Welcome to the Newsletter

Hello lovely readers! I hope you've all had a great start to 2026. It's been a bit wet and windy, but nothing we're not used to. Make sure to keep warm and cozy and wear high vis if you're out and about in the evenings.

If you're up very late and it's a clear night, take a few pics of the sky to see if you can capture the Northern Lights - it may look like a normal dark sky, but a photo could reveal the wonderful colours of the Aurora Borealis. Set an alarm for midnight!

Other spectacular astronomical events this month are highlighted with a bright 'Snow Moon' on Feb 1st, Mercury will be at greatest eastern elongation on Feb 19th - offering the best visibility for this elusive planet. A triple conjunction of Mercury, Venus, and Saturn occurs in late February - followed by a 6-planet alignment of Jupiter, Saturn, Venus, Mercury, Uranus, and Neptune (for optimal viewing of the alignment and conjunction, look low on the western horizon just after sunset).

Next month will bring us back around to the Spring Equinox on 20th March which is, according to some, the first day of Spring, marking the point when the day and night are approximately equal in length. Daylight Saving Time comes into play on Sunday 29th March when our clocks will be moving forward by one hour at 1am giving us more light in the evenings! Hurrah!

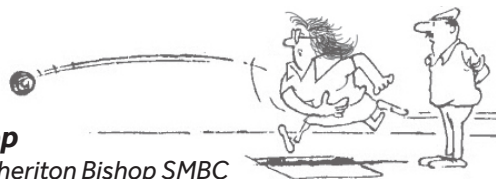

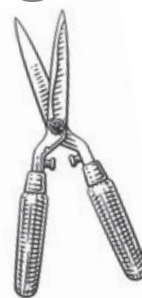

Dear Resident,

What have we done this year?

Over the past 12 months we have:

- Worked with Devon County Highways to extend the 20-mph speed limit within the village, and to reduce from 60mph to 30mph on the remaining stretches of the two roads as far as Four Cross Way.

Scheduled for completion in 2026:

- Renovated the War Memorial and replaced bench seats.
- Automatic speed monitoring has been in operation.
- Supported the annual village 'Bring & Share' party.
- Allocated funds to the Baby & Toddler Group for its move to the Village Hall and to the Village Show in support of the Gardening Club.
- Reviewed numerous planning applications, listening to residents' concerns and raising them with the relevant planning authorities.
- Liaised with Bunny Homes site manager concerning mud on the road and delivery times to the site.
- Started work on a plan for the allocation of £40,000+ open space funding from Bunny Homes.
- Worked with year 6 primary school classes on a community project.
- Two new Councillors have joined us and we have bid farewell to two other Parish Councillors.

It was wonderful to see so many local folk dancing in the Service Corridor to 70s tunes. It was the perfect way to wrap up our 50th anniversary year.

Time is flying and the team are busy working away preparing for re-opening after winter closures. Floors have been polished, kitchens have been deep cleaned, paths have been cleared. Castle Drogo visitor centre and gardens open 31st January with the Castle opening 13th February; Finch Foundry opens 11th March, Lydford Gorge on 14th March.

Regular visitors to Castle Drogo may have noticed the gradual decline of the Holm Oaks on the main drive. This decline is a result of general age, pest damage and wind stress, and we lose on average one tree every 2-3 years. In between that, significant limbs can fail, and branches snap out. As a result of this we will be felling and replacing the trees over the next 5 years, starting with the trees at the end of the drive where it joins the road. We will start with the tree immediately on the right of the drive entrance, as this tree has extensive internal rot.

We will phase the work, so that when all trees in an area are felled, we replant with young

Holm Oaks to reflect the original Lutyens designed layout. We will pollard these new trees once

established, in order to better manage them long into the future. This will help to keep them to a manageable size and reduce the stress on them due to wind exposure. These young trees, as they grow away, are great carbon sinks as they generally absorb and store more carbon than an older tree.

Finally, a bit of joy, as a wonderful art exhibition will be in the Castle for March. We have worked with a collective of artists called 'Herding Cats' who have been inspired by some of the lesser-known stories of Drogo, particularly of the women of Drogo, and have created art pieces in response. It promises to be a beautiful and interesting way to discover more about the history of Castle Drogo which launches on 1st March. I hope that you have a chance to come and see the pieces during March.

Accessing Foodbanks

Heating or eating; it is a stark choice faced by increasing numbers of people as the costs of both continue to rise. Citizens Advice Torridge, North, Mid & West Devon (CA TNMWD) is working with Trussell in North Devon and we have an adviser available at Foodbanks in Bideford, Ilfracombe, South Molton, Braunton and Holsworthy. We also have a presence in the Tavistock food bank on Friday mornings.

Foodbanks are community organisations that can help if you can't afford food or if you need emergency food, but a referral is usually needed before you can use one. You can get a referral for yourself and any family members you live with including your partner.

You can be referred to a food bank by CA TNMWD or from your GP, local council, housing association or social worker. Whichever organisation refers you will give you a voucher – but be careful to check if it is only valid on a particular day. CA TNMWD has advisers in attendance at food banks to make people aware of any benefit that they are eligible to claim, advise on other help that is available such as referring to our Energy Team for advice on energy savings or getting fuel vouchers if you qualify. Very often people have no idea what help is available to them and that is where we come in; if we cannot

help you directly, we can usually signpost you to other organisations that can. The aim is to give people alternative solutions to relying on a food bank.

When you visit a food bank you will need to let them know about any allergies or dietary requirements. A food parcel usually contains enough food for three days and you may also be able to get essential toiletries like toothpaste or deodorant.

Some food banks have a limit on the number of times you can visit but a chat with our Adviser will hopefully have opened up other avenues to help.

People are coming to CA TNMWD in greater numbers with problems that are increasingly complex. As ever, our plea is that if you could volunteer for maybe one day a week to please get in touch. There is information on our website **www.citizensadvicetnmwd.org.uk** or you can contact recruitment@citizensadvicetnmwd.org.uk. Volunteers get full training and ongoing support, they make new friends and know that they are making a valuable contribution to their local community. Why not join the team?

Emergency 'Preferred' Contact

Have you ever noticed that the NUMBER 5 on your cordless phone (not mobile phone) there is a RAISED DOT that your finger can detect. Therefore the 5 button is locatable in the dark or during a power cut or when help is required.

For the 5 button to work, you must enter someone you wish as a contact by adding their phone number onto the NUMBER 5 button for use in an emergency (just press the 5 button and add the contact number).

In an emergency situation press NUMBER 5 followed by the green call button and automatically your preferred person would be contacted and able to help you. This could be a big help if a situation arose in the dark, a power cut or help is required. It is an alternative to your mobile phone which may not be with you or is low on battery.

Church Lane Path Extension

The new pedestrian path situated on the inside side of the hedge and formed within Bunny Homes development is now open.

At present it is a bit narrower due to security fencing. The crossing to the play area has yet to be completed. For safety the path should be used whenever possible since there is two way traffic where the road is now widened and large lorries are coming and going from the site. Unfortunately the path terminates

at the new entrance. You cross this and then walk back onto the old road. This was pointed out to Bunny Homes on several occasions but fell onto deaf ears.

Stronger Passwords

It is likely that you are still using old passwords perhaps, some many years old.

Consider changing your passwords:

Upgrade your email password to 'Three Random Words' which combined together is much stronger.

Stop Reusing Passwords: Banking & Email passwords should be unique (not used elsewhere)

Save Them: Let the browser/password manager or phone remember the rest of the password.

If you have lost money or given out your financial details to scammers, inform your bank and financial firm straight away. Remember you can reach the bank's fraud department by calling **159**.

Always be observant and vigilant and keep your eyes open when out and about.

In the Garden

Start A New Growing Season

February can still be very cold but the days are getting longer and signs of growth are stirring under the good earth. Look out for snowdrops and narcissi braving the cold ground outside. Meanwhile indoors you can start vegetables such as peas, broad beans and lettuce. Peas resent root disturbance so it works well to sow them in a short piece of gutter in a greenhouse. When the pea seedlings are big enough they can be slid out of the gutter and into a shallow trench outside.

Early potatoes can be placed on a windowsill in an egg box. They will start to shoot (or chit) and be given a head start when the soil is ready for them to be planted out.

Prune autumn fruiting raspberries now, cutting the old canes down to the ground. They will grow new shoots that will mature over the summer and produce fruit from late

summer onwards. Leave summer fruiting raspberry canes as they fruit on last year's growth.

Prune roses before they start shooting too much. Winter jasmine can be cut back to fit its allotted space. Summer flowering shrubs such as buddleia can be pruned back. Shrubs such as Cotinus and Sambucus (Elderflower) can be cut to about two buds to keep them compact and improve the size and quality of their foliage. Catalpa (Indian Bean Tree) and Paulownia are other trees that can be kept smaller but grow impressively huge leaves if pruned in early Spring.

When your snowdrops have finished flowering you can divide up congested clumps. They will repay you with rejuvenated, bigger, stronger flowers next winter.

Messages from St Mary's

Making Good Habits

It is said that we are creatures of habit. Habits can be both good and bad. It is thought that the brain carries out actions without you having to think about them. These become our habits.

The subconscious is considered the most reliable part of the mind. As you practise doing something, you're transferring that action to your subconscious. People often say the more I think about it, the harder it is. It is helpful for us to have good habits.

A simple example of a good habit could be brushing our teeth twice a day. Our teeth and our dentists really appreciate that good habit. It is a habit that prevents future problems. Given how good it is, you might be surprised to hear that only about 75% of adults maintain this habit.

When I think of habits, I find it much easier to focus on the bad habits. A quick list of some of the bad habits: eating unhealthily, drinking too much alcohol, not drinking enough water and not taking enough exercise.

Like most things in life, doing good needs extra effort, which often makes good habits harder to achieve. Conversely, doing little to help ourselves can lead to the development of bad habits. It is all too easy to fall into bad habits!

Which brings us to Wednesday, 18th February, Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. When I go into school and explain the church seasons, I explain Lent as the season for

watching and waiting. We are waiting for Easter. The watching part is a little harder. We are watching to see how we are doing in our relationship with God. We are looking for areas where we can stop doing wrong. We also want to improve and develop in new ways.

It is always good to help others and ourselves into better situations. A traditional approach is to give something up or start something new for Lent. You commit to doing this for the forty days. I wondered how long it took for things to become a habit. It was thought to be three weeks, but recent research suggests sixty-six days. So, a good Lenten observance is well on the way to becoming a new habit. Sadly, if you do not maintain it, it is unlikely to become a lifelong habit.

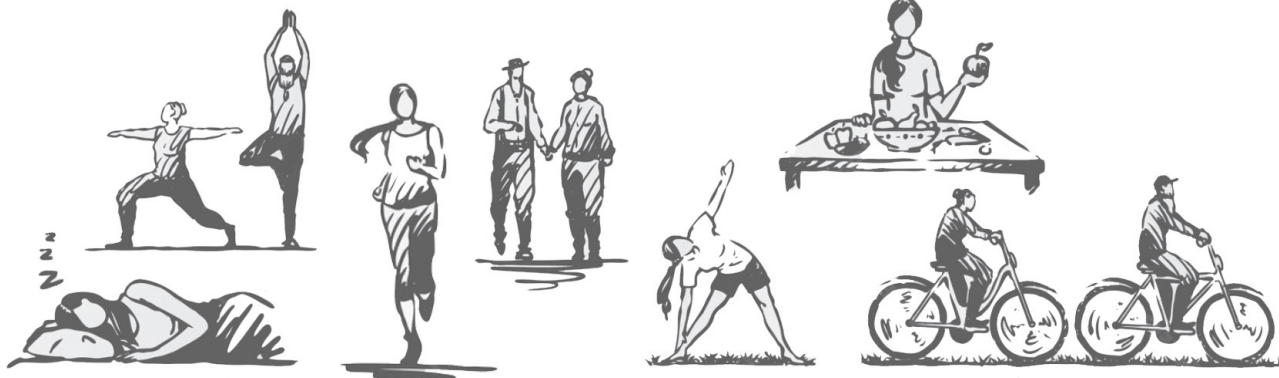
I am sure Lent is always a timely reminder that we need to review & adjust our relationship with God.

Minutes of the CB Parish Council Meeting

Monday 12th January, 7pm, Spalding Hall, Cheriton Bishop

Present: Chair Peter O'Neil, Vice Chair Cllr Roger Marshall, Cllrs A. Fry and C. Royle
One member of the public present

Attending: Parish Clerk – J Clark

- 1. To receive and accept apologies.** DCC Cllr J. Cairney and MDDC Cllrs S. Chenore and M. Binks.
- 2. To receive Declarations of Interest.** None
- 3. Public Discussion: A member of the public raised the issue of the financial pressures on the Spalding Hall.**
They asked if the council could make a regular commitment to supporting the viability of the hall to remain in use. The Chair requested the Spalding Hall Committee to supply a report supported by figures and send to the clerk. Clerk to place on the February agenda. CLERK TO ACTION

They also shared their concern about a muddy section of the Crocky Dip footpath. The Chair responded that the footpath is a Dartmoor National Park (DNPA) responsibility. The Council will contact the DNPA to find out who is responsible for the upkeep and see if action can be taken to improve this section of the footpath. CLERK TO ACTION

They also asked if a footpath from the village to the proposed site of the new farm shop close to Woodleigh Junction can be considered. The clerk to contact MDDC AND TDC Planning to obtain further information as to whether this is an option and what needs to be considered and report back to council. CLERK TO CONTACT MDDC PLANNING

They also asked if the parish council would give consideration to enhancing the village Christmas decorations, such as a Christmas tree on the memorial cross area, more lights, etc. The council felt this may be considered once the s106 money received. No action to be taken at this time.

4. Planning

- 4.1 25/01698/PIP Permission in Principle for the erection of 1 dwelling
East of Hill View Cheriton Bishop
Following a discussion the council agreed that as the site falls within the development boundary the council had no objections in principle but wants strongly to emphasise that it should not set a precedent for further development outside the development boundary. The council resolved unanimously by a show of hands to support the application with the caveat outlined above.
- 4.2 25/02773/FULL Removal of condition)b) of planning permission 88/03049/FULL relating to an agricultural occupancy tie.
Crossways Farm Cheriton Bishop.
Following a discussion, it was agreed that the council felt no need to comment.
- 4.3. 25/01780/HOUSE Erection of two-storey side extension following demolition of single storey lean-to and timber shed.

6. To consider the draft minutes of the December Parish Council meeting as a correct record.

The council resolved to approve the minutes of the December meeting as a true record unanimously by a show of hands.

7. To receive reports from MDDC Councillors - for information only. Received and noted.

8. To receive a report from Devon County Council (DCC) - for information only. Received and noted.

9. To discuss communication issues when dealing with DCC Highways.

Over the previous two months, both The Chair and The Parish Clerk have written to DCC Highways asking for a response to previous emails regarding the scheduled 20mph limit extension (which is in response to significant safety concerns), replacement of Cheriton Bishop village gateway signs to include the missing 30 mph sign and permission to replace a damaged finger post, but once again no response has been received.

The parish council has sought input from DCC Highways on several occasions regarding Highways matters and has had unhelpful or incorrect responses. In 2024, during a project to improve the Memorial Cross area in the village, which had already been verbally approved by the local Highways officer, work was halted without notice by DCC Highways. The interruption not only caused inconvenience but increased the overall cost of the project. Prior to the work being completed, the Parish Council had requested input from DCC Highways but again there was no response. In the end work had to go ahead without Highways input because there were safety issues to be addressed as part of the work included the rebuilding of a wall. Despite several attempts by the council to find out why the work had been stopped, again there was no response, so the parish council went ahead and completed the work.

As a result, the Council asked the clerk to write to the Leader of DCC explaining these problems and particularly stressing the parish council's safety concerns about the delayed 20mph limit extension and the missing 30 mph sign which could invalidate the speed limit both on the main road and in the area of the 20mph extension. Speeding is a serious local concern and Cllr Marshall reported that the results from the vehicle activated speed signs in the village show clearly that close to half of the vehicles driving through the village are breaking the speed limit. CLERK TO ACTION

10. To agree parish council's priorities for the financial year 2026-2027.

The Chair shared the previously published list of priorities and councillors discussed the actions to be taken to support the council's priorities for 2026-2027. The council agreed the following priorities for the financial year 2026-2027 as follows:

- To seek to have the village gateway signs replaced by Highways.
- To organise the implementation of the new 20 mph speed restrictions.
- Focus of provision of allotments by identifying suitable and available land for the purpose within the parish boundary.
- To work with parties involved to scope the possibility of putting a pathway from the village to the proposed new farm shop close to Woodleigh Junction.
- To seek to raise the profile of parish council and the work it does and to encourage new members as the current council comprises only 4 out of a possible 7 members.
- To engage with the community to identify suitable projects for the community funding that will be available as a result of the Church Lane housing development.
