwhile, enjoy the wonderful cherry blossom!

# Neighbourhood Watch

After all the rain that we have had over the last few months, you may be thinking of getting away for a few days or perhaps longer. We hope that your home security is also on your mind...

#### **Securing Your Home - Checklist**

**Windows:** closed and locked, window sensors activated, garage and shed windows locked.

**Doors:** front and rear doors double or deadlocked, all doors to your home locked, door keys kept out of sight but to hand in an emergency.

**Interior:** put lights and radio on a timer or use smart bulb with timers; activate your alarm; valuable items are out of sight; chargers and cables for phones and laptops out of view; photographic and written record of valuables.

**Exterior:** lights on movement sensors; eliminate concealment areas around the property; packaging from expensive items kept out of sight; vehicles locked and valuables removed; side gates, sheds, outbuildings and garages locked; items that could be used to break in are put away.

**Neighbours:** inform them when you are going away and to keep an eye on your property; don't post your away details on social media; don't arrange for deliveries whilst you are away.

#### Rogue Traders & Cold Callers

Stay vigilant for door step traders offering home and garden services. These people often provide poor services, employ deceptive tactics and over charge for their work. Don't agree to any work offered by unsolicited doorstep callers.

Don't rely on recommendations on social media and don't be swayed by glossy flyers or websites. Certainly do not pay cash or agree to go to a bank or pay by bank transfer any money before the work is well on its way.

If you are concerned that rogue traders are in your area, note their details and vehicle registration if possible and report to the police. Some may say that they are working for the local authority, contact the council direct to verify.

The best way when looking for work to be carried out at your home is to obtain three quotes from reputable firms that you trust and make a decision in your own time. Don't be rushed. They should have the right skills, qualifications, insurances and if removing waste have a waste carriers licence. Full contact details are provided, not just a mobile number and a 14 day cooling off period is provided.

At the moment the police are reporting cold callers are in Mid Devon offering tarmac!

#### STOP • THINK • FRAUD

If you receive a suspicious call or message, think carefully before providing any information and personal details. If you have any doubts at all, hang up the phone or close down the computer or device used to contact you. Don't call a number someone has provided or click on links. Check the organisation directly by using details that you know are correct. A message from a family friend may ask you to send money, use known contact details to check if it's the person that you know.

If you do receive a strange or suspicious call or message do not take these at face value. Instead try to think if you want to take this any further, is it really an organisation or person that you know, or the offer is too good to be true. Be on your guard.

This company offers a free priority services register (PSR) to be signed up to which offers support in the event of a power cut. You will not be restored any quicker, but they say that they will let you know what's happening in your particular area and keep you notified. Phone: 03301 010167

#### **Heating Oil**

The police report that a farm in Mid Devon has had fuel oil stolen recently. You are reminded to check the amount of your oil regularly. The tank should be screened if possible, consider fitting security lighting and fit locks on lids and just make it difficult for criminals to gain access.

NW appreciates that this issue is a bit sombre in its content but felt that a few reminders would be appreciated. We all can slip a bit!

Always be observant & vigilant and keep eyes open. We are all encouraged to report a crime, any suspicious behaviour or vehicles around. It is up to us all to do our part and be on our guard when we are out and about. Report any findings to the police.

# Message from St Mary's

### April Showers & New Life

The month of April is often associated with lots of rain or should I say showers. The Lent themes of mercy and forgiveness still run through this Eastertide. However, Easter although celebrated on the last day in March, is also celebrated for fifty days until Pentecost (Sunday 19th May).

One of the key themes of Easter is new and abundant life. It is no coincidence that Easter and Spring go hand in hand.

As we watch Spring bring new life and new growth, I marvel at its delicacy and intricacy.



There is also a real freshness to the new greens that we see all around us. I am always aware of how fast things grow at this point, they appear to almost grow as we watch. He reminded the parish council that with effect from 26th February, refuse collections will no longer take 'side waste'; that is bags stacked alongside the bins.

Mid Devon District Council has recently received £25,000 from Urban Tree Challenge towards planting trees in urban areas. He was told this will fund 66 trees (£300 a tree). The planting will be in urban areas with a target that all urban area should have 30% tree canopy to support the environment in both hot and cold periods.

6. To receive a report from Devon County Councillor Letch (DCC) - for information only. A copy had previously been circulated to councillors. Cllr Letch reported that there has been great cooperation between all parties and officers to get the books balanced at Devon County Council and was pleased to say that nothing had been transferred from reserves.

There is still an issue with bags of rubbish not being separated for collection with recyclable rubbish placed with non-recyclable rubbish.

Cllr Letch's meeting with the Highways Officer did not go ahead but will take place within the next two weeks. His focus will be on issues of safety on the A377.

He confirmed that the Locality Fund will be £8,000 for the year and that he will strive to ensure that it is spent fairly across his ward. Cllr Mitchell asked if he could apply for funding to do with projects and a library associated with Spalding Hall. DCC Cllr Letch invited him to put in a request via email for his consideration. CLLR MITCHELL TO ACTION

Clerk to place request to parish council for Spalding Hall project funding on the April agenda. CLERK TO ACTION

Cllr O'Neill reiterated the council's request for support for the new Vehicle Activated Signs (VAS) and said they will also be placing an application. CLLR O'NEILL TO ACTION

- 7. To consider the quotes for work at play area. Cllr Cowley. Deferred to April meeting. Cllr O'Neill asked the clerk to request that the quotations information be shared with the council before the April meeting. CLERK AND CLLR COWLEY TO ACTION.
