Community Allotments Project

Do you have available land or know anyone who has?

CHERITON BISHOS

Cheriton Bishop Parish Council is still seeking a landowner to help us provide allotments for local families and individuals. We are looking for an area of at least one acre to rent on a flexible basis. Another possibility might be the donation of a plot of land to the community, named for the donor or someone else as a memorial.

The Council will arrange a contractor – or pay the owner, if preferred – to install a perimeter fence (where needed). Allotment plots would be approximately 25m x 5m. We will also meet the costs of extending a water supply to the site from the nearest source, if necessary.

We welcome proposals – and we understand that some flexibility may be needed – with the ideal site having the following characteristics:

- Less than 1 mile from the village centre.
- Level, or at least a consistent moderate slope.
- Reasonably well drained for most of the year.
- Access to a road, with potential for bringing vehicles on site and possible parking close by.

The site would be rented and maintained by the Council, with a volunteer committee from allotment holders managing membership, plot rentals and site rules. There would be no permanent buildings erected on site by allotment holders.

ACE Archaeology Club

One minute it is August and then it is Christmas, or even later by the time you read this. ACE has been busy in the intervening time.

We have been involved in a few things organised by other people in the last few months. Including some test pitting at Wrangworthy Barrows as support to the Monument Management Scheme (MMS). The MMS looks after sites that are scheduled monuments and tries to keep them in good condition. They have been doing some work in the ACE 'area' and some ACE members went to help at Wrangworthy Barrows.

On our own ACE Day in October, we repeated a visit to Winkleigh for a tour of the village, focusing on its long and varied history. Although it hasn't been long since we did this, it was decided that we should do it again as we have had so many new members this year.

Included in the tour was a visit to Heywood Castle, a Motte and Bailey castle overlooking Eggesford. There is a surprising number of such castles in the area. Not far from Haywood is Eggesford Castle - not accessible as on private property - and Winkleigh has two such mounds; one on private property and one under the village hall!! There must have been a lot of trouble from the inhabitants of the area.

Citizen's Advice

'Tis the Season...

"My children love Christmas and they're already picking extra treats off the shelf when we go shopping and telling what presents they want. I want to make it special for them, but times are tough and I worry about overspending and getting into debt. What can I do?"

Borrowing money or using a credit card to fund Christmas can seem like your only option but there are steps to take to keep spending under control and avoid falling into debt. First - make a budget and stick to it.

- Who are you buying gifts for?
- What other seasonal expenses do you have?
- How much can you realistically afford to spend?

Keep receipts or ask for gift receipts in case you have to return something if you overspend.

Household bills are likely to be higher too, with colder weather and people spending more time indoors.

If you have built up debt, don't ignore bills or letters. Speak to the organisation you owe money to as they may let you pay smaller amounts. Priority bills need to be paid first such as rent, mortgage, council tax and energy bills.

For other types of debt like credit cards or loans, look at what you owe, work out a budget and contact your creditors to set up an affordable repayment plan. This might seem scary but it's an important first step, and many people are having to do exactly the same thing. If you are struggling to afford all the essentials like bills and food, we at CA TNMWD can help in various ways. A good place to start is by visiting *www.citizensadvicetnmwd.org.uk* where there is lots of useful information to help. You can also see our local office hours and availability for appointments and drop-ins. Or call our free, local AdviceLine on **0808 27 87 999**.

A quick benefits check may also show that you can claim additional financial help. You may also qualify for a reduction in council tax or help with energy costs.

Demand for our services is increasing all the time and we need all the help we can get to help people in our community with problems like this. Security Reminder

Insurance companies are saying that 21% of claims take place during November and December each year. With a few measures you can secure your property this winter and for the rest of the year.

Note: ground floor doors and windows are particularly vulnerable.

- Close curtains to block out the views into your home. Don't advertise what you have received and don't put empty boxes outside showing what has been delivered.
- 2. Have at least 5 lever robust locks on all entrance doors into the property. Further security is by adding a chain or door restriction which allows you to identify a visitor and is a physical barrier.
- 3. Remember to keep windows shut and locked all of the time.
- 4. Install motion activated lights around the home. Some of these can contain a camera and send an image to your smartphone.
- Secure the garden and side entrances. Put summer used items away. Lock sheds. Motion active lighting outside will be a deterrent.
- 6. Keep debit and credit cards safe at all times.
- 7. Keep your car keys out of sight and never leave them near the inside of the entrance door especially if it has a letter opening.
- 8. Keep vehicles locked and if possible in the garage or on your drive at the very least.

EV Chargers

We see that DCC have received Government funding of over £7m to deliver across the region thousands of accessible E V charging points. This is due to start in 2025 and could take up to 2030. Apparently a barrier to the uptake in Devon of E V sales is the lack of availability of charging infrastructure. With the installation in place this should allow people who want to charge vehicles close to their property to do so. The scheme includes trials of charging points built into street lighting columns and also for cable channels in the footway to avoid cables trailing across pavements. No time scale for how long this will take has been given.

Safe Water

If by any chance work is being carried out by a plumber on your drinking water system, it is advisable to ensure that they are using lead free solder before any soldering takes place. Lead can dissolve or leach into water and can build up in the body causing health issues. Using solder is much reduced today and most plumbers if soldering only use lead free as the use of lead type is illegal. Unfortunately the two types of solder look the same to the ordinary person. However lead solder comes in a red casing or reel and the lead free solder in a green casing or reel. Any one carrying out D I Y in their home should take note.

There is no safe limit for lead. Using lead free solder in a drinking water system will protect everyone's health.

Safety

Always be observant & vigilant and keep your eyes open. We are all encouraged to report a crime, any suspicious behaviour or vehicles around. It is up to us all to do our part and be on our guard when we are out and about. Report any findings to the police.

In the Garden

The Bare Bones

Winter is a good time to reconsider the design of your garden. The falling leaves will reveal the bare bones and you can see how the structure could be improved.

You can spend cold wet evenings indoors looking at inspirational designs and new plants. Perhaps there are plants which have outgrown their allotted space?

I was given a bright blue flowered hydrangea several years ago which was about a foot high. Now it is 6 feet high and covered in faded pink flowers. I cut it back by a third and moved it to a position where it can spread unhindered. Something smaller, like an interesting fern, can replace the huge hydrangea, creating an entirely different feel to that particular space. Some areas of the garden are difficult to access in winter, so perhaps new paths can be made, even if only from wood chippings from tree prunings. Then more visitors will be able to enjoy the scent of your



mahonia or see the camellia flowers properly.

Don't forget to keep feeding the birds throughout the cold winter months and provide water.

Look out for bulbs peeping through in January, signalling the beginning of the next gardening year.

Message from St Mary's

Making Space to Enjoy Christmas

As I write, I see that Halloween items are disappearing from the shops and being replaced by more tempting things to buy for Christmas.

The build-up to Christmas started in September and is intensified in November. You will have to look hard to find the Advent things among the Christmas gifts. You might find some Advent candles or Advent calendars; however, the real prize is the gift or chocolate inside the Advent calendar. It sadly has little to do with the Christmas Story. I remember opening a window to find a star, camel, donkey or cattle all part of retelling the Christmas story. We had to share the calendar and we would argue whose turn it was to open the window.

I remember my Mum carefully closing the windows and flattening the calendar to use next Advent. Advent helpfully counts the days up to Christmas Eve, the excitement and expectations growing in the late teens and early twenties, to the point that it seems impossible to sleep on Christmas Eve.

Advent reminds us that we need to get ready, to be prepared. For most people that comes down to lists of activities, like buying gifts and food, sending presents and cards or decorating for Christmas.

There is an idea that we need to make space and time to enjoy Christmas which is a great challenge in an activity-based time of year.

We are called to put anything that is amiss between us and family or friends right. How can we celebrate when trying to keep a check on our resentments? We are also reminded that many people find Christmas difficult for various reasons. The divisions and conflicts are often magnified when they are alone or miss company or the cost of Christmas is too much to bear. Perhaps we can find a way to help someone who is struggling.

The first Christmas reminds us of the hospitality of a stranger who allowed Mary and Joseph to stay with them when there was nowhere else to stay. The baby's unexpected arrival reminds us that not everything goes according to plan and that we might need to change and adapt. The joy of the new life was shared with strangers like the shepherds and the wise men.

It is 110 years since the World War One Christmas Day truce. It is remarkable that between enemies on both sides, a little common humanity should prevail on Christmas Day and an informal truce for a football match became something to join in.

Christmas offers us the invitation to join in and enjoy ourselves. It may be something as simple as playing a board game with real physical people or kicking a ball around. It helps us reconnect and remember. Perhaps helping someone else over Christmas reminds us that others have helped us. Christmas reminds us that God's love is to be shared with those we encounter, even if it is difficult.




