### **Doctor Clunie Supports Acorn As He Retires**

Huge thanks & congratulations to Dr Clunie, as he retires on 31st May. Over the (many) years Dr Clunie has raised much needed funds for Acorn. Below will be a brief history of his slightly off the wall endeavours.

To mark his retirement after 26 years at the practice he will again be raising funds for Acorn by cycling 2360 miles in one go from home to Bari in Southeast Italy.

It all began when Acorn were looking to buy their first minibus back in 2001 and needed to raise a substantial amount of money and Dr Clunie said he would help.

Firstly, he and his long distance running chum Rob Hitchings decided it would be a good thing to run from one side of the Dartmoor National Park boundary to the other. So, in June they did just that, running from Lydford to the Manor Inn, Ashton. In 2002, Dr Clunie decided he would run the London Marathon and completed that in 3 hours 5 minutes.

Both these events and some grant applications enabled Acorn to purchase their very first minibus.

Inevitable knee issues brought his running career to a premature end and so the first of many bicycles was purchased.

In 2008, Dr Clunie persuaded his son Ben, at the tender age of 16 to cycle John O'Groats to Lands End raising money jointly for Acorn and the RNLI. This was duly completed over 10 days, cycling 100 miles a day. In 2014 the two Doctors: Hayter and Clunie thought it a grand idea to cycle 260 miles around the perimeter of Devon, again raising funds for Acorn.

Perhaps the most bonkers endeavour of all, in 2019 Dr Clunie decided to cycle half-way

up Mount Everest, using Bridford Hill as his mountain. It comprised 27 cycles up and 27 cycles down. A total of 4200m of vertical climbing and over 54 miles. Lastly, he did the Acorn cycle of 300 miles in September 2020 over a weekend cycling 152 miles a day.

All of these challenges have raised significant sums that have helped Acorn immeasurably over the years including helping buy and replace two minibuses.

So here we are. The Doc has decided to hang up his stethoscope but not his cycling helmet.

He has generously committed to raising his last tranche of funds for Acorn by cycling from home in Devon to the coastal town, Bari in Southeast Italy via Paris, Geneva, Milan and Rome. He will be accompanied by his good friend, Olaf and the plan is that it should take them 3-4 weeks. There will be several places where you can follow their trip and keep up to date with the Doc's daily blog:

The two surgeries will have a very humorous and visual wall map, updated daily with their progress and escapades.

### Help & Advice in Our Local Community

Regular readers of these community columns will know that we help people with a vast array of problems. Many are finance related, especially since the increase in the cost of living has impacted on households across the area.

People by and large do not know what benefits or financial assistance is available that they may be able to claim and even if they think they may be able to get help, they often don't know how to go about applying for it or are simply too proud to ask. Quite often, eligibility for certain benefits opens the door to other assistance and in today's world, the problems that people present to us are becoming increasingly complex.

We have specialist teams to advise on things like debt and energy as well as help that is available to people with special needs such as people with cancer or other life limiting illnesses. We can help with housing problems and social needs and if we can't provide the help that is needed, we can refer people to other organisations that are more specialised in particular areas.

In our articles we have talked about shoddy workmanship, rights that people have when holidays don't measure up, employment issues and what to be aware of when buying a car. We are here to listen and give free, impartial advice to anyone who needs it. For us, the start of a new financial year is a time to reflect on what we have achieved in the previous financial year in terms of the numbers of people we have helped, the problems we have advised on and the impact that has had. We are continually striving to improve our efficiencies and find more ways to help more people. This year we introduced a new email advice service for instance, and we are looking at ways to make getting advice more accessible, for example, by making more information available on our website.

We also understand that not everyone is computer savvy and sometimes people just want to be able to talk to somebody on the telephone or in person which is why we have an ongoing recruitment and training programme to grow our volunteer numbers. All our volunteers get full training and ongoing support and volunteering with us can lead to paid employment opportunities. You don't need to be an expert in any particular field, you just need to care and have a willingness to listen; our training and support will see you through the rest.

# In the Garden

### The Month of May Blossom

We see May blossom (Crataegus) all along the lane hedges at this time of year. In gardens, Wisteria is in full bloom and Laburnum has long racemes of yellow flowers, often buzzing with bees. Bluebells and foxgloves appear in woodland and under hedgerows.

Climbing plants such as clematis, vines and roses, need to be tied in to keep them on their supports rather than smothering neighbouring plants. Use a figure of 8 tie so that the plant stem isn't damaged by friction with the support.

Herbaceous plants need support sooner rather than later too, preferably using pruned twigs from your garden. They will quickly grow up and hide their support material. Early flowering shrubs such as Forsythia, Kerria and Spiraea can be trimmed back now.

In ponds, duckweed and blanket weed will be growing. Use a stick to twist blanket weed around and lift it out, leaving it on the edge for 24 hours before composting it. This gives any water creatures a chance to crawl back into the water. During the summer, lily pads will expand and leave less opportunity for the weeds to grow.

Strawberries benefit from a mulch around them to keep their fruit off the soil.

Traditionally of course, this was straw, but you can use whatever you have available (I am trying alpaca fleece this year) if you think it will deter slugs and keep the fruit dry and clean.



Raspberries might be more fruitful if you prune out some of your canes. They tend to become congested which leads to fewer, smaller fruit as the canes compete for light, air and nourishment. It is also easier to clear away weeds in more open rows of canes.

Tender vegetables, such as sweetcorn and squash, can be planted outside this month after the risk of frost has passed. Dahlias and tender annuals should be safe by about mid May too. Tomatoes could be in their growing position in the greenhouse once there is room.

Whatever the weather, there is definitely plenty to do in the garden in May, even if it is just keeping on top of weeds. There should also be lots to see, whatever you choose to grow in your allotted patch.

#### Shingles

Did you know that more than 50,000 cases of shingles occur in the over 70s every year in England and Wales. Symptoms include: rashes or blisters on one side of the body, burning or shooting pain, itching, fever, fatigue or headache, in addition, almost 30% of individuals develop a painful complication called Post Herpetic Neuralgia (PHN).

Generally, this pain continues for 3 to 6 months, but it can last even longer. On average, cases last 3 to 5 weeks.

Most people only get shingles once, but you can get it more than once. The risk of shingles is higher in those with conditions such as diabetes or rheumatoid arthritis.

#### **Pneumococcal Disease**

More than 5,000 cases of IPD Pneumonia are diagnosed each year in England. Pneumonia symptoms include: a high temperature, a cough, shortness of breath, chest pain, an aching body, feeling very tired, loss of appetite or feeling confused (common in older people).

Complications can follow a mild illness and lead to more serious infections. The risk of Pneumococcal disease is greater for adults aged 65 years or older and for those with conditions such as COPD.

I discovered that these Blue Zones had 4 common denominators associated with the lifestyles and behaviours of the people.

- Eat wisely (lots of vegetables, correct portions, moderated alcohol consumption etc.)
- Move naturally (walking, gardening, dancing etc.)
- Connect with others (spending time with family, connecting with people who adopt a similar philosophy to you, be part of a community etc.)
- De-stress and have a sense of purpose

We may not be in an official Blue Zone, but we are unbelievably fortunate to live in a part of the world where all these things are accessible to us. We have an abundance of nature around us to enjoy, wonderfully active village communities to get involved in, and some of the best food produce in the country.

It's possibly unrealistic and impractical to completely change our lifestyle to incorporate all of the above 4 themes into our routines, but we could all take a small action daily (eg 1 more vegetable with dinner, walking an extra 5 minutes a day, schedule a cuppa with a friend, feeling grateful for what we have) towards happier, healthier and potentially longer lives!

# Message from St Mary's

### Springing into Action

As I looked forward to May, I have always marvelled at the RHS Chelsea flower show. I have never been but always watch the highlights on the television. It is amazing to see gardens created from nothing in just three weeks.

What you do not see is the elaborate plan which has been in place for a year, the skilful care to slow plants down in a fridge or to speed plants up in a hot house.

What you do see is a place that you could imagine yourself sitting in and enjoying nature and maybe escaping the hectic pace of life. Even better you get to enjoy it without the hard work and difficult choices to bring it into being!

The important question for May is will it be cold or mild. I am a rather poor gardener and would not want to offer any advice. However, my father was always insistent that you can still get a sharp frost in May and he would wait for the end of the month to plant out his cherished seedlings.

By contrast early in May, my father-in-law would be planting out all his annuals that he had just bought from the garden centre. If I am really honest, I cannot remember a time when my father-in-law lost any of his early planting. Yet despite the evidence to the contrary, I am still very cautious and will wait until the end of the month.

#### When Do You Spring Into Action?

In the Church year, both Ascension Day and Pentecost are early, on the 9th May and 19th May.

As we look back to Easter, Jesus' disciples and their shortcomings are all too painfully clear. Yet Jesus comes, finds and restores his disciples despite their failures. On Ascension Day, we see a new confidence in the disciples as Jesus sends them out to tell the whole world about God and Jesus. Jesus tells them to wait for Pentecost, to receive the Father's promise of power from on high. They only have to wait ten days but we are told that the disciples undertake this task with joy seeking God's help.

It is such a contrast to Easter when they were fearful and lost.

On Pentecost, they speak to the crowd about the crucified and resurrected Jesus. The crowd listen and some of them believe in the testimony and become followers. Jesus' followers spring into action, inspired by Jesus' example.

Like the disciples, we often get things wrong and are sometimes dispirited. Yet the assurance of God helping us gives us the confidence to keep going, keep trying and not fear failure.

Is it time to spring into action, to be inspired by the created world which surrounds us?

We need to be generous and compassionate, just as God is towards us.

### SEND Budget Cuts

Now that the council tax bills have arrived there is no need for speculation but rather to wait and see how the cuts impact on services. At a recent meeting of the County's Children's Scrutiny Committee we looked at the huge SEND (Special Educational Needs & Disability) overspend.

It is predicted that by April 2025 this figure will be about £207 million! The county council has been in consultation with the Department for Education and negotiated a Safety Valve agreement. This will not be a quick fix but will take six or seven years to bring down the overspend to 0. It is a three pronged attack on the problem with £98 million coming from central government over the next six years, money from Devon County Council taken from reserves and sales of assets and savings from the overall operation of children's care. I must admit that several people on the committee were rather sceptical about this final part of the solution.

#### **Young Carers**

Still on the theme of children I was delighted to attend a young carers webinar. I was staggered to learn that there are about 1 million children ( under 17 years old) who have a variety of caring duties. We were treated to a presentation by six young carers to describe their challenges, the impact of caring on their own lives and possible solutions. There was a young carers action day earlier in the month. I would like people to look at the website **www.carers/ youngcarerscovenant**, which you can sign. I'm going to press for this at district and county level.

We are repeatedly told as councillors that we are corporate parents. I am hoping to turn this into something more concrete rather than just a few words.

#### **Buses**

Stagecoach and the county council have been in negotiations with central government for funding to help with zero carbon objectives. I'm pleased to say that Stagecoach has received £5.3 million which will enable them to introduce electric buses in North Devon, Torridge and Exeter.

#### **Road Conditions**

I attended a briefing from the two senior highways officers. The first thing they admitted is that they are overwhelmed by the number of defects and condition of our major roads. In the previous financial year they had fixed 40,000 safety defects (mostly potholes of course) but already this year which has a month to go the figure had jumped to 53,000.

They have 20 gangs out repairing the safety defects who sometimes work at weekends in order to make an impact on the figures. The one thing they reiterated is that everybody from the senior highways officers down to any member of the public has the same power to report a safety defect. The computer system does not differentiate between highways officers, councillors and members of the public.

There is also a section on the website for reporting gullies. You can check on each individual gully to see when it was last emptied. Guidelines are that those on the major roads are looked at monthly, other busy roads such as the A377 once a year, country roads again once a year and town roads once every three years. It is always helpful to go online to get an exact number of the gully so that the officers can easily go to the correct location.
