
Now that the longer evenings and hopefully better weather is with us, we will move onto evening walks. Full details will be on our Facebook page and the Village Facebook page.

Alan gave an informative and entertaining presentation about the paper, its history, and his working life as an editor.

The Crediton Courier was started by a dedicated group of individuals 50 years ago. It has evolved over the years from a monthly publication to the popular weekly newspaper it is today.

The Crediton Courier currently sells over two thousand copies a week, which reach a worldwide audience. The development of technology has influenced process of creating the newspaper, and how it is printed. It is now a data driven, information gathering product, with paper, website and social media formats, and Al writes some of the stories.

As editor, Alan told WI members, even after working at the Crediton Courier for 48 years, he never runs out of stories, and he never knows what he is going to write about next!

Our thanks go to Alan for his presentation. WI members also took part in the monthly competitions, a raffle, and enjoyed tea, coffee and biscuits.

Members of Tedburn St Mary WI continue to enjoy a busy programme. Lunch outings, bluebell walks and cream teas, a cruise on the River Exe and a watercolour painting class are amongst some of the activities on offer to members.

A Tribute to Councillor Frank Letch MBE

Sadly, on Tuesday 8th April 2025, the Council's current Chairman, and a very well-known figure in the Crediton community and beyond, Councillor Frank Letch MBE, died following an illness.

The Leader of Mid Devon District Council, Luke Taylor, along with colleagues, have released the below tribute to Frank who was an active part of Mid Devon District Council for 10 years. Councillor Luke Taylor, said:

"Frank poured his heart and soul into local politics and would always represent his communities to the highest of standards, as he would expect from us all.

He never shied away from stepping forward to represent others, be that through his role as a local councillor or through supporting charities and organisations close to his heart.

He took on many roles at the Council, including scrutiny, planning and equality, and despite his busy schedule, and latterly his poor health, he continued to advocate for fairness and representation for everyone.

This Council will be a poorer place without Frank's dedication and enthusiasm to local politics and he will be missed by elected Members from across all parties."

His colleagues in Democratic Services, who supported him during his role, said:

"Frank always put his constituents' welfare first particularly in relation to housing. He was a stickler for correct spelling and grammar in reports but always put people at ease.

Frank was a true gentleman who was always smiling and popular with our officers for his cheerfulness and sense of humour. We will always remember his love for an inspirational 'thought for the day' at the full Council meetings he chaired."

Frank was first elected to Mid Devon District Council in 2015 and to Devon County Council in 2021.

He was the Mayor of Crediton for 13 years and was elected Chairman of Mid Devon District Council in 2023. As well as being a councillor for Crediton Town and Devon County Councils Frank also chaired many Mid Devon committees.

Frank is survived by his wife Natalia, who is a serving member of Mid Devon District Council.

"Awful April"

It's was dubbed "Awful April" as increases in energy, water, broadband and council tax kicked in. Increasing numbers of people are finding it harder to cover basic living expenses.

Some people qualify for benefits payments but don't realise it. Our advisers can run a simple benefits check. Call our local AdviceLine on **0808 27 87 999** – it's a free call.

You can access email and video advice via our website www.citizensadvicetnmwd.org.uk and details of our office opening hours and drop-in availability are also there. People of working age on low income may be eligible to claim, or those of State Pension age with little or no income, people who are sick or disabled and carers may still be eligible to claim so it is worth exploring the possibility.

Our last Advice Column focussed on getting help from the Local Authority with council tax and they may also be able to help with energy, water bills, food or other essentials through their Household Support Fund (welfare assistance). If you have children and are on a low income or claiming certain benefits, you may qualify for free school meals, transport to school or help with the cost of uniform. It is always worth shopping around for cheaper deals on broadband, energy or considering having a water meter installed.

It's a case of trying to increase income and/or reduce outgoings.

Here at CA TNMWD, we have specially trained energy advisers who can talk to you about ways of reducing energy costs and we can provide energy vouchers to those who qualify.

When things are tight, having a budget is even more important.

'Tools and calculators | MoneyHelper' at www. moneyhelper.org.uk/en/tools-andcalculators has some helpful guidance, and 'Debt and money | Citizens Advice' at https://citizensadvice.org.uk/debt-and-money/ also has lots of useful links and information.

When budgeting, 'priority' debts i.e. rent/mortgage, Council Tax and energy bills have to come first as missing these payments can have the most serious consequences. Then review debts such as credit cards or payday loans. We have specially trained debt advisers who can help people manage debt and we are regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority. It is important, however, if you start to fall behind on payments, to contact the organisation or company involved as soon as you can to try and see if you can come to some kind of arrangement.

Affirmations

Our thoughts and thought patterns can be a major source of distress and discomfort, but also a foundation of positivity and growth. Have you ever observed how two people can view very similar situations completely differently? This is likely due to their conditioned thought patterns, which will in no small part govern their outcomes and habits.

If you're anything like me, you have some thought patterns which you like such as:

In the Garden

Marvellous May!

There is lot to marvel at in the garden in May, whether it is the fresh fronds of unfurling ferns or the spectacular rhododendron flowers or wild bluebells and campions. The weeds will be growing too so there will be lots to do.

Spring flowering plants such as primulas can be dug up and divided now. This will give them space to grow and will rejuvenate them. Pulmonarias can be cut right back as their foliage tends to get mildew. They can be divided too and will grow fresh new foliage. Aubretia and alyssum can be trimmed back after flowering to encourage new growth from the base.

Plant supports are best put in place before herbaceous plants get too big or fall over during a storm. They will soon be hidden beneath vigorous growth. Climbers such as clematis will still need tying to their supports as they grow.

Tender indoor plants can be moved outdoors for the summer where they will appreciate air and space. Cannas, dahlias, orange trees, bananas and whatever other exotic species you have been protecting, should be safe from



frost by May. If possible, with smaller plants, harden them off gradually by putting them out in the daytime and back under cover at night.

Vegetable plants can be planted out (there are plenty of young plants available to buy now if you don't have a greenhouse) and they are perfectly happy in containers if you don't have space in your garden. They just need regular watering and some love and attention. Runner beans are nice big seeds to grow outside and might benefit from a cut off plastic bottle to protect the seedling until it is strong enough to grow up a cane. You will enjoy eating your home grown produce!

Message from St Mary's

Enjoying Spring

One of the key themes of Easter is new life. It is also linked to the beginning of Spring through the Jewish Festival of Passover.

Spring is also a time when we see the beginning of new life and growth around us. We are blessed to be in Devon, where we can easily see new lambs in the fields. We see the trees return to life through tender new green shoots. However, this burst of new life and energy needs the right conditions to come into being.

Nothing grows if it is too cold; the plants need warmth and sunlight. If it is too wet, seeds can go mouldy, seedlings can be washed away, and new lambs must go into shelter to keep warm and dry. What we expect in terms of Spring depends very much on the weather. These two things do not necessarily go hand in hand.

I like the story of the calendar driven by the lunar cycle, trying to work out whether it was warm and light enough for Spring to start or if it should be a leap month to wait another twenty days for Spring to start. It must have been impossible to call it right!

Easter is very late this year, so you might expect Spring to have sprung. Only time will tell if that proves to be correct.

With the late Easter comes later dates for Ascension Day, Thursday 29th May and Pentecost Sunday 8th June. Having Ascension Day after the Spring Bank Holiday in May is interesting. It used to follow Pentecost or Whit Sunday and be called the Whitsun Bank Holiday. So, Ascension Day couldn't come after this Bank Holiday. I had assumed that if the first Bank Holiday in May was the Early May Bank Holiday, the second would be the Late May Bank Holiday. I was wrong. It is called the Spring Bank Holiday. I have to say it seems a little odd given that Meteorological summer begins on the 1st June. Perhaps it should be called the Late Spring Bank Holiday!

Returning to themes of new life and growth that both Easter and Spring bring to mind; it is also a reminder of the generous heart that God has for each and every one of us. So often in life, we feel that we are out of reach and isolated.

Jesus reminds us that God looks out for the lost and those who feel trapped in a place they do not want to be. Like the turn of seasons from Spring to Summer, which are not always clear and well defined.

Our relationship with God can be both fallow and fertile at different times. It is never too late to renew or rekindle that love for our creation and its creator.

Minutes of the CB Parish Council Meeting

Held on Monday 14th April 2025 at 7pm at the Spalding Hall

Present: Chair Cllr P O'Neill, Vice Chair Cllr Roger Marshall, Cllrs A Fry and C. Royle.

Mid Devon District Council (MDDC) Cllr Chenore.

Three members of the public were present for part of the meeting.

Attending: J Clark, Parish Clerk

1. To receive and accept apologies. Cllrs Mitchell and Cowley and MDDC Cllr Binks. Approved.

Chair, Cllr O'Neill spoke on behalf of the meeting about the sad passing of Devon County Council (DCC) and MDDC Cllr Frank Letch saying that Cllr Letch had played a supportive and very active role in the life of the parish council over many years. Cllr Chenore expressed her sadness and commented on his dedication and hard work as well as his support to her during her election to Mid Devon District Council.

- 2. To receive Declarations of Interest. None.
- 3. Public Discussion: None
- 4. Planning
- 4.1 25/00388/FULL Use of three existing holiday lets as permanent unrestricted residential dwellings following demolition of an agricultural building utilising the Class Q fallback position.

Land and Buildings at NGR 274687 94504 (South Pitton Farm) Cheriton Bishop.

Following a discussion the parish council saw no reason to object to the application and are happy to leave the decision to the Local Authority.

4.2 25/00413/HOUSE Erection of single storey 4 bay detached garage and workshop following removal of existing shed

Drummers Well Cheriton Bishop

Following a discussion the parish council saw no reason to object to the application and are happy to leave the decision to the Local Authority.

4.3 25/00428/FULL Erection of 2 dwellings and construction of new vehicular access

Little Mounson Cheriton Bishop

Concern was expressed that the new access would require significant additional damage to the hedge on the roadside to achieve access and the required vision splays. The Chair reported that In the previous application, this hedge was described in the environmental assessment as part of a "species-rich hedgerow with trees" and it was specifically noted that "the north-western (roadside) hedgerow has the potential of being classified as an important hedgerow under the Hedgerow Regulations 1997".

It was also noted that the significant difference in the description of this hedgerow in the environmental assessment in the current application reflected a very significant deterioration, including the illegal removal of the central 12 metres which the owner was required to make good by replanting, in the three years since the previous application. Concern was expressed that allowing the new vehicular access might imply acceptance of this deliberate damage and deterioration and might also set a precedent for other applications involving environmentally valuable hedgerows.

MDDC Cllr Chenore agreed to bring these issues to the attention of the planning team in MDDC and to report back to the clerk. She would also discuss the option of "calling in" the application with the Planning Officer. CLLR CHENORE TO ACTION.

Following the discussion the council resolved unanimously by a show of hands to object to the application.

CB Parish Council

4.4 25/00505/FULL Erection of extension to an existing agricultural building for use as storage Location:

Jervis Farm Cheriton Bishop

Following a discussion the parish council saw no reason to object to the application and are happy to leave the decision to the Local Authority.

The Chair suspended Standing Orders in order to hear from members of the public (arriving after the Planning items on the agenda) regarding concerns about the planning application item 4.3. The Chair responded that the parish council had read the application and comments and told members of the public that the parish council had resolved to object to the application (see above).

The chair reinstated Standing Orders.

- **5.** To consider the draft minutes of the March meeting as a correct record. The council resolved unanimously by a show of hands to approve the minutes of the March 2025 parish council meeting.
- 6. To receive reports from MDDC Councillors for information only. Cllr Chenore reported that the election process is underway and commented that there will be a lot of change due to the Local Government Review in the coming years.

Cllr Chenore asked if the parish council needed any assistance in addressing the issue of street lighting in the centre of the village. The Chair responded that Teignbridge DCC has responded with a suggestion that some of the Bunny Homes S102 funding should be used for this purpose. He is currently researching the options for solar powered lighting and will report back at a later date when more information is available.

- 7. To receive a report from Devon County Councillor. See comment in item 1.
- 8. Repairs & Maintenance to consider any repairs and maintenance needed for PC assets.

Replacement of acrylic sheet on the old PC noticeboard. The Chair will carry out the work.

RoSPA has completed the 2025 inspection on the play area and reported that no work is currently required.

Cllr Royle pointed out that there is a pothole close to the site of the shop and she has reported this on the DCC Report a Problem Page but as yet no action has been taken. The parish council noted concern about the number of potholes.

The Chair said that he is still trying to get approval for the provision of equipment and the delivery of materials from DCC Highways for the team of three volunteers to begin filling potholes locally.

The council noted that Cllr Cowley has repaired the hole in the hedge of the playground.

9. Accounts - to approve the following payments. Note the payment to E Northcott was a typing error and is £450 and not £350 as on the agenda. Clerk explained the error and the council resolved to approve the change to the amount. The council resolved to approve all payments unanimously by a show of hands.
