

News from the Moor

I hope that you are all well. Spring seems to have finally arrived (better late than never) and the various gardens across Dartmoor are suddenly full of colour. The walled garden at Parke is promising a lovely harvest later in the year and the Wisteria at Drogo is glorious and smells divine.

June is going to be a busy month with various national weeks taking place. We are delighted that we will be supporting Carers Week (10th – 16th June) by hosting the Devon Carers team at Drogo on Monday 10th June and at Lydford on Thursday 13th June. If you are an unpaid carer for a friend, family member or neighbour and would like to know what support is available for you, please pop along on either of those days for a chat with the Devon Carers team.

Volunteers Week (3rd - 9th June) is our chance to formally recognise the amazing contribution volunteers give. On Dartmoor we have close to 300 volunteers doing all kinds of roles. From sharing the stories of Drogo in the castle, to monitoring Pied Flycatchers at Lydford Gorge, our volunteers make it possible for us to share these wonderful places with thousands of people every year. Thank you to everyone who volunteers their time to support a cause they are passionate about.

Great Big Green Week

We then have Great Big Green Week (8th - 16th June). GBGW is the UK's biggest celebration of community action to tackle climate change and protect nature. As part of this, there are lots of different activities taking place across Dartmoor. These include a drop-in collaborative art activity at Drogo as part of The Mossy Carpet project, a hydro turbine open day at Drogo on 15th June, and a drop-in community volunteering day at Parke on 16th June. We are also inviting local people to have a day out at Castle Drogo without the car. As part of GBGW, we are excited to announce that we are offering a free Castle Drogo Shuttle Bus service on 5 selected dates to connect the town of Okehampton with Castle Drogo.

On Saturdays 8th & 15th June, starting from Okehampton train station, outbound buses run at 9:30, 10:30 & 11:30 which are coordinated to meet the arrival of the train from Exeter. On weekdays 10th, 12th & 14th June, there will be two outbound services running at 9:30 & 11:30. The return bus from Castle Drogo runs at 2:35 & 4:35 on all 5 days.

The bus, which is wheelchair accessible, will leave Okehampton train station with one pick up in the town on Fore Street (McColls) before continuing to Castle Drogo. The bus will drop passengers just outside the Visitor Centre entrance to the property where you'll also find the café, shop and toilets. We look forward to seeing how many people take up the free shuttle for this week and hearing how it goes.

ACE Archaeology Club

Please, not another wet summer!

As I write this at the end of a wet and windy April, ACE is looking forward to the summer and our annual dig. We are hoping that it won't be as wet as last year. I've just been proof reading the interim report and we spent a lot of time sitting in the mess tent watching the rain pouring down outside. Our dig director writes an interim report every year and that will soon be available on our website.

Talking of websites, ours goes on in leaps and bounds thanks to the new website member.

We went to Wells to show off some of our pottery from our dig near Winkleigh and we are now hoping that a couple of members of the Medieval Pottery Research Group will be coming soon to look at our 2000+ sherds of pottery to help us date it.

A new project has started. Looking at old roads in mid Devon and seeing how they fit with the idea of drove roads. We are looking at two routes in particular, although probably finding others while we do that. So, if you find yourselves on a little road behind some people who seems to be stopping for no apparent reason and leaping out of the vehicle to stand and stare and take photos, please be patient with them! Of course we have found ourselves looking at old maps, thinking about the wool trade, old markets and now the Enclosures Acts have come into my mind. But I'm trying to ignore them as we cannot do it all.

Citizen's Advice

All Change!

Some people embrace and welcome change but for others, change can be a very unsettling process and major changes are currently taking place within our welfare benefits system which many will have read and heard about but won't necessarily understand what it means for them.

We refer to this as Managed Migration which, put simply, is the move from 'old style' benefits to Universal Credit.

From January 2024 the Department of Work and Pensions (DWP) is writing to everyone claiming benefits to tell them how the changes affect them and what they need to do. They are starting to contact people who are claiming Working Tax Credits and/or Child Tax Credits. The aim is to work systematically through the different classes of current benefits giving people three months notice of the need to change.

It's a big step and a daunting one for many people and in the meantime there are things that you can do. Here at Citizens Advice Torridge, North, Mid and West Devon we are able to help with any questions you may have and there is a very clear and comprehensive leaflet that outlines the changes that can be downloaded from our website using this link Managed Migration - Rural Devon Citizen's Advice *citizensadvicetnmwd.org.uk*

This change will affect everyone who is claiming benefits currently so we strongly advise people to look into it before getting the letter from DWP (the migration notice), so that you can be very clear about how the change will affect you and what you will need to do.

In the Garden

June Roses

June is definitely the month of roses in all their glorious fragranced forms. They only need to be enjoyed, perhaps whilst dead heading to keep them blooming for longer. Also, if you see any suckers (shoots coming up from below the graft, looking more like a wild rose) then pull those off.

Early peas might be ready to harvest by now. When you have picked them all, cut off the stems (hulms), leaving the roots in the ground. These have nitrogen fixing nodules which will benefit the next crop you grow there. Early potatoes might be ready too, especially if you have grown them in a greenhouse. If they are beginning to flower, investigate to see if the potatoes are big enough to eat.

Keep sowing seed but remember that lettuce seeds won't germinate at high temperatures so you need to put them somewhere cool.

Runner beans and tomatoes can be planted out. Tomatoes need to be in the warmest, sunniest place you have. Beans need good strong supports and need to be kept moist.

Strawberry plants should have straw or any dry organic material, to keep the fruit off the ground. They will start to put out runners. If you want more plants (bearing in mind that they don't fruit as well after a few years), you can put a pot of soil under the plantlet and peg it down. When it has rooted you can detach it from the parent plant. If you don't want more plants then just cut the runners off.

Violas can be mound layered now. Partially cover the viola plant with compost. The straggling stems will form roots and you will have new plants to move elsewhere.

Companion planting is useful and interesting at this time of year. French marigolds planted under tomatoes deter greenfly, as does Basil. Petunias planted next to carrots helps to disguise them and hide them from carrot root fly. Salvias under roses helps prevent aphids from becoming too comfortable.

If you need to water your garden, try and do so in the evening so that the water doesn't just evaporate. If you can mulch after soaking the ground, that helps to retain the moisture.



Don't forget to stop and smell the roses!

Neighbourhood Watch

Devon County Council Road Repairs

For financial year 2024/25, DCC have received an extra £12 million boost to spend on repairing potholes and improving road drainage, which will make our roads safer. DCC admits that there is a considerable amount of work needed to the roads in Devon. When we are out and about, we should come across repairs and improvements and hopefully, they will stand the test of time!

Driving

You may have heard that there have been a significant number of serious accidents on Devon and Cornwall roads recently, and sadly, many have resulted in the loss of life.

The Police state that the five main causes of accidents are: speeding, careless driving, drink & drugs driving, not wearing a seat belt, distraction by using a mobile phone or tablet at the wheel.

Drivers are reminded to take more care on the roads, to look out for other road users and just consider how losing their driving licence would affect them, their employment, their family and their livelihood.

Cheriton Bishop Community Speed Watch and Road Safety

CSW Group are out and about as some of you may have noticed. Drivers have nothing to fear if they keep within speed limits for the type of road or lane they are traveling on. Remember to reduce speed outside of the lower limit you are about to enter. Increasing speed to a higher road limit should only take place when within that new limit.

This time of year, vegetation, and in particular Cow Parsley, is growing very fast and sticking out along the sides of the lanes. This reduces the width of the lane for all road users, parents taking children to school, walkers, and vehicle drivers. People on foot should be clearly seen and drivers should take extra care at a safe speed.

Scams

There seems to be so many ways for people to be targeted - social media, email, text and by phone. It's therefore no surprise that fraud is so prevalent. A target on the increase is 'pension scams' which can ruin retirement ambitions and plans in an instant.

Two common pension scams are, Early Release Pensions and Pension Review scams. In both of these cases, the scam is obvious because pensions cannot be accessed early without high tax penalties (unless you are in poor health or have other certain conditions). Remember, if someone is offering something which does not seem right or sounds too good to be true, don't have anything to do with it. If on the other hand you are interested and want time to think about a proposal, then take your time and perhaps talk it through with a very trusted person before making a decision. It could make all the difference!

Police are drawing attention to a scam where fraudsters are contacting people by phone posing as bank or building society officials or as a police officer. These imposters claim that the person's money is not safe in their account. They try to create a sense of urgency and even fear in the victim. If such a phone call is received, just hang up and never get involved with the caller. Wait 10 minutes for the line to clear or use a different phone before checking with your bank or building society that everything is safe.

Additional Way to Report to Police

We can now report crimes, accidents and incidents and access support for victims by using a smartphone app, which is available via the iOS App Store and Google Play. This gives a quick and easy way for reporting incidents, finding your local policing team, and for finding crime prevention advice on a wide range of issues such as burglary or vehicle crime. This is said to make it much easier to contact the police. However traditional ways to contact the police are still very much around. Bank fraud departments can be reached direct by phoning **159** although not tried out by us!

Advertising on Facebook

Police say that buyers who are collecting items, are making payments by bank transfer and showing the seller the details of the transaction on their phone. Items are then taken away before the payment is actually received and the seller never receives the payment. The moral is always check that the money is safely in your bank before handing over goods.

Safety

Always be observant & vigilant and keep your eyes open. We are all encouraged to report a crime, any suspicious behaviour or vehicles around. It is up to us all to do our part and be on our guard when we are out and about. Report any findings to the police.

Ordinary Time Returns

The month of May sees the end of Easter and Pentecost. There is no special season to celebrate and we return to our normal routine in June. The church calls this ordinary time when there is no special season. This year there were less than two weeks of ordinary time between the end of Christmas and the beginning of Lent. Or, since the beginning of Advent (3rd December 2023), we have been in a special season for twenty-six weeks or half a year.

On the face of it, ordinary time does not seem very interesting. However, when we are busy and pressurised by work or crisis, the idea of a quieter simpler time is enormously appealing.

I have to admit to looking forward to quieter and simpler periods. I feel that we had enough of watching and waiting (Advent and Lent) and celebrating (Christmas, Epiphany, Easter and Pentecost) which has made me tired. We can only stretch ourselves beyond our capacity for a limited period. If we ignore the warning signals we start making bad judgments, forgetting important things and often becoming ill.

Our lives need to be accentuated by highlights and low lights, but most of the time our lives should be normal.

Too much excitement can be exhausting and make us complacent.

Too much worry can make us feel low, and withdrawn and lead to depression and illness. Life has for the most part to be lived normally. What is normal? This is a cause of great debate but I think we know what is right and good for us and we should aspire to get that balance.

As a priest, I always think that Easter and Christmas come too close together. It would have been handy to have Easter in the middle of June! As far away from Christmas as possible, but sometimes we have to accept God's timing rather than what would be more convenient for us.

As part of normal living, there needs to be a good spiritual dimension.

We need to keep the lines of communication open to God. It is just as important to share our small worries and simple thanks on a daily and regular basis.

God is not just there for crises and important times. It is important to develop a real relationship with God and include Him as an integral part of our everyday lives.

Sadly when people neglect to cultivate a good relationship with God they assume that God will turn his back on them as they have done on him, until some crisis hits them. The opposite is true, God welcomes us any time for whatever reason.

Ordinary time reminds us that we need to cultivate a good and healthy lifestyle that incorporates a spiritual dimension.

Little and often works so much better than crisis management.

1. To receive and accept apologies. None

2. Chair and Councillor's reports on projects.

The Chair reported that the 2024 Village Event will be held on 6th June 2024. We have a volunteer to lead the team to help organise the hot and cold drinks catering. Everyone is encouraged to bring some food to share. The event is free with soft drinks, children's games and music provided.

The parish council received sufficient interest in the provision of allotments to oblige the parish council to act on the request. The council is currently seeking a plot of suitable land. This needs to be around an acre and to provide around 25 plots. To date three landowners have been approached and two have declined and the third is still considering the request. Work is ongoing. A member of the public asked if the strip by the village green could be available but it is thought to be owned by the Church Diocese who have already turned down a request.

Cllr Cowley reported on work at the play area. The hedge has been trimmed and laid. The hedge between the play area and householder has been tidied up. Care needs to be taken around a hole created by the removal of a National Grid pole. There may be further minimal work and Cllr Cowley will visit the area and monitor the situation.

Cllr Marshall reported that the installation of the Vehicle Activated Speed signs is progressing, sites identified, budget allocated but still waiting for Devon County Council's (DCC) permission. DCC is required to install the signs and Cllr Marshall asked DCC Cllr Frank Letch to bring pressure to bear on the installation team as this is now stymieing the project. If this is not successful the parish council may consider commissioning the work itself.

Cllr Marshall continued saying that the village gateway signs are now in a poor state and he has been getting quotes and has now allocated the funding and intends to replace one sign at a time to assess suitability and look. The council wished to thank Dennis Milton for his assistance.

Cllr Marshall reported that refurbishing the Memorial Cross area is still under consideration but quotes received to date for raising the present surface and putting it to lawn are financially out of reach. Cllr Marshall is continuing to look into this with a view to obtaining alternatives.

A member of the public said there is a footpath close to Crockernwell Dip that would be of great benefit to the community if it could be accessed more easily and parking was available. There is also a log stopping easy access to the footpath and the Chair responded by saying the council will look into this. CHAIR & CLERK TO ACTION.


